What is on the Ballot?

Two questions:

- Shall GAVIN NEWSOM be recalled (removed) from the office of Governor? [yes / no]
- 2. Candidates to succeed GAVIN NEWSOM as Governor if he is recalled: [46 candidates]
- If more than 50% vote YES to Q1, candidate with most votes in Q2 wins.



Voter Services

- All voters will receive a Vote by Mail (VBM) ballot
 - VBM ballots will be accepted if postmarked by Election Day and received up to E+7
- Vote Centers will be open September 4-14
 - Preliminary Target of 253 Vote Centers:
 - 11-day (Sept. 4): 108
 - 4-day (Sept. 11): 145
 - Hours:
 - September 4-September 13: 10am-7pm
 - Election Day, September 14: 7am-8pm
- Approximately 387 Drop Boxes will be available beginning August 16
- Any voter may use Remote Accessible Vote by Mail (RAVBM)









Vote by Mail Resources


Three options for returning ballot:

- Drop-off at a Vote Center (beginning September 4)



Safe Elections Provisions

- Masks required for Election
 Workers; recommended for voters
- Stop Station with Personal Protective Equipment (hand sanitizer, self-screening, etc.)
- Infection Control (sanitizing equipment and surfaces)
- Physical distancing encouraged for queuing and voting area
