Council Members had questions regarding being able to see incidents on bus, tracking late drivers, needing more manpower, making sure staff takes their breaks so they could start fresh, emergency button, if the new computer will be a distraction to the bus drivers, how many buses in our entire fleet, will all data be kept onsite? GTrans Director Crespo replied that we will now have the ability to listen and see physically where the bus is at; included in the contract is to purchase four (4) wireless signs; we do not anticipate hiring any more supervisors; once the emergency button is pushed it goes back to dispatch; there are currently 43 peak service buses, and GTrans is planning to add 25 future buses. Hopefully, this will eliminate bus bunching. If this is happening every day, the bus schedules will be re-adjusted. All of the data will be kept on the city premises, our Operations/Bus Team will work directly with Clever Devices, LTD; we just recently hired a Systems Analyst and he is working closely with City IT Staff at both GTrans and City Hall.

PUBLIC HEARING

Agenda Item #5

General Plan Amendment #2-18, Zone Change #3-18, Tentative Tract Map #6-18, Site Plan Review #11-18, and Environmental Assessment #20-18

A 114-unit townhome project on a 5.6 gross acre property, which included the request for the following entitlements: General Plan Amendment, Zone Change, Tentative Tract Map and a Site Plan Review. A Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND) and Mitigation Monitoring Program (MMP) were prepared to address the environmental impacts.

Project Location: 1515 West 178th Street

Applicant: Jeff Weber representing Melia Homes

Community Development Manager, Raymond Barragan, presented the Staff Report and recommended that the Planning and Environmental Quality Commission approve Resolution No. PC 16-19 and PC No. 17-19, adopting the Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program for purposes of the Tentative Tract Map and Site Plan Review and recommend that the City Council adopt the same for the General Plan Amendment and Zone Change; recommend that the City Council adopt the General Plan Amendment and Zone Change; and approve the Tentative Tract Map and Site Plan subject to the Legislative approvals.

City Attorney, Lisa Kranitz, asked that the environmental consultant for the project, Rita Garcia, to respond to the late communications staff received from the public.

Ms. Garcia stated staff received a late comment letter from Gardena resident Terri Hasse, 17902 La Salle Avenue, primarily regarding transportation related impacts, and stated that traffic impact is one of the resource areas that was analyzed in the Initial

Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project. Ms. Garcia then stated that the project would displace the existing trucking facility located on the site and that their analysis found the project would result in net reduction in peak hour trips. Ms. Garcia also stated that the existing conditions which included staging of trucks, employees and visitors of the truck facility parking on the street, affect traffic circulation and that the proposed project would remove these affects from the neighborhood.

Chair Jackson stated she thought 114 residential unit would increase traffic impact.

Ms. Garcia stated the traffic analysis showed the exiting trucking facility generated more traffic then the residential development was expected to.

Commissioner Henderson asked if the traffic analysis was conducted over one day.

Ms. Kranitz stated the survey of the traffic counts for the existing facility was conducted on one day, March 5, 2019, and added that the applicant worked with the business to choose a good representative day on when trucks were moving in and out.

Commissioner Henderson asked if the traffic count converted one truck trip would into two passenger trips.

Ms. Garcia stated they did not convert truck trips to passenger car equivalent to ensure their analysis was conservative.

Commissioner Langley asked where the nearest parks to the project site were.

Ms. Garcia stated the initial study did not identify the nearest parks in the recreation demand, however, that it did identify the proposed onsite recreation uses that would serve the onsite community.

Commissioner Langley stated that he did not think the project provided adequate amount of recreation area. Commissioner Langley then asked where the nearest schools were located.

Ms. Garcia stated that there were three schools that would be in the jurisdiction and serve the community: 186th Elementary School, Perry Middle School, Gardena High School, and a private school south of the project site.

Mr. Barragan stated the applicant would be required to pay an in-lieu park fee of \$97,984 which could be used to make improvements to existing parks or purchasing of property for new parks.

Chair Jackson stated that the staff report indicated the applicant would be required to pay school impact fee to Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD).

Mr. Barragan stated there would be a school fee paid to LAUSD in addition to an in-lieu park fee paid directly to the City of Gardena.

Ms. Kranitz stated that there was not a lot of available space in the City to develop a new park, and therefore the City has concentrated on improving existing parks.

Commissioner Langley inquired about the previous use on the site prior to the existing trucking facility.

Chair Jackson opened the public hearing.

The applicant Jeff Weber, 8951 Research Drive Irvine, CA, stated the previous uses were typical warehousing businesses.

Commissioner Langley asked if there were any soil testing done for the property.

Ms. Garcia stated there was soil testing done through an Environmental Site Assessment report which required that further remediation of the site in order to address the contamination. Ms. Garcia then stated that the applicants drafted a Remedial Action Plan that was approved by the Los Angeles County Fire Department which included a measure that would prohibit issuance of certain building permits for the project until the site was determined to be fully remediated.

Commissioner Henderson asked the applicants what their intended market would be.

Mr. Weber stated first time buyers.

Commissioner Henderson asked questions regarding the type of proposed recreational facilities within the project.

Mr. Weber stated there were numerous open space areas throughout the project and noted the largest area was located on the northside of the site and the pool area located in the middle of the proposed development.

Gail, Laidoner, 17815 Denker Avenue, Gardena, CA, stated that the housing project was incompatible with the City's General Plan and had concerns regarding traffic impact to the neighboring area.

Oscar Graham, 333 City Boulevard West, Suite 1700, Orange, CA, stated his support for the project.

Margie Hoyt, 17700 S. Western Avenue, Unit 188, Gardena, CA, stated she resides in the mobile home park adjacent to project site, and stated her support for the project and stressed the issues she has seen with the existing trucking facility including noise and smells.

Ms. Kranitz stated that in response to the comment that the project was incompatible with the City's General Plan, Ms. Kranitz pointed out that the City Council placed a mixed-use overlay land use designation on the subject property which specifically allows for residential development and therefore the project was consistent with the General Plan. Ms. Kranitz went on to say that the only problem with developing under the current zoning designation of mixed-use is that the project would be required to have some type of commercial use, however, the street where the project was located was not conducive to having any type of commercial use that would be viable.

Chair Jackson asked what the sale price of the homes would be.

Mr. Weber stated that they would be in somewhere between \$450,000 and \$550,000.

Commissioner Langley asked if the pool area of the project would be fenced in.

Mr. Weber answered yes.

Commissioner Henderson asked questions regarding the vehicular entrances to the project site.

Chad Brown, 8951 Research Drive Irvine, CA, the Vice President of Planning and Development with Melia Homes, stated the project met all of the requirements for the Los Angeles County Department regarding the emergency access and egress and added that too many driveway approaches would increase traffic to the street.

Commissioner Henderson asked what the distance was from the project site to Normandie Avenue and to Western Avenue.

Mr. Brown stated the distance was well over 1,500 feet in each direction.

Commissioner Henderson asked if this distance would allow the property to have additional emergency vehicle access.

Ms. Garcia stated that the project would be subject to compliance with the Los Angeles County Fire Department standards in order for the project to be approved.

Commissioner Pierce stated that there were alternative routes to and from the project that would mitigate the activity that would occur on West 178th Street.

Commissioner Langley stated that the project did not have adequate recreational space due to the fact that there was limited access to the pool area and that the open space area on the north side was mostly designed as a walkway.

Mr. Brown stated there was an open area on the northwest end of the project site where a tot-lot could be proposed.

Mr. Weber added that they were open to suggestions regarding the trail located on the north side.

Commissioner stated that he thought the trees along the trail should be kept as part of the project.

Mr. Barragan stated that the City was actively reprogramming the existing parks and expressed staff's support of residential development on this property due to the numerous concerns and impacts the existing industrials uses has had on the neighboring residential community.

Commissioner Langley expressed his support in the use change of the property to residential. Commissioner Langley then stated he would favor less density to provide for more open recreational space.

Ms. Kranitz stated that the State's Department of Housing and Community Development has mandated that the property yield a minimum 20 units per acre.

Commissioner Pierce stated that the pricing of the homes would be more attainable and bring back middle income households which were different from previous projects.

Ms. Kranitz stated that this was the intent of the State's Department.

Mr. Weber stated that the goal of the project was to develop attainable housing.

Chair Jackson closed the public hearing.

MOTION: It was moved by Commissioner Henderson and seconded by Commissioner Pierce to adopt approve Resolution No. PC 16-19 and PC No. 17-19, adopting the Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program for purposes of the Tentative Tract Map and Site Plan Review and recommending that the City Council adopt the same for the General Plan Amendment and Zone Change; recommending that the City Council adopt the General Plan Amendment and Zone Change; and approving the Tentative Tract Map and Site Plan subject to the Legislative approvals. The Commission added a condition that the Applicant would work with staff to reprogram existing open space areas.

Site Plan review #5-18

A request a Site Plan Review for construction of a new 22,402 square foot, 12-unit mixed-use housing development with 3,891 square feet of commercial use in the Commercial-Residential (C-R) zone per Gardena Municipal Code Section 18.20.025 and direction to staff to file a Notice of Exemption as an In-fill project.

Project Location: 15420 South Western Avenue, Suite B (APN: 6103-015-051)
Applicant: Grace Yang

Planning Assistant Amanda Acuna presented the Staff Report and recommended that the Planning and Environmental Quality Commission adopt Resolution No. PC 18-19, approving Site Plan Review #5-18, subject to the conditions of approval and directing staff to file a Notice of Exemption as an existing facilities project.

Commissioner Langley asked for clarification whether the alley abutting the property is private or public.

Mr. Barragan stated that the alley was private and there were concerns that people would cut through the adjacent properties to get to the subject site via the alley.

Commissioner Langley had concerns regarding potential impact the surrounding uses would have to the residents.

Mr. Barragan stated the existing surrounding uses were allowed by-right and they had no bearing on the project.

Commissioner Langley addressed his concerns on late working hours from those adjacent businesses in terms with noise.

Mr. Barragan stated that the businesses were subject to the City's noise ordinance.

Chair Jackson opened the public hearing.

Paul Giuliano, 1139 West Gardena Boulevard, Gardena, CA, owner of a nearby business to the project, stated he had concerns regarding traffic.

Commissioner Henderson asked where the entrance to the project would be.

Ms. Acuna stated the entrance would be from the public alley off of Berendo Avenue.

Commissioner Pierce stated the abutting alley was very narrow.

Ms. Acuna stated that the Gardena Public Works Department reviewed the proposed project and was asking for a two-foot dedication to widen the alley.

Commissioner Henderson asked questions regarding street parking directly in front of the project area.

Ms. Acuna stated that the applicants would be removing and replacing an abandoned driveway approach and replacing it with curb and gutter which would allow for more onstreet parking.

Commissioner Langley asked about the parking lot located across the project site.

Ms. Acuna stated that the parking lot was public parking.

Commissioner Langley expresses his concerns on nearby residents parking in the public parking lot located on Gardena Boulevard.

Commissioner Henderson asked how many additional parking spaces there would be along Gardena Boulevard directly in front of the subject property.

The applicant's architect Patrick Chu stated approximately six parking spaces could be added.

Commissioner Langley asked if the uses of the commercial tenant spaces were decided.

The applicant, Sam Zhou, 320 N. Hollow Avenue, West Covina, CA, stated that there were no specific intended uses, however, two units would be equipped to allow for small restaurant use.

Langley stated the use before provided on street parking and while the proposed project would be attracting more people it would bring traffic.

Mr. Chu stated that the project met all the minimum development standards of the Gardena Municipal Code.

Commissioner Langley asked why the parking requirements for the subject property were different than that of the live-work units located along Artesia Boulevard.

Mr. Barragan stated that the area the Commissioner was referring to was part of a Specific Plan and had its very own development standards.

Commissioner Henderson asked if the on-street parking spaces would have reduced dimensions.

Mr. Barragan stated that the regulations for private parking spaces were different than that for street parking.

Commissioner Langley asked if there were any future plans for off-street parking lots along Gardena Boulevard.

Mr. Barragan stated no.

Chair Jackson closed the public hearing.

MOTION: It was moved by Commissioner Henderson and seconded by Commissioner Pierce to adopt Resolution No. PC 18-19, approving Site Plan Review #5-18, subject to the conditions of approval and directing staff to file a Notice of Exemption.

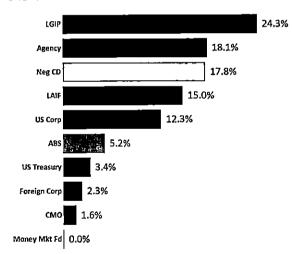

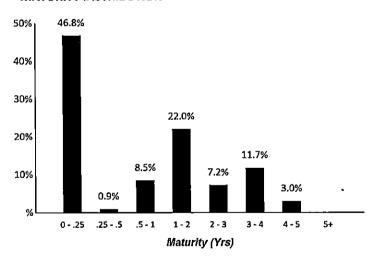

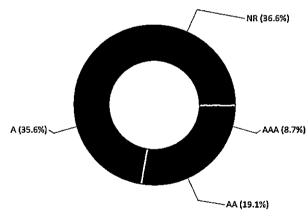
SECTOR ALLOCATION

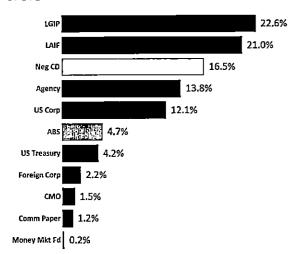

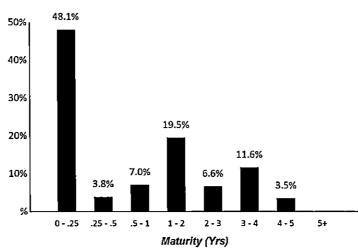

SECTOR ALLOCATION

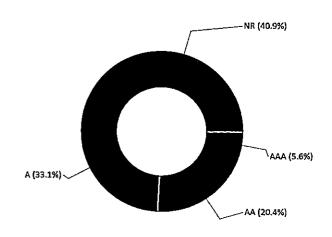

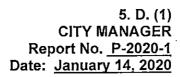

JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY ACCOUNTANT

Job Summary

This is a part-time classification that under general direction performs specialized and confidential accounting duties for the Joint Powers Authority.

Representative Duties

Assists in the planning, direction and coordination of activities and services within the Administrative Services Department; participates in the development of policy and procedures; recommends and participates in the development of departmental goals, objectives and policies; assists in the administration of contracts for department services and ensures services are provided according to contract provisions.

Plans, manages and coordinates the day to day activities, services and staff involved in the Department's accounting, purchasing, payroll and risk management functions; performs advanced-level professional financial and risk management program/service delivery for the City. This includes but is not limited to overseeing the work of various general accounting functions; accounts payable functions; purchasing functions; reviews and approves various financial transfers; reviews and approves journal vouchers and budget adjustments; conducts budget account analyses; produces and distributes selected financial statements, financial summaries and management reports; prepares and monitors annual budgets for assigned divisions.

Assists in the implementation and administration of fiscal management programs including budget monitoring, forecasting, collection/disbursement of revenues, internal and external audits and preparation of the City's annual budget; prepares financial reports according to federal and state rules, regulations and laws, City policies and procedures, and generally accepted accounting principles.

Prepares financial, statistical, budgetary and analytical studies and reports; prepares detailed financial statements; verifies fund balances; prepares revenue projections, audits revenues, expenditures and grants.

In collaboration with the Administrative Services Department, provides leadership, program development, administration and coordination of fiscal operations and services; serves as liaison with the community, professional groups and other external contacts and resources on behalf of the City.

Coordinates fiscal operations activities with activities of other programs, departments or staff to ensure program delivery according to appropriate budgets, policies, procedures and specifications.

Resolves discrepancies or procedural problems and responds to program administration and/or program delivery questions ensuring necessary follow-up occurs; controls program records for operational and budget accountability; confers with and advises staff and program participants by providing advice, problem solving assistance, answers to questions and interpretation of program goals and policy.

Directly and through subordinate supervisors, recruits, directs work efforts and evaluates staff; provides for and/or conducts staff development; establishes work methods and standards; initiates corrective and/or disciplinary action and responds to grievances and complaints according to established personnel policies and procedures and in consultation with Human Resources.

Performs bookkeeping and Joint Powers Authority duties as assigned.

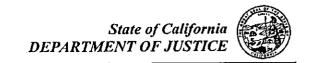

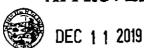

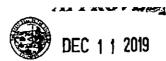

#### **Technical Note**

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change in prices over time in a fixed market basket of goods and services. The Bureau of Labor Statistics publishes CPIs for two population groups: (1) a CPI for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) which covers approximately 93 percent of the total population and (2) a CPI for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) which covers 29 percent of the total population. The CPI-U includes, in addition to wage earners and clerical workers, groups such as professional, managerial, and technical workers, the self-employed, short-term workers, the unemployed, and retirees and others not in the labor force.

The CPI is based on prices of food, clothing, shelter, and fuels, transportation fares, charges for doctors' and dentists' services, drugs, and the other goods and services that people buy for day-to-day living. Each month, prices are collected in 75 urban areas across the country from about 5,000 housing units and approximately 22,000 retail establishments—department stores, supermarkets, hospitals, filling stations, and other types of stores and service establishments. All taxes directly associated with the purchase and use of items are included in the index.

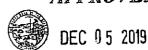

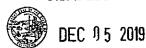

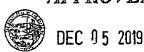

#### **RECOMMENDATION AND STAFF SUMMARY:**

Staff respectfully recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 6427, establishing regulatory fees for wholesalers or distributors of fireworks, in accordance with Section 8.16.115 of the Gardena Municipal Code.

This Resolution establishes an annual regulatory fee to be paid by each fireworks wholesaler of distributor providing "Safe and Sane" fireworks to this year's approved non-profit organizations. The Annual regulatory fee for wholesalers or distributors of "Safe and Sane" fireworks in the City of Gardena shall be \$8,000 for 2020 calendar year. This fee shall be paid by, and only by, a wholesaler or distributor, and said fee shall be appointed to each wholesaler or distributor in accordance with Section 8.16.115 of the Gardena Municipal Code.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 6427**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING REGULATORY FEES FOR WHOLESALERS OR DISTRIBUTORS OF FIREWORKS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 8.16.115 OF THE GARDENA MUNICIPAL CODE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2020

WHEREAS, Chapter 8.16 of the Gardena Municipal Code authorizes the licensing and regulation of fireworks within the City of Gardena, and;

WHEREAS, Section 8.16.115 specifically authorizes the City Council to establish an annual regulatory fee to be paid by each fireworks wholesaler or distributor providing Safe and Sane fireworks.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE, AND RESOLVE, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. ANNUAL REGULATORY FEE. The annual regulatory fee for wholesalers or distributors of fireworks in the City of Gardena shall be Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000) for the current Calendar Year 2020. Said fee shall be apportioned to each wholesaler or distributor in accordance with Section 8.16.115

SECTION 2. PAYMENT OF REGULATORY FEE. Said regulatory fee shall be paid by, and only by, a wholesaler or distributor, as provided in Section 8.16.115.A. Each wholesaler or distributor shall submit to the City information, as reasonably requested by City, to evidence compliance with this provision.

SECTION 3. EFFECT. That this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution; shall cause the same to be entered among the original Resolutions of said City; and shall make a minute of the passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the City Council of said City in the minutes of the meeting at which the same is passed and adopted.

#### STAFF SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION:

The City has utilized the services of Phoenix Group to process parking and administrative citations, booking fees, hand held enforcement solutions and DUI fees for the last five years. The pricing structure for the City of Gardena has never been augmented during the time that Phoenix Group has been contracting with the City. Phoenix Group has not augmented the pricing in the proposed contract, offering pricing from five years ago without an increase.

In addition, the City has never been charged the monthly hand held device support fee of \$40 per hand held unit/per month that other Agencies pay for daily support on devices. This resulted in a cost savings of approximately \$19,200 over the last five year term. This will continue to be offered to the City as a benefit and the fee for the support will be waived, resulting in an additional savings of \$19,200 for the proposed five year term. The City will also receive eight upgraded hand held devices (with a estimated value of \$20,000) at no cost, as part of the proposed contract for the Police Department. Additionally, there are no proposed costs for software updates as Phoenix is committed to providing the latest technology.

Phoenix will also waive the current monthly database fee that is \$350 per month. This results in a savings of \$21,000 over the proposed 60 month term. The services that are included in this monthly fee are listed in the attached contract agreement (Exhibit A).

An additional benefit in contracting with Phoenix is the fact no data migration from a previous vendor will be necessary, as that process can be disruptive and confusing to the citizen during transition. Also, the Police Department staff have been very satisfied with Phoenix's level of service and technical response.

Staff therefore respectfully recommends approval of the contract for an additional five years.

#### FINANCIAL IMPACT/COST:

Estimated cost to General Fund per fiscal year is \$150,000 - \$200,000, with the revenues generated by these costs exceeding expenditures by approximately \$1 million per fiscal year. Contract agreement covers a five-year period.

#### 1.0 PROCESSING SERVICES PROVIDED

PHX shall receive and process Parking and Administrative Citations, Booking Fees, Handheld Enforcement Solution, and DUI's issued by the AGENCY. PHX will provide the AGENCY with a Processing Management System and allow access to the PHX database via the Internet and Wincite™. PHX will provide pre-numbered batch cards for tracking and controlling the citations sent from Agency to PHX. PHX will notify AGENCY as soon as is reasonably possible of any discrepancies.

The AGENCY will be responsible for submitting citations to PHX daily or weekly via electronic communication or hard copy (To avoid duplication please submit either electronic communications or hard copy but not both). PHX will communicate with the AGENCY regarding status of payment updates on a monthly basis. The AGENCY can also update in-house payment information to the PHX database.

- 1.1 Fine Schedule: The AGENCY will provide to PHX their existing fee schedule such as: late fees, penalties, and due dates. The AGENCY will keep PHX updated on any changes to their fee schedule. All fee schedule changes will require signature approval by both parties before implementation.
- 1.2 Administrative Notice of Violation (Letters): The notice of violation for the individual will be generated by PHX. The notice will include the information contained within the citation (i.e., citation number, violation number, violation description, locations, consequences for non-payment, and/or any additional information required in accordance to applicable municipal code). Second and Final Warning letters will be mailed to the INDIVIDUAL as agreed upon by AGENCY.

- 1.3 Parking Delinquent Notices: PHX will generate and mail the notices for citations that have been referred to PHX by AGENCY following the guidelines set forth in CVC 40207. Notices are sent from PHX to the Registered Owner (RO) of the cited vehicle. RO information is gathered from current DMV records. The notice will include all the information included on the citation and consequences for nonpayment, and/or any additional information required by the code section. The notice of violation includes a remittance return portion for payment. Additional letters may be generated if required by AGENCY.
- 1.4 Registered Owner Information: PHX will be responsible for maintaining online communications with the California DMV. This communication is required as part of this agreement to request registered owner information.
- 1.5 Payment Dispositions: The AGENCY will forward any payment information as well as cancellations, dismissals, voids, corrections and/or other relevant information pertaining to the citation(s) status. PHX will update the AGENCY on a monthly basis regarding status of payment updates. The AGENCY may also update this information directly to the database remotely.

#### 2.0 PAYMENT PROCESSING

Payment processing services are provided by PHX for AGENCY. PHX has an internal online payment processing capability to insure correct payment and due date.

PHX will do everything in its power to reduce duplicate payments. If a duplicate payment is made it will be returned to the INDIVIDUAL by PHX expeditiously.

- 2.1 Invoicing: Invoices for total services provided by PHX (processing, collections, and additional, (agreed upon) fees, will be sent monthly to AGENCY.
- <u>2.2 Bank Returned Checks</u>: Fees established by the AGENCY for bank returned checks and additional follow-up will be included to the citation/account as directed by AGENCY.
- 2.3 Credit Card Payments: Credit Card payments will be accepted by Phone and/or Internet. The INDIVIDUAL can have the ability to connect to an optional secured website provided by PHX. Access to INDIVIDUAL information will be available based on a License Plate or Citation number. Wincite™ will access, store, and present, data in real time. Data is comprised of citation and INDIVIDUAL information and includes total amount due (may include credit card fees) before final authorization is complete. Payments can be made with Discover, MasterCard, Visa, or AMX. The INDIVIDUAL will be charged a credit card transaction fee of \$3.95 or 3.25% with no additional costs passed on to the AGENCY.

#### 2.4 Credit Card Charge Back: The process includes the following:

- 1. Charge back notification received by PHX
- 2. PHX locates the citation(s) that were paid on the transaction being disputed
- 3. A letter of dispute describing the charge is sent to the credit card company
- 4. If the dispute is found in favor of the credit card holder, then the charge back is accepted and a notice of unpaid fees are sent to the registered owner
- 5. PHX reverses the payment of the citation(s) and reopens the citation(s) immediately
- 6. PHX enters notes regarding the credit card payment information including, but not limited to:
  - a. Original Transaction ID(s)
  - b. Chargeback ID(s)
  - c. Any pertinent correspondence regarding the charge back
- 7. Charge back paperwork is then filed by PHX for later retrieval if necessary
- 8. Charge backs are reflected in the monthly reporting

#### 2.5 Bank Account and Depositing Procedures:

Mail (INDIVIDUAL Non-Electronic Payments) will be picked up from a local Post Office daily and normally processed within 24 hours. The bank deposits are endorsed to the bank selected by your AGENCY. Payments can be taken at both AGENCY site and at PHX. AGENCY shall have an internal on-line payment processing capability to enter payment data.

#### 2.6 Changes to Payment Processing Procedures

The AGENCY retains the right to change the payment processing procedure. Changes to the payment processing procedure will be agreed upon in advance and in writing between the AGENCY and PHX.

#### 3.0 CUSTOM WEBSITE

PHX will create a website and link for public inquiry and payment. The website will simulate the AGENCY'S existing website to provide consistency when the public is transitioning from the AGENCY'S existing website to PHX-provided pay site. The website will be integrated with any existing PHX web services. The AGENCY shall submit any requests for web content updates to PHX in writing. Upon receipt of any written web content update requests from AGENCY, PHX shall either implement AGENCY's requested changes as soon as is reasonably possible, or else respond to AGENCY with any questions or concerns.

The credit card option will be set-up and maintained by PHX at no additional costs to AGENCY. The services include:

- 1. Setting up a custom header and footer based on graphics approved by AGENCY
- 2. All merchant fees
- 3. Internet security and website fees
- 4. Provide for the ability to make payments, contest the citation, and provide any governing rules that are applicable
- 3.1 Remote Data Entry: Remote data entry capability will be provided to AGENCY via the Internet using Internet Explorer and Wincite™. Each operator within the AGENCY will be set up with a unique password and security level, as requested by AGENCY. Individual function levels will include view only, edit, add, and dismiss/void capabilities.

- 3.2 User accounts: Accounts may be established by the AGENCY and/or PHX. Access is limited to employees of the AGENCY only. This limitation specifically excludes PHX and/or consultants. Exceptions to the limitation must be approved in writing by PHX and AGENCY.
- 3.3 Hardware/Software (Equipment) Requirements: A minimum operating system with Microsoft Internet Explorer 7.0 or greater and Windows XP Pro or greater will be required by the AGENCY to access systems and services provided by PHX. PHX will provide Wincite™ to the AGENCY for citation data and reporting access. Any license requirements to operate any software not provided by PHX will be the responsibility of the AGENCY.
- 3.4 Online PHX Services Provided: PHX will provide the following to the AGENCY:
  - 1. Access to the citation data is available by citation number, vehicle license number, name, or VIN number, permit number, drivers' license number or ID number (whichever is applicable)
  - 2. All citation information
  - 3. Current status of the citation
  - 4. Delinquent notice information, due date, mailing date
  - 5. Administrative review, hearing court appeals, and disposition information
  - 6. Payment information, including all date, amounts, and payment codes
  - 7. Registered owner information and Electronic facsimile of the original citation

#### 4.0 REPORTING

PHX will supply AGENCY with electronic monthly reporting. The reports will be supplied to the AGENCY in a PDF format available for access, using Adobe Reader, with the option to export to Excel. The reports will include (if applicable) but is not limited to the following: (Additional requirements to be submitted to PHX in writing.)

- 1. Monthly Billing Report
- 2. Officer Summary Report
- 3. Officer Summary Y-T-D Monthly Recap
- 4. Void/Dismiss Report by Operator
- 5. Habitual Offender Hot Sheet Report and Detail
- 6. DMV Monthly Reports
- 7. Out of State Revenue Detail Report
- 8. Revenue Collection Detail Report
- 9. Revenue Distribution Surcharge Report
- 10. Contested Citations pending and outcome
- 11. Refunds 'Due' Report
- 12. FTB or Special Collections Report

The monthly production report schedule may change as needed. Reporting information may also be provided to the AGENCY in Excel or other method mutually agreeable to both parties. **Additional requirements to be submitted to PHX in writing.** 

#### 5.0 SURCHARGES

It is the responsibility of the AGENCY to identify and outline to PHX all surcharges (fees) applicable for the AGENCY. PHX will provide a monthly Surcharge Disbursement Report that includes the surcharges identified by the AGENCY as part of the monthly reports as identified in Section 4.0 REPORTING. The AGENCY will disburse surcharges funds directly to the County; if applicable.

#### **6.0 OWNERSHIP OF SOFTWARE**

AGENCY acknowledges that the software provided by PHX and software programs provided by PHX and used by the AGENCY have been developed by PHX. The software provided is the **PROPIETARY AND INTELECTUAL PROPERTY** of PHX. AGENCY agrees that all rights to any intellectual property is **Confidential Information** and shall remain the exclusive property of the PHX.

#### 7.0 COLLECTIONS AND FTB

If Authorized by AGENCY, PHX will pursue INDIVIDUALS with unpaid citations that meet the criteria of special collections and/or Franchise Tax Board collections (FTB). PHX Collections Criteria includes: Not paid, Not suspended, and in an OPEN status. PHX will mail out a delinquent letter of warning. If the citation remains unpaid PHX will use one or several collections efforts including but not limited to: Special Collections and/or FTB Collections.

All payment updates by FTB will be forwarded to PHX by AGENCY for updating and reporting.

#### 8.0 Programming Costs

The citation will be suspended to an agreed upon date in Wincite™ in accordance to payment arrangement between the AGENCY and the INDIVIDUAL.
- <u>8.2 Postal Increases</u>: In the event of a postal increase PHX will provide the adjustment of fees to offset the postal increase; such increases will be notified to the AGENCY in writing.
- 8.3 Data retention: Occurs bi-annually, all original citations shipped back to Agency. \$50,00 minimum fee or Fedex charged at actual rates depending on weight.

#### 9.0 DATA RETENTION POLICY

Data will be removed and/or archived from the system daily. Data archived from the system will be retained by PHX in an archived database and is retained for a period of five years unless returned to the AGENCY before that time. The AGENCY has the option to request such data. Data retained by PHX shall be done so in the format of Phoenix Group Information Systems' choice, unless otherwise agreed upon in writing by both parties.

- 9.1 Criteria for removal/archival of data will be: Closed citations: Any citation date older than 18 months, and has been closed for a period of one year. Open citations: Any citations open that is not on DMV hold, and older than 24months. Regardless of age open citations that are on DMV files with a hold on the registration will remain on the system until DMV clears the citation.
- <u>9.2 Hard copy data:</u> Every six months during the term of this Agreement, all hard copy files of data generated under this Agreement shall either be (1) returned to the AGENCY upon AGENCY's written request, or else (2) shredded by PHX for the AGENCY..

#### 10.0 TERM AND RENEWALS:

Except as otherwise stated, these terms and conditions shall be in effect between both parties: Commencing on 1/1/2020 this agreement will be binding until 12/31/2024. Prices and fees are subject to change in accordance with the CPI (Consumer Price Index) and State and County municipal fee schedules. PHX will notify AGENCY of any changes in writing prior to renewal date. AGENCY will be notified in writing by PHX of any agreement changes and/or fee increases. Changes will not take effect until written approval received from AGENCY.

10.1 Return and Ownership of Citation Data: All electronic and handwritten citations, reports, electronic media, and other relevant documents, shall be the property of the AGENCY and shall be

returned to the AGENCY upon either the completion of this Agreement or the termination of this Agreement within 15 days. This including copies and reproductions assembled or prepared by PHX employees, agents, and/or officers, in connection with this Agreement. Citation data returned to AGENCY by PHX shall be done so in the format of Phoenix Group Information Systems' choice, unless otherwise agreed upon in writing by both parties.

- 10.2 Exclusivity: AGENCY agrees to utilize only the services of PHX during the term of this agreement for the processing of citations and all other signed services. AGENCY agrees to not directly or indirectly divulge TRADE SECRETS, PROPIETARY and/or INTELECTUAL PROPERTY of PHX to any unauthorized person or entity. This Non-Disclosure obligation shall survive the termination of this agreement.
- 10.3 Books and Records: PHX will maintain adequate books and records for citations forwarded to PHX for processing. Upon two week written prior notice all records shall be available for inspection or audit by AGENCY at PHX's location during regular working hours.
- 10.4 Dispute Resolution: In the event of any dispute between AGENCY and PHX arising out of this Agreement, either party may initiate by written notice a meeting with the other party to resolve the dispute. If such a meeting is called, both parties shall send to the meeting representatives who have the authority to negotiate and bind their respective organizations to a resolution. If the dispute cannot be resolved within 30 days from the date of the initial notice, or if either party wishes to pursue the dispute, Client and Consultant agree to attempt to settle the dispute by mediation before resorting to arbitration. Unless otherwise mutually agreed to by Client and Consultant, any unresolved controversy of claim arising from or relating to this contract or breach thereof shall be settled by arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association in accordance with its Commercial Arbitration Rules, and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. If the AGENCY and PHX agree, the mediator involved in the parties' mediation may be asked to serve as the arbitrator.

#### 11.0 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

PHX's sole liability to the AGENCY, or any third party, for claims arising out of errors or omissions in the services provided is as follows: To furnish a correct report or data and to correct AGENCY files provided that AGENCY promptly advised PHX. PHX shall not have any liability under this Agreement for any money damages resulting from claims made by AGENCY for delays, non-service, errors, omissions, interruptions, in the services provided.

#### 12.0 INSURANCE

PHX shall procure and maintain for the duration of the contract the following insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages of property. Claims may arise from, or in connection, with the performance of the Contract by PHX agents, representatives, employees, or sub-contractors.

- A. General Liability: \$1,000,000 combined single limit for each occurrence.
- B. Workers' Compensation as required by the Labor Code of the State of California.

## 13.0 CONFIDENTIAL/FILE SECURITY

Reasonable security provisions will be provided by PHX to insure the access to AGENCY computer records and files will be available only to the AGENCY. PHX cannot guarantee against loss or alteration of computer records but will take extraordinary precautions to prevent such occurrences. PHX will hold all AGENCY data in strict confidence and shall not provide any data to any other party unless directed by AGENCY in writing or as ordered by a lawful local, state, or federal entity.

## 14.0 SECTION HEADINGS

Section headings that appear in this Agreement are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not be construed to be interpretations of text.

## 15.0 COMMENCEMENT OF WORK

Work shall not commence under the Contract until a fully executed agreement has been received by PHX and PHX has been given approval to proceed. Any work performed by PHX prior to the date of approval shall be considered as having been performed at PHX's own risk and as a volunteer service.

## **16.0 CANCELLATION**

AGENCY and PHX reserves the right to cancel this Agreement at any time upon ninety (90) days written notice to the other party to the address listed in this Agreement. At such time, PHX agrees to provide AGENCY with all AGENCY data together with an electronic file of all AGENCY data.

In the event of cancellation, electronic files will be provided in the format of Phoenix Group Information Systems' choice, unless otherwise agreed upon in writing by both parties.

17.0 Additional applicable clauses (This page is left blank intentionally)

#### **18.0 MISCELLANEOUS**

- 18.1 This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

- 18.3 If any provision of this Agreement shall not be enforceable the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force.
- 18.4 All provision of this Agreement shall be binding upon both parties.
- 18.5 The Agreement contains the entire understanding between PHX and AGENCY with respect to citation processing, and upon the commencement date, supersedes and replaces all prior agreements, negotiations, proposals, or representations regarding warranty or Services.
- 18.6 PHX agrees that it is an independent organization and that its officers and employees are not employees of the AGENCY, nor are they entitled to any benefits as AGENCY employees as a result of the execution of this contract.

## STAFF SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council approve the attached three-year Microsoft Software Assurance and Licensing Agreement.

Microsoft software that is not properly licensed and maintained under a software assurance agreement is subject to penalties that are two to three times the cost of the contract. Proper licensing assures that the City's software will be upgraded to the most current version with no additional cost and provides training directly from Microsoft as well as technical assistance. Unlicensed Microsoft products are subject to license revocations, which would result in server failure and total non-functionality of the City's computer system.

This purchase is being made following Gardena Municipal Code § 2.60.140 which specifies that the City may make Cooperative Purchases utilizing the "piggyback" method. The City will "piggyback" on a State approved contract which was procured through a formal RFP by Riverside County. Attached are four quotes that were received from qualified vendors as so designated in the Riverside contract. Staff recommends the lowest qualified bidder, Crayon Software Experts LLC, whose bid is \$475,052 for the three-year contract period. This reflects a savings of \$194,885 from the City's last three-year contract. Crayon was also selected by Riverside County and provided excellent references that have been verified by staff.

The billing and coverage period will be spread over the three-year contract period, beginning January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2022. Billing will be received at the beginning of each calendar year. Cost will be allocated to the departments by total number of users. The billing schedule per fiscal year shall be as follows:

- a. Minimum order requirements. Enrolled Affiliate's Enterprise must have a minimum of 250 Qualified Users or Qualified Devices. The initial order must include at least 250 Licenses for Enterprise Products or Enterprise Online Services.
  - (i) Enterprise commitment. Enrolled Affiliate must order enough Licenses to cover all Qualified Users or Qualified Devices, depending on the License Type, with one or more Enterprise Products or a mix of Enterprise Products and the corresponding Enterprise Online Services (as long as all Qualified Devices not covered by a License are only used by users covered with a user License).

- b. Setting Prices. Enrolled Affiliate's prices for each Product or Service will be established by its Reseller. Except for Online Services designated in the Product Terms as being exempt from fixed pricing. As long as Enrolled Affiliate continues to qualify for the same price level, Microsoft's prices for Resellers for each Product or Service ordered will be fixed throughout the applicable initial or renewal Enrollment term. Microsoft's prices to Resellers are reestablished at the beginning of the renewal term.

## 4. Paỳmènt terms:

For the initial or renewal order, Microsoft will invoice Enrolled Affiliate's Reseller in three equal annual installments. The first installment will be invoiced upon Microsoft's acceptance of this Enrollment and remaining installments will be invoiced on each subsequent Enrollment anniversary date. Subsequent orders are invoiced upon acceptance of the order and Enrolled Affiliate may elect to pay annually or upfront for Online Services and upfront for all other Licenses.

## 5. End of Enrollment term and termination.

- a. General. At the Expiration Date, Enrolled Affiliate must immediately order and pay for Licenses for Products it has used but has not previously submitted an order, except as otherwise provided in this Enrollment.
- b. Renewal option. At the Expiration Date of the initial term, Enrolled Affiliate can renew Products by renewing this Enrollment for one additional 36-month term or by signing a new Enrollment. Microsoft must receive a Renewal Form, Product Selection Form, and renewal order prior to or at the Expiration Date. Microsoft will not unreasonably reject any renewal.

Microsoft may make changes to this program that will make it necessary for Customer and its Enrolled Affiliates to enter into new agreements and Enrollments at renewal.

#### c. If Enrolled Affiliate elects not to renew.

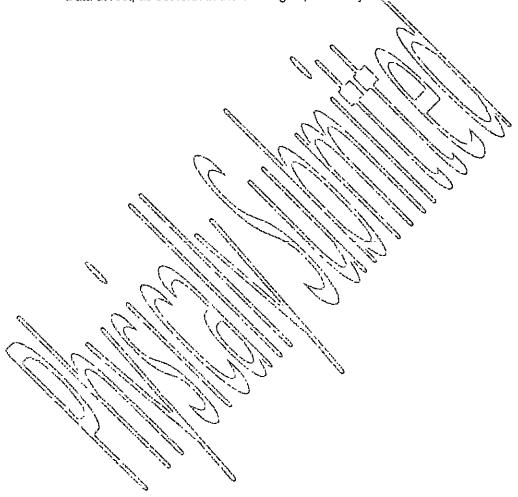
- (i) Software Assurance. If Enrolled Affiliate elects not to renew Software Assurance for any Product under its Enrollment, then Enrolled Affiliate will not be permitted to order Software Assurance later without first acquiring a new License with Software Assurance.
- (ii) Online Services eligible for an Extended Term. For Online Services identified as eligible for an Extended Term in the Product Terms, the following options are available at the end of the Enrollment initial or renewal term.
  - 1) Extended Term. Licenses for Online Services will automatically expire in accordance with the terms of the Enrollment. An extended term feature that allows Online Services to continue month-to-month ("Extended Term") is available. During the Extended Term, Online Services will be invoiced monthly at the then-current published price as of the Expiration Date plus a 3% administrative fee for up to one year. If Enrolled Affiliate wants an Extended Term, Enrolled Affiliate must submit a request to Microsoft at least 30 days prior to the Expiration Date.
  - 2) Cancellation during Extended Term. At any time during the first year of the Extended Term, Enrolled Affiliate may terminate the Extended Term by submitting a notice of cancellation to Microsoft for each Online Service. ## AGENDA TITLE:

### **RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff respectfully recommends that the City Council:

- 1. Introduce Ordinance No. 1815 adopting by reference the California State Building Code with amendments; and
- 2. Set a public hearing on the adopt for the meeting of February 11, 2020.

## **BACKGROUND:**

California law requires cities to adopt the California Building Standards Code (CBSC) which is set forth in Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations. The 2019 edition of that Code, together with local amendments, are recommended for City Council adoption. The State Building Standards Code consists of the following parts:

- Part 1 California Administrative Code
- Part 2 California Building Code
- Part 2.5 California Residential Code
- Part 3 California Electrical Code
- Part 4 California Mechanical Code
- Part 5 California Plumbing Code
- Part 6 California Energy Code
- Part 7 Vacant
- Part 8 California Historical Building Code
- Part 9 California Fire Code
- Part 10 California Existing Building Code
- Part 11 California Green Building Standards Code (CALGreen)
- Part 12 California Referenced Standards Code

The Ordinance adopts all Parts and some appendices with amendments. The only exception is Part 9, the California Fire Code, due to the fact that the City adopts the Los Angeles County Fire Code.

Staff proposes that the City Council adopt the amendments to the CBSC which have been recommended by the International Code Council (ICC) Los Angeles Basin Chapter's Administration and Construction Committees to deal with local conditions relating to seismic safety and local climatic conditions in order to better protect the City.

Because the Ordinance adopts the California State Building Standards Code by reference, state law requires that it first be introduced and then the City Council set a public hearing date, after which the City Council may adopt the Ordinance. Prior to adoption of Ordinance 1815, the City Council will consider a Resolution setting for the findings and rationale for these amendments as required by law. The Resolution will be presented at the time of the public hearing. Upon adoption, the Ordinance and Resolution will be sent to the California Building Standards Commission in accordance with State law.

Should the City Council fail to adopt this Ordinance after the public hearing, the provisions of the 2019 building code will still apply, just without the amendments to deal with local climatic and seismic issues.

## FISCAL REVIEW/COST

There will be no fiscal impact as a result of the adoption of the subject Ordinance.

IN CONCLUSION, Staff respectfully recommends that the City Council introduce Ordinance No. 1815 and set a public hearing on its adoption for its regularly scheduled meeting of February 11, 2020.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 1815

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, REPEALING CHAPTER 15.04 OF THE GARDENA MUNICIPAL CODE AND ADOPTING A NEW CHAPTER 15.04 WHICH ADOPTS BY REFERENCE THE 2019 CALIFORNIA STATE BUILDING STANDARDS CODE, WITH AMENDMENTS, EXCEPT PART 9, AND READOPTS SECTION 15.04.020 RELATING TO FEES

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 18901 et seq. provides that the Building Standards Commission shall adopt a California Building Standards Code ("CBSC") based on specified uniform codes with input from various State Departments; and

WHEREAS, the 2019 CBSC has been adopted and is codified in Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations; and

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 17922 provides that the Department of Housing and Community Development is to adopt the CBSC and other regulations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Department of Housing and Community Development has adopted the most recent version of the CBSC; and

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 17958.5 provides that a city may make changes in the provisions adopted pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 17922 and published in the CBSC or other regulations upon specified findings; and

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 17958 further provides that, if a city does not amend, add, or repeal ordinances or regulations to impose those requirements or make changes, the provisions published in the CBSC or other regulations shall be applicable to the city and shall be effective 180 days after publication of the CBSC by the California Building Standards Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, the California Building Standards Commission adopted the 2019 Codes to be effective as of January 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Gardena has determined that it would like to adopt the CBSC by reference, as well as make certain amendments thereto; and

**WHEREAS**, prior to adopting this Ordinance, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 6424, making the necessary findings to amend the California Building Standards Code;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES ORDAIN, AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter 15.04 of the Gardena Municipal Code is repealed.

**SECTION 2**. Chapter 15.04 is added to the Gardena Municipal Code to read, as follows:

# Chapter 15.04 General Building Provisions

## 15.04.010 Adoption of the California Building Standards Code

- A. Subject to the amendments and changes set forth herein, the following parts of the 2019 California Building Standards Code as set forth in Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations are adopted by reference in their entirety:
  - 1. Part 1 California Building Standards Administrative Code.
  - 2. Part 2 California Building Code and the following division and appendices:
    - a. Division II, Scope and Administration to the California Building Code;
    - b. Appendix F, Rodent-proofing;
    - c. Appendix H, Signs;
    - d. Appendix I, Patio Covers;
    - e. Appendix J, Grading.
  - 3. Part 2.5 California Residential Building Code and the following division and appendices:
    - a. Division II, Scope and Administration to the California Residential Building Code:
    - b. Appendix H, Patio Covers;

- B. The most recent version of the Los Angeles County Fire Code, as set forth in Section 8.08.020, shall be part of the building regulations of the city. In cases of conflict between any provision between the Los Angeles County Fire Code and the other provisions of the building regulations of the city of Gardena, the most restrictive provision shall prevail.

#### 15.04.020 Fees

The City shall charge fees for all permits, plan checks, inspections and other services performed by the City relating to any portion of the Building Regulations of the City or any other provision of Title 15 of the Gardena Municipal Code in an amount set by resolution of the City Council.

## 15.04.030 Amendment of Part 2, California Building Code

- A. Section 105.2 of the California Building Code relating to Building exemptions is amended to read as follows; the exemptions for electrical, gas, mechanical and plumbing remain the same:
  - **105.2 Work exempt from permit.** Exemptions from permit requirements of this code shall not be deemed to grant authorization for any work to be done in any manner

in violation of the provisions of this code or any other laws or ordinances of this jurisdiction. Permits shall not be required for the following:

## **Building:**

- 1. One-story Detached Accessory Structures, used as tool and storage sheds, playhouses and similar uses provided the floor area does not exceed 120 square feet, with three feet clear from a building or property line and conforming to the zoning requirements of the Gardena Municipal Code.
- 2. [deleted].
- 3. [deleted].
- 4. [deleted].
- 5. Water tanks supported directly on grade if the capacity is not greater than 5,000 gallons (18,925 L) and the ratio of height to diameter or width is not greater than 2:1.
- 6. Sidewalks and driveways not more than 30 inches (762) mm above adjacent grade, and not over any basement or story below and are not part of an accessible route.
- 7. Painting, papering, floor and wall tiling excluding showers and wet areas, carpeting, cabinets, counter tops not containing plumbing or electrical fixtures, and similar finish work.
- 8. Temporary motion picture, television, and theater stage sets and scenery.
- Prefabricated swimming pools accessory to a Group R-3 occupancy that are less than 18 inches deep, do not exceed 5,000 gallons and are installed entirely above ground.
- 10. Shade cloth structures constructed for nursery or agricultural purposes, and not including service systems.
- 11. Swings and other playground equipment accessory to detached one- and two-family dwellings.
- 12. Window awnings in Group R-3 or Group U occupancies, supported by an exterior wall that do not project more than 54 inches from the exterior wall and do not require additional support.
- 13. Nonfixed and Movable fixtures, cases, racks, counters, and partitions not over five feet nine inches (1753 mm) in height.

- 14. Decks not over 30 inches above surrounding grade or finishes, not attached to a structure, or serving any part of the means of egress.
- B. Section 105.5 is amended to read as follows:
  - **105.5** Expiration. Every permit issued shall become invalid unless the work on the site authorized by such permit is commenced within 480 360 days after its issuance, or if the work authorized on the site by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of 180 days after the time the work is commenced. The building official is authorized to grant one extension of time for period of not more than 180 days. The extension shall be requested in writing and justifiable cause demonstrated. Extensions shall only be granted prior to the expiration of a permit.
- C. Section 107.5.1 relating to Retention of Construction Documents is added to read as follows:
  - 107.5.1 Retention of Construction Documents. Per Building Standards Law, Health and Safety Code Sections 19850 and 19851 the City is required to retain a copy of these plans. The light or dark graphics and/or text will not allow for scanning. Text shall be 7/64", or 10 point, minimum in height and legible.
- D. Table 1505.1 of Chapter 15 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:

- E. Section 1505.1.3 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1505.1.3.** Roof coverings within all other areas. The entire roof covering of every existing structure where more than 50 percent of the total roof is replaced within any one-year period, the entire roof covering of every new structure and any roof covering applied in the alteration, repair or replacement of the roof of every existing structure shall be a fire-retardant roof covering that is at least a Class & "B" Fire Rated assembly.
- F. Section 1507.3.1 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1507.3.1 Deck requirements.** Concrete and clay tile shall be installed only over solid sheathing or spaced structural sheathing boards.

- Exception: Spaced lumber shall be permitted in Seismic Design Categories A,B, and C.

- G. The following sections are added to Chapter 16 of the California Building Code to read as follows:
  - 1613.5 Amendments to ASCE 7. The provisions of Section 1613.5 shall be permitted as an amendment to the relevant provisions of ASCE 7.
  - 1613.5.1 Values for vertical combinations. Modify ASCE 7 Section 12.2.3.1 Exception 3 as follows:
  - 3. <u>Detached one- and two-family dwellings up to two stories in height of light frame</u> construction.
    - 1613.5.2 Wood diaphragms. Modify ASCE 7 Section 12.11.2.2.3 as follows:

12.11.2.2.3 Wood diaphragms. The anchorage of concrete or masonry structural walls to wood diaphragms shall be in accordance with AWC SDPWS 4.1.5.1 and this section. Continuous ties required by this section shall be in addition to the diaphragm sheathing. Anchorage shall not be accomplished by use of toenails or nails subject to withdrawal, nor shall wood ledgers or framing be used in cross-grain bending or cross-grain tension. The diaphragm sheathing shall not be considered effective for providing the ties or struts required by this section

For structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F, wood diaphragms supporting concrete or masonry walls shall comply with the following:

- 1. The spacing of continuous ties shall not exceed 40 feet. Added chords of diaphragms may be used to form subdiaphragms to transmit the anchorage forces to the main continuous crossties.
- 2. The maximum diaphragm shear used to determine the depth of the subdiaphragm shall not exceed 75% of the maximum diaphragm shear.

1613.5.3 Structural separation. Modify ASCE 7 Section 12,12.3 Equation 12,12-1 as follows:

- 1613.7 Suspended ceilings. Minimum design and installation standards for suspended ceilings shall be determined in accordance with the requirements of Section 2506.2.1 of this Code and this section.
- 1613.7.1 Scope. This part contains special requirements for suspended ceilings and lighting systems. Provisions of Section 13.5.6 of ASCE 7 shall apply except as modified herein.
  - 1613.7.2 General. The suspended ceilings and lighting systems shall be limited to 6 feet (1828 mm) below the structural deck unless the lateral bracing is designed by a licensed engineer or architect.
  - 1613.7.3 Sprinkler heads. All sprinkler heads (drops) except fire-resistance-rated floor/ceiling or roof/ceiling assemblies, shall be designed to allow for free movement of the sprinkler pipes with oversize rings, sleeves or adaptors through the ceiling tile. Sprinkler heads and other penetrations shall have a 2 inch (50mm) oversize ring, sleeve, or adapter through the ceiling tile to allow for free movement of at least 1 inch (25mm) in all horizontal directions. Alternatively, a swing joint that can accommodate 1 inch (25 mm) of ceiling movement in all horizontal directions is permitted to be provided at the top of the sprinkler head extension.

Sprinkler heads penetrating fire-resistance-rated floor/ceiling or roof/ceiling assemblies shall comply with Section 714 of this Code.

- 1613.7.4 Special requirements for means of egress. Suspended ceiling assemblies located along means of egress serving an occupant load of 30 or more shall comply with the following provisions.
  - 1613.7.4.1 General. Ceiling suspension systems shall be connected and braced with vertical hangers attached directly to the structural deck along the means of egress serving an occupant load of 30 or more and at lobbies accessory to Group A Occupancies. Spacing of vertical hangers shall not exceed 2 feet (610 mm) on center along the entire length of the suspended ceiling assembly located along the means of egress or at the lobby.
  - 1613.7.4.2 Assembly device. All lay-in panels shall be secured to the suspension ceiling assembly with two hold-down clips minimum for each tile within a 4-foot (1219 mm) radius of the exit lights and exit signs.
  - 1613.7.4.3 Emergency systems. Independent supports and braces shall be provided for light fixtures required for exit illumination. Power supply for exit illumination shall comply with the requirements of Section 1008.3 of this Code.
  - 1613.7.4.4 Supports for appendage. Separate support from the structural deck shall be provided for all appendages such as light fixtures, air diffusers, exit signs, and similar elements.

H. Section 1704.6 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:

**1704.6 Structural observations.** Where required by the provisions of Section 1704.6.1, 1704.6.2 or 1704.6.3, the owner or the owner's authorized agent shall employ a-registered design professional, or his/her designee as a structural observer, to perform structural observations. Structural observation does not include or waive the responsibility for the inspections in Section 110 or the special inspections in Section 1705 or other sections of this code. The structural observer shall be one of the following individuals:

- 1. The registered design professional responsible for the structural design, or
- 2. A registered design professional designated by the registered design professional responsible for the structural design.

Prior to the commencement of observations, the structural observer shall submit to the building official a written statement identifying the frequency and extent of structural observations.

At the conclusion of the work included in the permit, the structural observer shall submit to the building official a written statement that the site visits have been made and identify any reported deficiencies that, to the best of the structural observer's knowledge, have not been resolved.

The owner or owner's authorized agent shall coordinate and call a preconstruction meeting between the structural observer, contractors, affected subcontractors and special inspectors. The structural observer shall preside over the meeting. The purpose of the meeting shall be to identify the major structural elements and connections that affect the vertical and lateral load resisting systems of the structure and to review scheduling of the required observations. A record of the meeting shall be included in the report submitted to the building official.

Observed deficiencies shall be reported in writing to the owner or owner's authorized agent, special inspector, contractor and the building official. Upon the form prescribed by the building official, the structural observer shall submit to the building official a written statement at each significant construction stage stating that the site visits have been made and identifying any reported deficiencies which, to the best of the structural observer's knowledge, have not been resolved. A final report by the structural observer which states that all observed deficiencies have been resolved is required before acceptance of the work by the building official.

- I. Section 1704.6.2 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1704.6.2 Structural observations for seismic resistance.** Structural observations shall be provided for those structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F where one or more of the following conditions exist:
  - 1. The structure is classified as Risk Category III or IV.
  - 2. The structure is assigned to Seismic Design Category E, is classified as Risk Category I or II, and is greater than two stories above the grade plane a lateral design is required for the structure or portion thereof.

Exception: One-story wood framed Group R-3 and Group U Occupancies less than 2,000 square feet in area, provided the adjacent grade is not steeper than 1 unit vertical in 10 units horizontal (10% sloped), assigned to Seismic Design Category D.

- J. Section 1705.3 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1705.3 Concrete construction.** The special inspections and tests for concrete construction shall be performed in accordance with this section and Table 1705.3.

**Exceptions:** Special inspections and tests shall not be required for:

- 1. Isolated spread concrete footings of buildings three stories or less above grade plane that are fully supported on earth or rock where the structural design of the footing is based on a specified compressive strength, f'c, not more than 2,500 pounds per square inch (psi) (17.2 Mpa) regardless of the compressive strength specified in the construction documents or used in the footing construction.
- 2. Continuous concrete footings supporting walls of buildings three stories or less above grade plane that are fully supported on earth or rock where:
  - 2.1. The footings support walls of light-frame construction;
  - 2.2. The footings are designed in accordance with Table 1809.7;
  - 2.3. The structural design of the footing is based on a specified compressive strength, f'c, not more than 2,500 pounds per square inch (psi) (17.2 Mpa), regardless of the compressive strength specified in the construction documents or used in the footing construction.
- 3. Nonstructural concrete slabs supported directly on the ground, including prestressed slabs on grade, where the effective prestress in the concrete is less than 150 psi (1.03 Mpa).
- 4. Concrete foundation walls constructed in accordance with Table 1807.1.6.2.
- 54. Concrete patios, driveways and sidewalks, on grade.

- K. Section 1705.12 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1705.12 Special inspections for seismic resistance.** Special inspections for seismic resistance shall be required as specified in Sections 1705.12.1 through 1705.12.9, unless exempted by the exceptions of Section 1704.2.

**Exception:** The special inspections specified in Sections 1705.12.1 through 1705.12.9 are not required for structures designed and constructed in accordance with one of the following:

- 1. The structure consists of light-frame construction; the design spectral response acceleration at short periods, S_{DS}, as determined in Section 1613.2.4, does not exceed 0.5; and the building height of the structure does not exceed 35 feet (10 668 mm).
- 2. The seismic force-resisting system of the structure consists of reinforced masonry or reinforced concrete; the design spectral response acceleration at short periods, S_{DS}, as determined in Section 1613.2.4, does not exceed 0.5; and the building height of the structure does not exceed 25 feet (7620 mm)
- 3. The structure is a detached one- or two family dwelling not exceeding two stories above grade plane, is not assigned to Seismic Design Category D. E or F, and does not have any of the following horizontal or vertical irregularities in accordance with Section 12.3 of ASCE 7:
- 3.1 Torsional or extreme torsional irregularity.
- 3.2 Nonparallel systems irregularity.
- 3.3 Stiffness-soft-story or stiffness-extreme soft-story irregularity.
- 3.4 Discontinuity in lateral strength-weak story-irregularity.
- L. Section 1807.1.4 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - 1807.1.4 Permanent wood foundation systems. Permanent wood foundation systems shall be designed and installed in accordance with AWC PWF. Lumber and plywood shall be treated in accordance with AWPA U1 (Commodity Specification A, Special Requirement 4.2) and shall be identified in accordance with Section 2303.1.9.1. Permanent wood foundation systems shall not be used for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F.
- M. Section 1807.1.6 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - 1807.1.6 Prescriptive design of concrete and masonry foundation walls. Concrete and masonry foundation walls that are laterally supported at the top and bottom shall be permitted to be designed and constructed in accordance with this

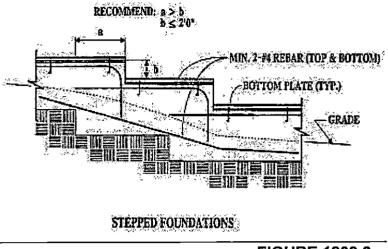
- section. Prescriptive design of foundation walls shall not be used for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F.
- N. Section 1807.2 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1807.2** Retaining walls. Retaining walls shall be designed in accordance with Section 1807.2.1 through 1807.2.3. Retaining walls assigned to Seismic Design Category D. E or F shall not be partially or wholly constructed of wood.
- O. Section 1807.3.1 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1807.3.1 Limitations.** The design procedures outlined in this section are subject to the following limitations:
  - 1. The frictional resistance for structural walls and slabs on silts and clays shall be limited to one half of the normal force imposed on the soils by the weight of the fooling or slab.
  - 2. Posts embedded in earth shall not be used to provide lateral support for structural or nonstructural materials such as plaster, masonry or concrete unless bracing is provided that develops the limited deflection required.

Wood poles shall be treated in accordance with AWPA U1 for sawn timber posts (Commodity Specification A, Use Category 4B) and for round timber posts (Commodity Specification B, Use Category 4B). Wood poles and posts embedded in direct contact with soil shall not be used for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F.

Exception: Wood poles and posts embedded in direct contact with soil may be used to support nonhabitable, nonoccupiable structures such as fences when approved by the building official.

- P. Section 1809.3 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1809.3 Stepped footings.** The top surface of footings shall be level. The bottom surface of footings shall be permitted to have a slope not exceeding one unit vertical in 10 units horizontal (10-percent slope). Footings shall be stepped where it is necessary to change the elevation of the top surface of the footing or where the surface of the ground slopes more than one unit vertical in 10 units horizontal (10-percent slope).

For structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F, the stepping requirement shall also apply to the top surface of continuous footings supporting walls. Footings shall be reinforced with four No. 4 deformed reinforcing bars. Two bars shall be placed at the top and bottom of the footings as shown in Figure 1809.3.

Q. Section 1809.7 and Table 1809.7 of the California Building Code are amended to read as follows:

**1809.7 Prescriptive footings for light-frame construction.** Where a specific design is not provided, concrete or masonry-unit footings supporting walls of light-frame construction shall be permitted to be designed in accordance with Table 1809.7. <u>Light-frame construction using prescriptive footings in Table 1809.7 shall not exceed one story above grade plane for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F.</u>

- a. Depth of footings shall be in accordance with Section 1809.4.
- b. The ground under the floor shall be permitted to be excavated to the elevation of the top of the footing.
- c. Interior stud-bearing walls shall be permitted to be supported by isolated footings. The footing width and length shall be twice the width shown in this table, and footings shall be spaced not more than 6 feet on center. Not Adopted.
- d. See Section 1905 for additional requirements for concrete footings of structures assigned to Seismic Design Category C, D, E or F.

- e. For thickness of foundation walls, see Section 1807.1.6.
- f. Footings shall be permitted to support a roof addition to the stipulated number of floors. Footings supporting roof only shall be as required for supporting one floor.
- g. Plain concrete footings for Group R-3 occupancies shall be permitted to be 6 inches thick.

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- R. Section 1809.12 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - 1809.12 Timber footings. Timber footings shall be permitted for buildings of Type V construction and as otherwise approved by the Building Official. Such footings shall be treated in accordance with AWPA U1 (Commodity Specification A, Use Category 4B). Treated timbers are not required where placed entirely below permanent water level, or where used as capping for wood piles that project above the water level over submerged or marsh lands. The compressive stresses perpendicular to grain in untreated timber footings supported on treated piles shall not exceed 70 percent of the allowable stresses for the species and grade of timber as specified in the ANSI/AWC NDS. Timber footings shall not be used in structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F.
- S. Section 1810.3.2.4 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **1810.3.2.4 Timber.** Timber deep foundation elements shall be designed as piles or poles in accordance with ANSI/AWC NDS. Round timber elements shall conform to ASTM D 25. Sawn timber elements shall conform to DOC PS-20. <u>Timber deep foundation elements shall not be used in structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F.</u>
- T. Section 1905.1.7 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - 1905.1.7 ACI 318, Section 14.1.4. Delete ACI 318, Section 14.1.4, and replace with the following:
    - 14.1.4 Plain concrete in structures assigned to Seismic Design Category C, D, E or F.
    - 14.1.4.1 Structures assigned to Seismic Design Category C, D, E or F shall not have elements of structural plain concrete, except as follows:
    - (a) Structural plain concrete basement, foundation or other walls below the base as defined in ASCE 7 are permitted in detached one- and two-family dwellings three stories or less in height constructed with stud-bearing walls. In dwellings assigned to Seismic Design Category D or E, the height of the wall shall not exceed 8 feet (2438-mm), the thickness shall not be less than 7½ inches (190 mm), and the wall shall retain no more than 4 feet (1219 mm) of unbalanced fill. Walls shall have reinforcement in accordance with 14.6.1. Concrete used for fill with a minimum cement content of two (2) sacks of Portland cement or cementious material per cubic yard.
    - (b) Isolated footings of plain concrete supporting pedestals or columns are permitted, provided the projection of the footing beyond the face of the supported member does not exceed the footing thickness.

- Exception: In detached one- and two family dwellings three stories or less in height, the projection of the footing beyond the face of the supported member is permitted to exceed the footing thickness.
- (c) Plain concrete footings supporting walls are permitted provided the footings have at least two continuous longitudinal reinforcing bars. Bars shall not be smaller than No. 4 and shall have a total area of not less than 0.002 times the gross cross-sectional area of the footing. For footings that exceed 8 inches (203 mm) in thickness, a minimum of one bar shall be provided at the top and bottom of the footing. Continuity of reinforcement shall be provided at corners and intersections.

### Exceptions:

- 1. In Seismic Design Categories A, B and C, Detached one- and two-family dwellings three stories or less in height and constructed with stud-bearing walls, are permitted to have plain concrete footings without longitudinal reinforcement with at least two continuous longitudinal reinforcing bars not smaller than No. 4 are permitted to have a total area of less than 0.002 times the gross cross-sectional area of the footing.
- 2. For foundation systems consisting of a plain concrete footing and a plain concrete stemwall, a minimum of one bar shall be provided at the top of the stemwall and at the bottom of the are footing.
- 3. Where a slab on ground is east monolithically with the footing, one No. 5 bar is permitted to be located at either the top of the slab or bottom of the footing.
- U. Section 1905.1 is amended and Sections 1905.1.9 thru 1905.1.11 are added to Chapter 19 of the California Building Code to read as follows:
  - **1905.1 General.** The text of ACI 318 shall be modified as indicated in Sections 1905.1.1 through 1905.1.8 1905.1.11.
    - 1905.1.9 ACI 318, Section 18.7.5. Modify ACI 318, Section 18.7.5, by adding Section 18.7.5.7 and 18.7.5.8 as follows:
      - 18.7.5.7 Where the calculated point of contraflexure is not within the middle half of the member clear height, provide transverse reinforcement as specified in ACI 318 Sections 18.7.5.1, Items (a) through (c), over the full height of the member.
      - 18.7.5.8 At any section where the design strength,  $φP_n$ , of the column is less than the sum of the shears  $V_e$  computed in accordance with ACI 318 Sections 18.7.6.1 and 18.6.5.1 for all the beams framing into the column above the level under consideration, transverse reinforcement as specified

in ACI 318 Sections 18.7.5.1 through 18.7.5.3 shall be provided. For beams framing into opposite sides of the column, the moment components are permitted to be assumed to be of opposite sign. For the determination of the design strength,  $\varphi P_n$ , of the column, these moments are permitted to be assumed to result from the deformation of the frame in any one principal axis.

1905.1.10 ACI 318, Section 18.10.4. Modify ACI 318, Section 18.10.4, by adding Section 18.10.4.6 as follows:

<u>18.10.4.6 – Walls and portions of walls with  $P_u > 0.35P_o$  shall not be considered to contribute to the calculated shear strength of the structure for resisting earthquake-induced forces. Such walls shall conform to the requirements of ACI 318 Section 18.14.</u>

1905.1.11 ACI 318, Section 18.12.6. Modify ACI 318, by adding Section 18.12.6.2 as follows:

18.12.6.2 Collector and boundary elements in topping slabs placed over precast floor and roof elements shall not be less than 3 inches (76 mm) or 6  $d_b$  in thickness, where  $d_b$  is the diameter of the largest reinforcement in the topping slab.

V. Section 2304.10.1 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:

**2304.10.1 Fastener requirements.** Connections for wood members shall be designed in accordance with the appropriate methodology in Section 2302.1. The number and size of fasteners connecting wood members shall not be less than that set forth in Table 2304.10.1. <u>Staple fasteners in Table 2304.10.1 shall not be used to resist or transfer seismic forces in structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, <u>E or F.</u></u>

Exception: Staples may be used to resist or transfer seismic forces when the allowable shear values are substantiated by cyclic testing and approved by the building official.

W. Section 2304.10.2.1 is added to the California Building Code to read as follows:

2304.10.2.1 Quality of nails. In Seismic Design Category D, E or F, mechanically driven nails used in wood structural panel shear walls shall meet the same dimensions as that required for hand-driven nails, including diameter, minimum length and minimum head diameter. Clipped head or box nails are not permitted in new construction. The allowable design value for clipped head nails in existing construction may be taken at no more than the nail-head-area ratio of that of the same size hand-driven nails.

- X. Section 2304.12.5 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **2304.12.5 Wood used in retaining walls and cribs.** Wood installed in retaining or crib walls shall be preservative treated in accordance with AWPA U1 for soil and fresh water use. Wood shall not be used in retaining or crib walls for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F.
- Y. Section 2305.4 is added to Chapter 23 of the California Building Code to read as follows:
  - 2305.4 Hold-down connectors. In Seismic Design Category D, E or F, hold-down connectors shall be designed to resist shear wall overturning moments using approved cyclic load values or 75 percent of the allowable seismic load values that do not consider cyclic loading of the product. Connector bolts into wood framing shall require steel plate washers on the post on the opposite side of the anchorage device. Plate size shall be a minimum of 0.229 inch by 3 inches by 3 inches (5.82 mm by 76 mm by 76 mm) in size. Hold-down connectors shall be tightened to finger tight plus one half (1/2) wrench turn just prior to covering the wall framing.
- Z. Section 2306.2 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **2306.2 Wood-frame diaphragms.** Wood-frame diaphragms shall be designed and constructed in accordance with AWC SDPWS. Where panels are fastened to framing members with staples, requirements and limitations of AWC SDPWS shall be met and the allowable shear values set forth in Table 2306.2(1) or 2306.2(2) shall only be permitted for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category A, B, or C.

Exception: Allowable shear values where panels are fastened to framing members with staples may be used if such values are substantiated by cyclic testing and approved by the building official.

The allowable shear values in Tables 2306.2(1) and 2306.2(2) are permitted to be increased 40 percent for wind design.

Wood structural panel diaphragms used to resist seismic forces in structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F shall be applied directly to the framing members.

Exception: Wood structural panel diaphragms are permitted to be fastened over solid lumber planking or laminated decking, provided the panel joints and lumber planking or laminated decking joints do not coincide.

- AA. Section 2306.3 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **2306.3 Wood-frame shear walls.** Wood-frame shear walls shall be designed and constructed in accordance with AWC SDPWS. For structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E, or F, application of Tables 4.3A and 4.3B of AWC SDPWS shall include the following:

- 1. Wood structural panel thickness for shear walls shall not be less than 3/8 inch thick and study shall not be spaced at more than 16 inches on center.
- 2. The maximum nominal unit shear capacities for 3/8 inch wood structural panels resisting seismic forces in structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E or F is 400 pounds per linear foot (plf).

Exception: Other nominal unit shear capacities may be permitted if such values are substantiated by cyclic testing and approved by the building official.

- 3. Nails shall be placed not less than 1/2 inch in from the panel edges and not less than 3/8 inch from the edge of the connecting members for shear greater than 350 plf using ASD or 500 plf using LRFD. Nails shall be placed not less than 3/8 inch from panel edges and not less than 1/4 inch from the edge of the connecting members for shears of 350 plf or less using ASD or 500 plf or less using LRFD.
- 4. Table 4.3B application is not allowed for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, E, or F.

For structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D, application of Table 4.3C of AWC SDPWS shall not be used below the top level in a multi-level building.

Where panels are fastened to framing members with staples, requirements and limitations of AWC SDPWS shall be met and the allowable shear values set forth in Table 2306.3(1), 2306.3(2) or 2306.3(3) shall <u>only</u> be permitted <u>for structures</u> assigned to Seismic Design Category A, B, or C.

Exception: Allowable shear values where panels are fastened to framing members with staples may be used if such values are substantiated by cyclic testing and approved by the building official.

The allowable shear values in Tables 2306.3(1) and 2306.3(2) are permitted to be increased 40 percent for wind design. Panels complying with ANSI/APA PRP-210 shall be permitted to use design values for Plywood Siding in the AWC SDPWS.

BB. Section 2307.2 is added to the California Building Code to read as follows:

2307.2 Wood-frame shear walls. Wood-frame shear walls shall be designed and constructed in accordance with Section 2306.3 as applicable.

## CC. Table 2308.6.1 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:

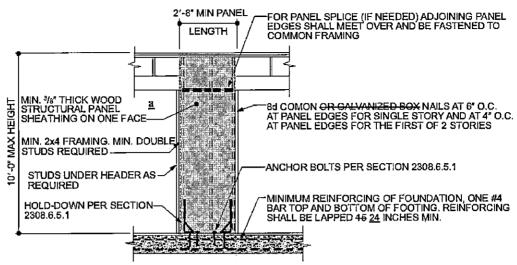

DD. Sections 2308.6.5, 2308.6.5.1 and 2308.6.5.2 and Figures 2308.6.5.1 and 2308.6.5.2 of the the California Building Code are amended to read as follows:

2308.6.5 Alternative bracing. An alternate braced wall (ABW) or a portal frame with hold-downs (PFH) described in this section is permitted to substitute for a 48-inch (1219 mm) braced wall panel of Method DWB, WSP, SFB, PBS, PCP or HPS. For Method GB, each 96-inch (2438 mm) section (applied to one face) or 48-inch (1219 mm) section (applied to both faces) or portion thereof required by Table 2308.6.1 is permitted to be replaced by one panel constructed in accordance with Method ABW or PFH.

2308.6.5.1 Alternate braced wall (ABW). An ABW shall be constructed in accordance with this section and Figure 2308.6.5.1. In one-story buildings, each panel shall have a length of not less than 2 feet 8 inches (813 mm) and a height of not more than 10 feet (3048 mm). Each panel shall be sheathed on one face with 3/8-inch (3.2 mm) minimum-thickness wood structural panel sheathing nailed with 8d common or galvanized box nails in accordance with Table 2304.10.1 and blocked at wood structural panel edges. For structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D or E, each panel shall be sheathed on one face with 15/32-inchminimum-thickness (11.9 mm) wood structural panel sheathing nailed with 8d common nails spaced 3 inches on panel edges, 3 inches at intermediate supports. Two anchor bolts installed in accordance with Section 2308.3.1 shall be provided in each panel. Anchor bolts shall be placed at each panel outside guarter points. Each panel end stud shall have a hold-down device fastened to the foundation, capable of providing an approved uplift capacity of not less than 1,800 pounds (8006 N). The hold-down device shall be installed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. The ABW shall be supported directly on a foundation or on floor framing supported directly on a foundation that is continuous across the entire length of the braced wall line. This foundation shall be reinforced with not less than one No. 4 bar top and bottom. Where the continuous foundation is required to have a depth greater than 12 inches (305 mm), a minimum 12-inch by 12-inch (305 mm by 305 mm) continuous footing or turned down slab edge is permitted at door openings in the braced wall line. This continuous footing or turned down slab edge shall be reinforced with not less than one No. 4 bar top and bottom. This reinforcement shall be lapped 45 24 inches (381 610 mm) with the reinforcement required in the continuous foundation located directly under the braced wall line.

Where the ABW is installed at the first story of two-story buildings, the wood structural panel sheathing shall be provided on both faces, three anchor bolts shall be placed at one-quarter points and tie-down device uplift capacity shall be not less than 3,000 pounds (13 344 N).

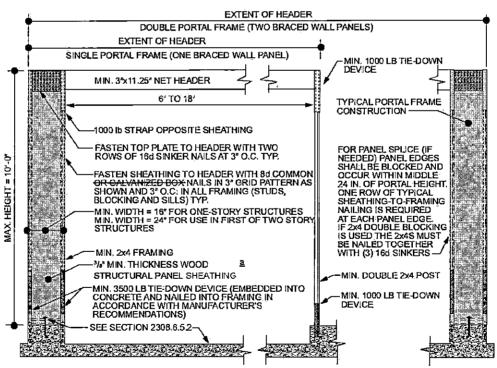
## FIGURE 2308.6.5.1 ALTERNATE BRACED WALL PANEL (ABW)

**2308.6.5.2 Portal frame with hold-downs (PFH).** A PFH shall be constructed in accordance with this section and Figure 2308.6.5.2. The adjacent door or window opening shall have a full-length header.

In one-story buildings, each panel shall have a length of not less than 16 inches (406 mm) and a height of not more than 10 feet (3048 mm). Each panel shall be sheathed on one face with a single layer of 3/8-inch (9.5 mm) minimum-thickness wood structural panel sheathing nailed with 8d common or galvanized box nails in accordance with Figure 2308.6.5.2. For structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D or E, each panel shall be sheathed on one face with 15/32-inchminimum-thickness (11.9 mm) wood structural panel sheathing nailed with 8d common nails spaced 3 inches on panel edges, 3 inches at intermediate supports and in accordance with Figure 2308.6.5.2. The wood structural panel sheathing shall extend up over the solid sawn or glued-laminated header and shall be nailed in accordance with Figure 2308.6.5.2. A built-up header consisting of at least two 2-inch by 12-inch (51 mm by 305 mm) boards, fastened in accordance with Item 24 of Table 2304.10.1 shall be permitted to be used. A spacer, if used, shall be placed on the side of the built-up beam opposite the wood structural panel sheathing. The header shall extend between the inside faces of the first full-length outer studs of each panel. The clear span of the header between the inner studs of each panel shall be not less than 6 feet (1829 mm) and not more than 18 feet (5486 mm) in length. A strap with an uplift capacity of not less than 1,000 pounds (4,400 N) shall fasten the header to the inner study opposite the sheathing. One anchor bolt not less than 5/8 inch (15.9 mm) diameter and installed in accordance with Section 2308.3.1 shall be provided in the center of each sill plate. The studs at each end of the panel shall have a hold-down device fastened to the foundation with an uplift capacity of not less than 3,500 pounds (15 570 N).

Where a panel is located on one side of the opening, the header shall extend between the inside face of the first full-length stud of the panel and the bearing studs at the other end of the opening. A strap with an uplift capacity of not less than 1,000 pounds (4400 N) shall fasten the header to the bearing studs. The bearing study shall also have a hold-down device fastened to the foundation with an uplift capacity of not less than 1.000 pounds (4400 N). The hold-down devices shall be an embedded strap type, installed in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. The PFH panels shall be supported directly on a foundation that is continuous across the entire length of the braced wall line. This foundation shall be reinforced with not less than one No. 4 bar top and bottom. Where the continuous foundation is required to have a depth greater than 12 inches (305 mm), a minimum 12-inch by 12-inch (305 mm by 305 mm) continuous footing or turneddown slab edge is permitted at door openings in the braced wall line. This continuous footing or turned down slab edge shall be reinforced with not less than one No. 4 bar top and bottom. This reinforcement shall be lapped not less than 45 24 inches (381 610 mm) with the reinforcement required in the continuous foundation located directly under the braced wall line.

Where a PFH is installed at the first story of two-story buildings, each panel shall have a length of not less than 24 inches (610 mm).

FIGURE 2308.6.5.2 PORTAL FRAME WITH HOLD-DOWNS (PFH)

- EE. Section 2308.6.8.1 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **2308.6.8.1 Foundation requirements.** Braced wall lines shall be supported by continuous foundations.

Exception: For structures with a maximum plan dimension not more than 50 feet (15240 mm), continuous foundations are required at exterior walls only for structures assigned to Seismic Design Category A, B, or C.

For structures in Seismic Design Categories D and E, exterior braced wall panels shall be in the same plane vertically with the foundation or the portion of the structure containing the offset shall be designed in accordance with accepted engineering practice and Section 2308.1.1.

### Exceptions:

- 1. Exterior braced wall panels shall be permitted to be located not more than 4 feet (1219 mm) from the foundation below where supported by a floor constructed in accordance with all of the following:
  - 1.1. Cantilevers or setbacks shall not exceed four times the nominal depth of the floor joists.
  - 1.2. Floor joists shall be 2 inches by 10 inches (51 mm by 254 mm) or larger and spaced not more than 16 inches (406 mm) on center.
  - 1.3. The ratio of the back-span to the cantilever shall be not less than 2 to 1.
  - 1.4. Floor joists at ends of braced wall panels shall be doubled.
  - 1.5. A continuous rim joist shall be connected to the ends of cantilevered joists. The rim joist is permitted to be spliced using a metal tie not less than 0.058 inch (1.47 mm) (16 galvanized gage) and 11/2 inches (38 mm) in width fastened with six 16d common nails on each side. The metal tie shall have a yield stress not less than 33,000 psi (227 MPa).
  - 1.6. Joists at setbacks or the end of cantilevered joists shall not carry gravity loads from more than a single story having uniform wall and roof loads nor carry the reactions from headers having a span of 8 feet (2438 mm) or more.

2. The end of a required braced wall panel shall be allowed to extend not more than 1 foot (305 mm) over an opening in the wall below. This requirement is applicable to braced wall panels offset in plane and braced wall panels offset out of plane as permitted by Exception 1. Braced wall panels are permitted to extend over an opening not more than 8 feet (2438 mm) in width where the header is a 4 inch by 12 inch (102 mm by 305 mm) or larger member.

FF. Section 2308.6.9 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:

2308.6.9 Attachment of sheathing. Fastening of braced wall panel sheathing shall not be less than that prescribed in Tables 2308.6.1 or 2304.10.1. Wall sheathing shall not be attached to framing members by adhesives. Staple fasteners in Table 2304.10.1 shall not be used in structures assigned to Seismic Design Category D. E or F.

All braced wall panels shall extend to the roof sheathing and shall be attached to parallel roof rafters or blocking above with framing clips (18 gauge minimum) spaced at maximum 24 inches (6096 mm) on center with four 8d nails per leg (total eight 8d nails per clip). Braced wall panels shall be laterally braced at each top corner and at maximum 24 inches (6096 mm) intervals along the top plate of discontinuous vertical framing.

GG. Section 3101.1 of the California Building Code is amended to read as follows:

### SECTION 3101 GENERAL

**3101.1 Scope.** The provisions of this chapter shall govern special building construction including membrane structures, temporary structures, pedestrian walkways and tunnels, automatic vehicular gates, awnings and canopies, marquees, signs, towers, antennas, relocatable buildings, swimming pool enclosures and safety devices, and solar energy systems, and intermodal shipping containers.

For purposes of this Section and Section 3114, intermodal shipping container is defined as follows:

**INTERMODAL SHIPPING CONTAINER.** A six-sided steel unit originally constructed as a general cargo container used for the transport of goods and materials.

HH. Section 3114 is added to the California Building Code to read as follows

# SECTION 3114 INTERMODAL SHIPPING CONTAINERS

3114.1 General. The provisions of Section 3114 and other applicable sections of this code shall apply to intermodal shipping containers that are repurposed for use as buildings or structures or as a part of buildings or structures.

### **Exceptions:**

1. <u>Stationary storage battery arrays located in intermodal shipping containers complying with Chapter 12 of the California Fire Code.</u>

- 2. <u>Intermodal shipping containers that are listed as equipment complying with the standard for equipment, such as air chillers, engine generators, modular datacenters, and other similar equipment.</u>
- 3. <u>Intermodal shipping containers housing or supporting experimental equipment are exempt from the requirements of Section 3114 provided they comply with all of the following:</u>
  - 3.1. Single-unit stand-alone intermodal shipping containers shall be supported at grade level and used only for occupancies as specified under Risk Category I in Table 1604.5;
  - 3.2. Single-unit stand-alone intermodal shipping containers shall be located a minimum of 8 feet from adjacent structures and are not connected to a fuel gas system or fuel gas utility; and
  - 3.3. <u>In hurricane-prone regions and flood hazard areas, single-unit stand-alone intermodal shipping containers are designed in accordance with the applicable provisions of Chapter 16.</u>
- 4. <u>Intermodal shipping containers approved as temporary structures complying with Section 3103.</u>
- Single-unit stand-alone intermodal shipping containers used as temporary storage or construction trailer on active construction sites. Construction support facilities for uses and activities not directly associated with the actual processes of construction, including but not limited to, offices, meeting rooms, plan rooms, other administrative or support functions shall not be exempt from Section 3114.
- <u>3114.2 Construction documents.</u> The construction documents shall contain information to verify the dimensions and establish the physical properties of the steel components, and wood floor components, of the intermodal shipping container in addition to the information required by Sections 107 and 1603.
- 3114.3 Intermodal shipping container information. Intermodal shipping containers shall bear the manufacturer's existing data plate containing the following information as required by ISO 6346 and verified by an approved agency. A report of the verification process and findings shall be provided to the building owner.
  - 1. Manufacturer's name or identification number
  - 2. Date manufactured
  - 3. Safety approval number
  - 4. Identification number

- 5. Maximum operating gross mass or weight (kg) (lbs)
- 6. Allowable stacking load for 1.8G (kg) (lbs)
- 7. Transverse racking test force (Newtons)
- 8. Valid maintenance examination date

Where approved by the building official, the markings and manufacturer's existing data plate are permitted to be removed from the intermodal shipping containers before they are repurposed for use as buildings or structures or as part of buildings or structures.

- 3114.4 Protection against decay and termites. Wood structural floors of intermodal shipping containers shall be protected from decay and termites in accordance with the applicable provisions of Section 2304.12.1.1.
- 3114.5 Under-floor ventilation. The space between the bottom of the floor joists and the earth under any intermodal shipping container, except spaces occupied by basements and cellars, shall be provided with ventilation in accordance with Section 1202.4.
- <u>3114.6 Roof assemblies.</u> Intermodal shipping container roof assemblies shall comply with the applicable requirements of Chapter 15.

Exception: Single-unit stand-alone intermodal shipping containers not attached to, or stacked vertically over, other intermodal shipping containers, buildings or structures.

- 3114.7 Joints and voids. Joints and voids that create concealed spaces between intermodal shipping containers, that are connected or stacked, at fire-resistance-rated walls, floor or floor/ceiling assemblies and roofs or roof/ceiling assemblies shall be protected by an approved fire-resistant joint system in accordance with Section 715.
- 3114.8 Structural. Intermodal shipping containers that conform to ISO 1496-1 and are repurposed for use as buildings or structures, or as a part of buildings or structures, shall be designed in accordance with Chapter 16 and this section.
  - 3114.8.1 Foundations. Intermodal shipping containers repurposed for use as a permanent building or structure shall be supported on foundations or other supporting structures designed and constructed in accordance with Chapters 16 through 23.
    - 3114.8.1.1 Anchorage. Intermodal shipping containers shall be anchored to foundations or other supporting structures as necessary to provide a continuous load path for all applicable design and environmental loads in accordance with Chapter 16.

- 3114.8.2 Welds. All new welds and connections shall be equal to or greater than the original connections.
- 3114.8.3 Openings in containers. Where openings are made in container walls, floors, and roofs for doors, windows and other similar openings:
  - 1. The openings shall be framed with steel elements that are designed in accordance with Chapter 16 and Chapter 22.
  - 2. The cross section and material grade of any new steel element shall be equal to or greater than the steel element removed.
- 3114.8.4 Detailed structural design procedure. A structural analysis meeting the requirements of this section shall be provided to the building official to demonstrate the structural adequacy of the intermodal shipping containers.

Exception: Intermodal shipping containers that meet the limitation of Section 3114.8.5.1 and designed in accordance with the simplified procedure in Section 3114.8.5.

- 3114.8.4.1 Material properties. Structural material properties for existing intermodal shipping container steel components shall be established by material testing where the steel grade and composition cannot be identified by the manufacturer's designation as to manufacture and mill test.
- 3114.8.4.2 Seismic design parameters. The seismic force-resisting system shall be designed and detailed in accordance with one of the following:
  - 1. Where all or portions of the intermodal shipping container sides are considered to be the seismic force-resisting system, design and detailing shall be in accordance with the ASCE 7 Table 12.2-1 requirements for light-frame bearing-wall systems with shear panels of all other materials,
  - 2. Where portions of intermodal shipping container sides are retained, but are not considered to be the seismic force-resisting system, an independent seismic force-resisting system shall be selected, designed and detailed in accordance with ASCE 7 Table 12.2-1, or
  - 3. Where portions of the intermodal shipping container sides are retained and integrated into a seismic force-resisting system other than as permitted by Section 3114.8.4.2 Item 1, seismic design parameters shall be developed from testing and analysis in accordance with Section 104.11 and ASCE 7 Section 12.2.1.1 or 12.2.1.2.
- 3114.8.4.3 Allowable shear value. The allowable shear values for the intermodal shipping container side walls and end walls shall be demonstrated by testing and analysis accordance with Section 104.11. Where penetrations

are made in the side walls or end walls designated as part of the lateral force-resisting system, the penetrations shall be substantiated by rational analysis.

- 3114.8.5 Simplified structural design procedure of single-unit containers. Single-unit intermodal shipping containers conforming to the limitations of Section 3114.8.5.1 shall be permitted to be designed in accordance with Sections 3114.8.5.2 and 3114.8.5.3.
  - 3114.8.5.1 Limitations. Use of Section 3114.8.5 is subject to all the following limitations:
    - 1. The intermodal shipping container shall be a single stand-alone unit supported on a foundation and shall not be in contact with or supporting any other shipping container or other structure.
    - 2. The intermodal shipping container's top and bottom rails, corner castings, and columns or any portion thereof shall not be notched, cut, or removed in any manner.
    - 3. The intermodal shipping container shall be erected in a level and horizontal position with the floor located at the bottom.
  - 3114.8.5.2 Structural design. Where permitted by Section 3114.8.5.1, single-unit stand-alone intermodal shipping containers shall be designed using the following assumptions for the side walls and end walls:
    - 1. The appropriate detailing requirements contained in Chapters 16 through 23.
      - 2. Response modification coefficient, R = 2,
      - 3. Over strength factor,  $\Omega_0 = 2.5$ ,
      - 4. Deflection amplification factor,  $C_d = 2$ , and
      - 5. Limits on structural height,  $h_n = 9.5$  feet (2900 mm).
  - 3114.8.5.3 Allowable shear value. The allowable shear values for the intermodal shipping container side walls (longitudinal) and end walls (transverse) for wind design and seismic design using the coefficients of Section 3114.8.5.2 shall be in accordance with Table 3114.8.5.3, provided that all of the following conditions are met:
    - 1. The total linear length of all openings in any individual side walls or end walls shall be limited to not more than 50 percent of the length of that side walls or end walls, as shown in Figure 3114.8.5.3(1).

- 2. Any full height wall length, or portion thereof, less than 4 feet (305 mm) long shall not be considered as a portion of the lateral force-resisting system, as shown in Figure 3114.8.5.3(2).
- 3. All side walls or end walls used as part of the lateral force-resisting system shall have an existing or new boundary element on all sides to form a continuous load path, or paths, with adequate strength and stiffness to transfer all forces from the point of application to the final point of resistance, as shown in Figure 3114.8.5.3(3).
- 4. A maximum of one penetration not greater than a 6-inch (152 mm) diameter hole for conduits, pipes, tubes or vents, or not greater than 16 square inches (10 322mm²) for electrical boxes, is permitted for each individual 8 feet length (2438 mm) lateral force resisting wall. Penetrations located in walls that are not part of the wall lateral force resisting system shall not be limited in size or quantity. Existing intermodal shipping container's vents shall not be considered a penetration, as shown in Figure 3114.8.5.3(4).
- 5. End wall door or doors designated as part of the lateral force-resisting system shall be welded closed.

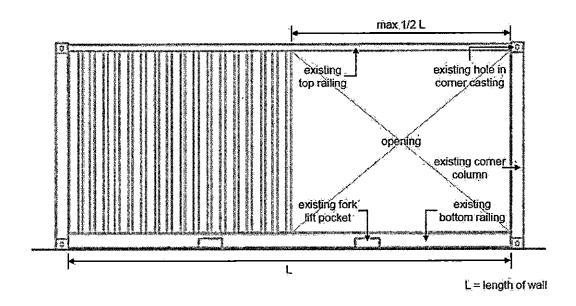


FIGURE 3114.8.5.3(1)
Bracing Unit Distribution – Maximum Linear Length

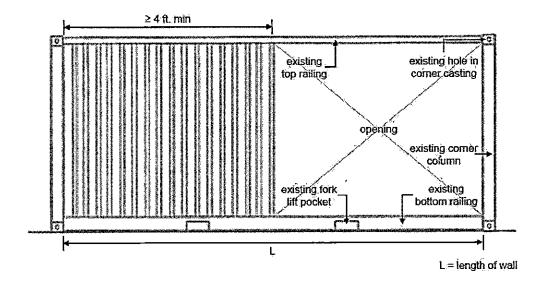


FIGURE 3114.8.5.3(2)
Bracing Unit Distribution – Minimum Linear Length

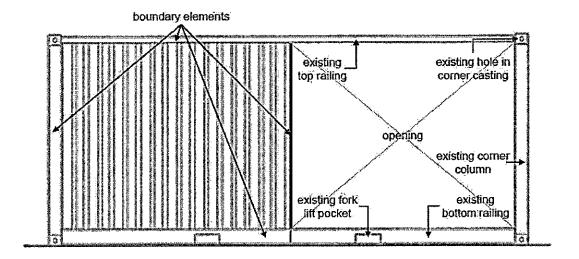


FIGURE 3114.8.5.3(3)
Bracing Unit Distribution – Boundary Elements

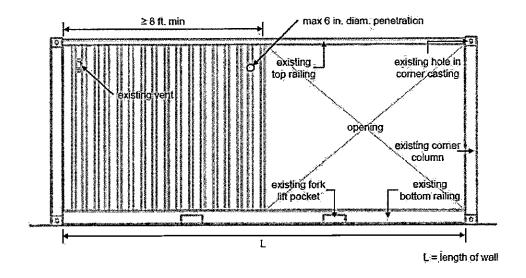


FIGURE 3114.8.5.3(4)

F101.7 Rodent proofing. Annular spaces around pipes, electric cables, conduits or other openings in exterior walls shall be protected against the passage of rodents and insects by closing such openings with a method acceptable to the enforcing agency. CalGreen 4.406.1

### SECTION 15.04.040 Amendment of Part 2.5, California Residential Code

A. Section R105.2, Building, of Chapter 1 of the California Residential Code is amended to read as follows, all other subsections of Section R105.2 remain the same:

**Section R105.2, Work Exempt From Permit.** Exemption from permit requirements of this code shall not be deemed to grant authorization for any work to be done in any manner I violation of the provisions of this code or any other laws or ordinances of this jurisdiction. Permits shall not be required for the following:

### Building

- One-story Detached Accessory Structures, used as tool and storage sheds, playhouses and similar uses provided the floor area does not exceed 120 square feet, with three feet clear from a building or property line and conforming to the zoning requirements of the Gardena Municipal Code.
- 2. [deleted].
- 3. [deleted].
- 4. Water tanks supported directly on grade if the capacity is not greater than 5,000 gallons (18,925 L) and the ratio of height to diameter or width is not greater than 2:1.
- 5. Sidewalks and driveways not more than 30 inches (762) mm above adjacent grade, and not over any basement or story below and are not part of an accessible route.
- Painting, papering, floor and wall tiling excluding showers and wet areas, carpeting, cabinets, counter tops not containing plumbing or electrical fixtures, and similar finish work.
- 7. Prefabricated swimming pools that are less than 24 inches deep.
- 8. Swings and other playground equipment accessory to detached one- and two-family dwellings.

- 9. Window awnings supported by an exterior wall that do not project more than 54-inches from the exterior wall and do not require additional support.
- 10. Decks not exceeding 200 Sq. Ft. in area. And not over 30 inches above grade and not attached to a structure, or serving any part of the means of egress.
- B. Section R105.5 of the California Residential Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **R105.5** Expiration. Every permit issued shall become invalid unless the work on the site authorized by such permit is commenced within 480 360 days after its issuance, or if the work authorized on the site by such permit is suspended or abandoned for a period of 180 days after the time the work is commenced. The building official is authorized to grant one extension of time for period of not more than 180 days. The extension shall be requested in writing and justifiable cause demonstrated. Extensions shall only be granted prior to the expiration of a permit.
- C. Section R107.5.1 is added to the California Residential Code to read as follows:
  - R107.5.1 Retention of Construction Documents. Per Building Standards Law, Health and Safety Code Sections 19850 and 19851 the City is required to retain a copy of these plans. The light or dark graphics and/or text will not allow for scanning. Text shall be 7/64" or 10 point, minimum, in height and legible.
- D. Section R301.1.3.2 of the California Residential Code is amended to read as follows:
  - R301.1.3.2 Woodframe structures greater than two-stories. The building official shall require construction documents to be approved and stamped by a California licensed architect or engineer for all dwellings of wood frame construction more than two-stories and one story in height or with a basement <u>located in Seismic Design Category D0, D1, D2 or E</u>. Notwithstanding other sections of law, the law establishing these provisions is found in Business and Professions Code Sections 5537 and 6737.1.

E. Table R301.2(1) of the California Residential Code is amended to read as follows:

- F. Items 1, 3 and 5 of Section R301.2.2.6 of the California Residential Code are amended to read as follows:
  - 1. Shear wall or braced wall offsets out of plane. Conditions where exterior shear wall lines or braced wall panels are not in one plane vertically from the foundation to the uppermost story in which they are required.

**Exception:** For wood light-frame construction, floors with cantilevers or setbacks not exceeding four times the nominal depth of the wood floor joists are permitted to support braced wall panels that are out of plane with braced wall panels below provided that all of the following are satisfied:

- Floor joists are nominal 2 inches by 10 inches (51 mm by 254 mm) or larger and spaced not more than 16 inches (406 mm) on center.
- 2. The ratio of the back span to the cantilever is not less than 2 to 1.
- 3.--Floor joists at ends of braced wall panels are doubled.
- 4. For wood-frame construction, a continuous rim joist is connected to ends of cantilever joists. When spliced, the rim joists shall be spliced using a galvanized metal tie not less than 0.058 inch (1.5 mm) (16 gage) and 1 1/2 inches (38 mm) wide fastened with six 16d nails on each side of the splice or a block of the same size as the rim joist of sufficient length to fit securely between the joist space at which the splice occurs fastened with eight 16d nails on each side of the splice; and
- 5. Gravity loads carried at the end of cantilevered joists are limited to uniform wall and roof loads and the reactions from headers having a span of 8 feet (2438 mm) or less.

3. Shear wall or braced wall offsets in plane. Conditions where the end of a braced wall panel occurs over an opening in the wall below, and ends at a horizontal distance greater than 1 foot (305 mm) from the edge of the opening. This provision is applicable to shear walls and braced wall panels offset in plane and to braced wall panels offset out of plane as permitted by the exception to item 1.

**Exception:** For wood light-frame wall construction, one end of a braced wall panel shall be permitted to extend more than one foot (305-mm) over an opening not more than 8 feet (2438-mm) in width in the wall below provided that the opening includes a header in accordance with all of the following:

- 1. The building width, loading condition and framing member species limitations of Table R602.7(1) shall apply.
- 2. The header is composed of:
  - 2.1 Not less than one 2x12 or two 2x10 for an opening not more than 4 feet (1219 mm) wide.
  - 2.2 Not less than two 2x12 or three 2x10 for an opening not more than 6 feet (1829 mm) in width.
  - 2.3 Not less than three 2x12 or four 2x10 for an opening not more than 8 feet (2438 mm) in width.
- 3. The entire length of the braced wall panel does not occur over an opening in the wall below.
- 5. **Floor level** offset. Conditions where portions of a floor level are vertically offset. **Exceptions:** 
  - 1. Framing supported-directly by continuous foundations at the perimeter of the building.
  - 3. For wood light-frame construction, floors shall be permitted to be vertically offset where the floor framing is lapped or tied together as required by section R502.6.1.
- G. Section R301.2.2.11 is added to Chapter 3 of the California Residential Code to read as follows:
  - R301.2.2.11 Anchorage of mechanical, electrical, or plumbing components and equipment. Mechanical, electrical, or plumbing components and equipment shall be anchored to the structure. Anchorage of the components and equipment shall be designed to resist loads in accordance with the California Building Code and ASCE 7, except where the component is positively attached to the structure and flexible connections are provided between the component and associated ductwork, piping, and conduit; and either
  - 1. The component weighs 400 lb (1,780 N) or less and has a center of mass located 4 ft (1.22 m) or less above the supporting structure; or

- 2. The component weighs 20 lb (89N) or less or, in the case of a distributed system, 5 lb/ft (73 N/m) or less.
- H. Section R313.1 of Chapter 3 of the California Residential Code is deleted and a new Section R313.1 is added to read as follows:

R313.1 Townhouse automatic fire sprinklers systems. An automatic residential fire sprinkler system installed in Townhouses as follows:

New buildings: An automatic sprinkler system shall be installed throughout all new buildings.

### Existing buildings:

An automatic sprinkler system shall be installed throughout when the building area exceeds 3,600 square feet and when one of the following conditions exists:

- 1. When an addition is 50% or more of the existing building area, as defined in Section 502.1, within a two year period; or
- 2. An addition when the existing building is already provided with automatic sprinklers; or
- 3. When an existing Group R occupancy is being substantially renovated, and where the scope of the renovation is such that the Building Official determines that the complexity of installing a sprinkler system would be similar as in a new building.
- I. Section R313.2 of Chapter 3 of the California Residential Code is deleted and a new Section R313.2 is added to read as follows:

### R313.2 One- and two-family dwellings automatic fire sprinklers systems.

An automatic residential fire sprinkler system installed in one and two family dwellings as follows:

New buildings: An automatic sprinkler system shall be installed throughout all new buildings.

Existing buildings: An automatic sprinkler system shall be installed throughout when the building area exceeds 3,600 square feet and when one of the following conditions exists:

- 1. When an addition is 50% or more of the existing building area, as defined in Section 502.1, within a two year period; or
- 2. An addition when the existing building is already provided with automatic sprinklers; or

- 3. When an existing Group R Occupancy is being substantially renovated, and where the scope of the renovation is such that the Building Code Official determines that the complexity of installing a sprinkler system would be similar as in a new building.
- 4. Accessory Dwelling Units do not need automatic residential fire sprinkler systems. If the primary residence is exempt.
- K. Section R401.1 of the California Residential Code is amended to read as follows:

R401.1 Application. The provisions of this chapter shall control the design and construction of the foundation and foundation spaces for buildings. In addition to the provisions of this chapter, the design and construction of foundations in flood hazard areas as established by Table R301.2(1) shall meet the provisions of Section R322. Wood foundations shall be designed and installed in accordance with AWC PWF.

**Exception**: The provisions of this chapter shall be permitted to be used for wood foundations only in the following situations:

- 1. In buildings that have no more than two floors and a roof.
- 2. When interior basement and foundation walls are constructed at intervals not exceeding 50 feet (15 240 mm).

Wood foundations in Seismic Design Category D₀, D₁, D₂, <u>E or F</u> shall be designed in accordance with accepted engineering practice not be permitted.

Exception: In non-occupied, single-story, detached storage sheds and similar uses other than carport or garage, provided the gross floor area does not exceed 200 square feet, the plate height does not exceed 12 feet in height above the grade plane at any point, and the maximum roof projection does not exceed 24 inches.

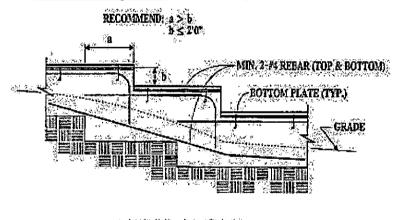
L. Sections R403.1.2, R403.1.3.6 and R403.1.5 of the California Residential Code are amended to read as follows:

**R403.1.2** Continuous footing in Seismic Design Categories D₀, D₁, and D₂, E and F. Exterior walls of buildings located in Seismic Design Categories D₀, D₁, and D₂, E and F, shall be supported by continuous solid or fully grouted masonry or concrete footings. Other footing materials or systems shall be designed in accordance with accepted engineering practice. All required interior braced wall panels in buildings located in Seismic Design Categories D₀, D₁ and D₂ with plan dimensions greater than 50 feet (15 240 mm) shall be supported by continuous solid or fully grouted masonry or concrete footings in accordance with Section R403.1.3.4, except for two-story buildings in Seismic Design Category D₂, in which all braced wall panels, interior and exterior, shall be supported on continuous foundations.

**Exception:** Two story buildings shall be permitted to have interior braced wall panels supported on continuous foundations at intervals not exceeding 50 feet (15 240 mm) provided that:

- 1. The height of cripple walls does not exceed 4 feet (1219 mm).
- 2. First-floor braced wall panels are supported on doubled floor joists, continuous blocking or floor beams.
- 3. The distance between bracing lines does not exceed twice the building width measured parallel to the braced wall line.
- R403.1.3.6 Isolated concrete footings. In detached one—and two family dwellings located in Seismic Design Category A, B, or C, that are three stories or less in height, and constructed with stud bearing walls, isolated plain concrete footings supporting columns or pedestals are permitted. Isolated Concrete footings are not permitted in Seismic Zones D, E, and F.
- **R403.1.5 Slope.** The top surface of footings shall be level. The bottom surface of footings shall not have a slope exceeding one unit vertical in 10 units horizontal (10-percent slope). Footings shall be stepped where it is necessary to change the elevation of the top surface of the footings or where the slope of the bottom surface of the footings will exceed one unit vertical in 10 units horizontal (10-percent slope).

For structures assigned to Seismic Design Categories D₀, D₁ or D₂, stepped footings shall be reinforced with four No. 4 rebar. Two bars shall be place at the top and bottom of the footings as shown in Figure R403.1.5.

## FIGURE R403.1.5 STEPPED FOOTING

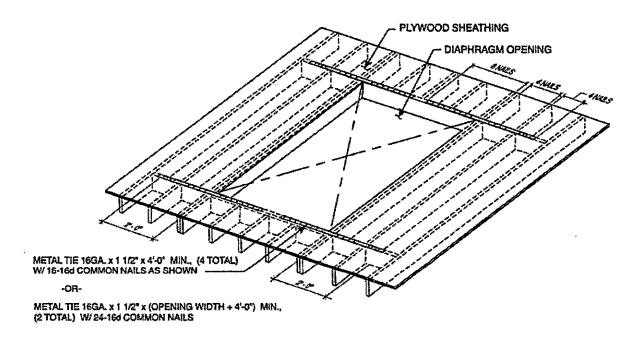
- M. Section R404.2 of the California Residential Code is amended to read as follows:
  - **R404.2 Wood foundation walls.** Wood foundation walls shall be constructed in accordance with the provisions of Sections R404.2.1 through R404.2.6 and with the details shown in Figures R403.1(2) and R403.1(3). Wood foundation walls shall not be used for structures located in Seismic Design Categories D₀, D₁, D₂, E, and F.

N. Section R501.1 of the California Residential Code is amended to read as follows:

**R501.1 Application.** The provisions of this chapter shall control the design and construction of the floors for buildings, including the floors of attic spaces used to house mechanical or plumbing fixtures and equipment. Mechanical or plumbing fixtures and equipment shall be attached or anchored to the structure in accordance with Section R301.2.2.11.

O. Section R503.2.4 is added to Chapter 5 of the California Residential Code to read as follows:

R503.2.4 Openings in horizontal diaphragms. Openings in horizontal diaphragms with a dimension perpendicular to the joist that is greater than 4 feet (1.2 m) shall be constructed in accordance with Figure R503.2.4.

- a. Blockings shall be provided beyond headers.
- b. Metal ties not less than 0.058 inch [1.47 mm (16 galvanized gage)] by 1.5 inches (38 mm) wide with eight 16d common nails on each side of the header-joist intersection. The metal ties shall have a minimum yield of 33,000 psi (227 MPa).
- c. Openings in diaphragms shall be further limited in accordance with Section R301.2.2.6.

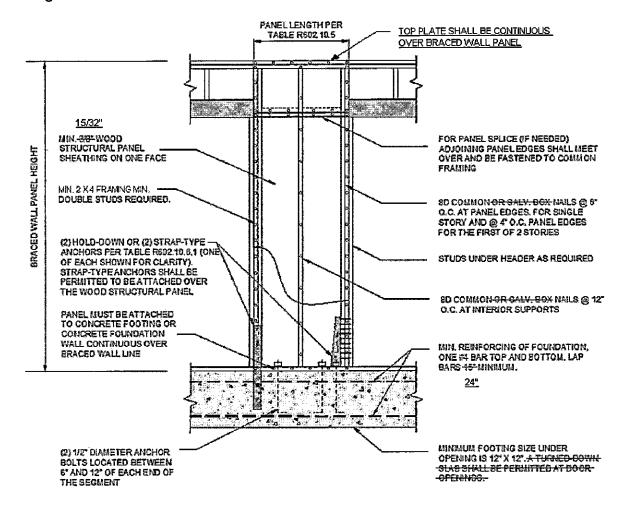
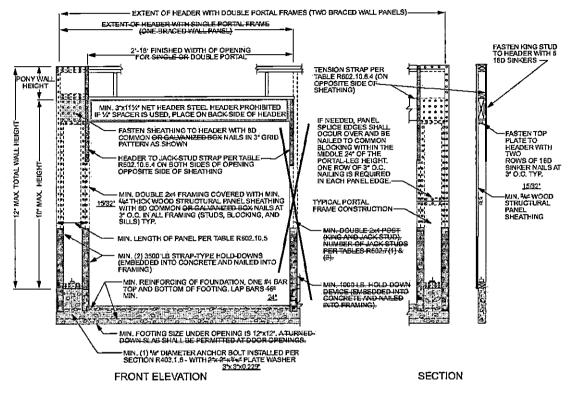


FIGURE R602.10.6.1
METHOD ABW—ALTERNATE BRACED WALL PANEL

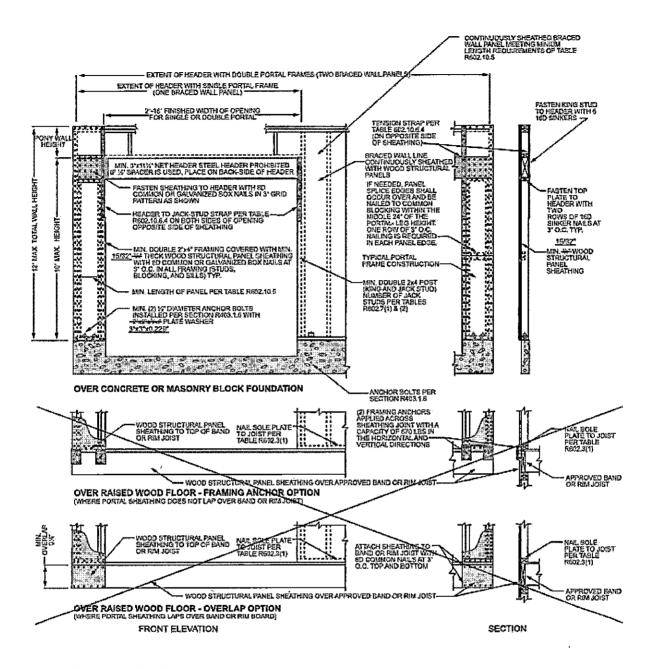

- B. Section 4.106.4.3, Section 4.106.4.3.1 and Table 4.106.4.3.1 of the California Green Building Standards Code are amended to read as follows:
  - **4.106.4.3** New hotels and motels. All newly constructed hotels and motels shall provide EV spaces capable of supporting future installation of EVSE and EVCS. The construction documents shall identify the location of the EV spaces and EVCS.

- 1. Construction documents are intended to demonstrate the project's capability and capacity for facilitating future EV charging.
- 2. There is no requirement for EV spaces to be constructed or available until EV chargers are installed for use.
- **4.106.4.3.1** Number of required EV spaces and EVCS. This Ordinance adopts the California Building Standards Code with local amendments as authorized by State law. The California Building Standards Code already applies by default in the City of Gardena. The local amendments will not create any significant effects as they have been put in place to deal with local conditions. The adoption is exempt from the provisions of CEQA and staff shall file a Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or any part thereof is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this ordinance or any part thereof. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase be declared unconstitutional.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be entered in the book of original ordinances of said City; shall make a minute passage and adoption thereof in the records of the meeting at which time the same is passed and adopted; and shall, within fifteen (15) days after the passage and adoption thereof, cause a summary of the ordinance to be published as required by law.

**SECTION 6.** Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective on the thirty-first day after adoption.
