- (1) City Clerk Mina Semenza, read an email from Teame Ozeqbe "Honorable City Council, Elected Officials, etc., My name is Teame Ozeqbe. I'm writing this to express my strong opposition to State Measure 16. State Measure 16 uses race to judge the qualifications of applicants to universities, to jobs, etc., This is a textbook definition of racism, pure and simple. If it is passed, how far will we slide down this slippery, dangerous slope? What's next? Set a racial quota for elected positions? Set a racial quota for the NBA and NFL? Set a racial quota for TV anchors? Set a racial quota for movies and songs? Please join us to vote "NO" against State Measure 16".
- (2) <u>Traci Saruwatari</u>, Representative of ADAAP & GDAAP: spoke about Red Ribbon Week which is taking place October 23rd through 31st, 2020. She also mentioned that they were joining our Police Department for their "Flap Jack Give Back" on October 24, 2020. She thanked the City and Police Chief Mike Saffell for all their support.
- (3) <u>Matt Larsen</u>, resident of Gardena: spoke regarding an email he received from Mayor Pro Tem Mark Henderson where he referenced himself as the Mayor of Gardena, found it a bit concerning and deceitful about his position in the City, and wanted to bring it to Council's attention.

(1) Approval of Consultant Agreement with De Novo Planning Group for services related to the environmental review of adoption of the 6th Cycle Housing Element for 2021 – 2029 and changes to the Land Use Plan and Zoning to implement the housing changes; preparation of an Environmental Justice Element and update to the Safety Element of the General Plan and Environmental Services related thereto

City Manager Osorio presented the Staff Report. He mentioned that Assistant City Attorney Kranitz and representatives from De Novo Planning Group Amanda Tropiano, and Starla Barker are available for any questions you may have.

There was a discussion which included Mayor Pro Tem Henderson, Council Members Kaskanian and Francis, and City Manager Osorio regarding: if the other firms that responded had the opportunity of knowing that they could consolidate the work. City Manager replied that the treatment was consistent with all three consultants; it was then asked how much did we save by consolidating the work. Amanda Tropiano of De Novo Planning Group responded that we were able to save approximately \$25,000 by proposing on both projects concurrently, which will result in better work products for the City with a more comprehensive approach, she continued to say we hope to deliver to you superior work product for these projects. It was then asked, "what is this going to cost us?" Assistant Attorney Kranitz then replied the very last page of the agenda item was the combined budget for the project for these two RFP's which total with the contingency approximately \$344,000 from 2021 – 2029. She clarified that the Safety Plan and the Environmental Justice Element are not covered by these grants; the

City is currently looking for other grants to cover these costs; she continued to say they are doing significant environmental work on the Housing Element that is going to require significant environmental work under CEQA law; Starla Barker of De Novo Planning Group, then said the technical analysis for the environmental report will include: traffic, air quality, gas emission, notice public service and utilities, just to name a few. City Manager Osorio confirmed that the SB 2 grant for \$310,000 and the Local Early Action Planning grant for \$300,000 should cover most of the work; he then said at the end we are not going to touch the general fund. It was then asked if these elements of the City's General Plan are pretty standard and whether we are adding any new information. Ms. Tropiano then spoke and said the State requires the City to update or analyze these topics periodically, and this is consistent with those state requirements for the topics of housing, environmental justice, and public safety. Assistant City Attorney Kranitz added this is the first year the City will be required to do an Environmental Justice Element, which is a more recent amendment to the General Plan law.

City Manager Osorio replied we have already started advertising on Spectrum 1, on our website and all of our social media accounts. He continued to say that we are trying to reach out to as many families as possible through this gracious amount of money allocated to help our residents.

D. COUNCIL REMARKS

(1) MAYOR PRO TEM HENDERSON – He mentioned his birthday did pass on October 2nd. He congratulates the new hires at the Gardena Police Department. He also thanked Chief Saffell for the presentation on the de-escalation of the event that happened at 13605 S. Vermont Ave. It was a great report and good to hear these things for our community to know we are practicing what we preach. He also thanked our PD and LA County Fire for their work on the bad accident that took place on 147th Street. It took them under 4 minutes to get to the scene which was very impressive. He also wanted to send prayers to everyone impacted by COVID-19 and encouraged everyone to wear a mask and social distance. He attended the SCAG Race Equity Meeting and they are starting to line up the things we are going to do within the Southern California Region regarding health and equity and opportunity. He attended his Business Federation Responsible Governance Meeting in which it centered around the COVID-19 Task Force and how to back up the economy. He attended Bizz Fed discussion on community college partnerships and what are the opportunities to get people back to work. He also attended the funeral for Bess Hudnall at Holly Park United Methodist Church, and everyone was spread out and social distanced. He thanked the Gardena CERT Team who did a drill on his block and heard it was exciting.

- (2) COUNCIL MEMBER FRANCIS She mentioned Hispanic Heritage month began in 1968 and was originally Hispanic Heritage Week started by President Johnson and was later extended to a month by President Reagan. For our local area we have Secretary of State Alex Padilla as well as the first Latino Mayor of Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia who lost both of his parents to COVID-19. She also mentioned that Caesar Chavez whose birthday is a state Holiday on the State of California. He is one of two Americans whose birthday is a holiday and was not a President. October 12 was indigenous people day formerly Columbus Day. She attended the Virtual Town Hall Meeting for Gardena Schools and City of Gardena partnership. Then she also attended the Gardena Clean- Up Day at Rowley Park and about 80 people had gone through and dumped about 4 bins of waste. She stopped by Fukai Park and there was line around the block. She mentioned it was a great event and hope we can have another one. She said by now everyone should have received their ballots for voting. She said it is an important election and you can vote at Rowley Park, Nakaoka Community Center or drop your ballot in the Drop Boxes. She suggested to vote early and do not wait until the last minute.
- (3) <u>COUNCIL MEMBER KASKANIAN</u> He attended a lot of meetings regarding the situation in Armenia and unfortunately, we are in a full blown war with Turkey. He has been talking to Congress and Assembly Members and is doing his best to get the information out there. In the last 48 hours, Turkey has been bombing Artsakh churches and the people in the bunkers under the church are being killed by heavy duty missiles. There has been a lot of causalities. He mentioned at the next council meeting he will try to give an update and some numbers of what is going in in Artsakh.
- (4) MAYOR CERDA She attended the CERT Parade and she helped explain to the community about what CERT is about. She explains CERT is a 3 day, 8-hour course where you learn how to protect your community in an emergency. The event raised awareness and they passed out informational flyers. She also attended a social distance award ceremony for Leroy Bates, one of our golf instructors, he was given an award from the PGA Youth League as number four for recruiting kids to the Junior Golf Program. Most of the time this program is free. She also attended the Bulk Trash Pick Up Event and she mentioned there were so many people that requested another one. She said she thinks the residents loved it and she suggested we do it again. She mentioned the second week in October is Code Enforcement Appreciation Week, so we she mentioned we should tell the code enforcement officers that we appreciate them. She said the Halloween Virtual Costume Contest will still take place and submit the photos by October 26, 2020. All Gardena residents are eligible to win the contest. She mentioned there are multiple categories that you can submit photos to on Facebook. She asked a question to the City Attorney or City Manager regarding neighboring city officials putting their election signs in Gardena when they are running for a neighboring city. The City Attorney responded by saying that we cannot regulate the placement of the sign if they are compliant. Mayor Cerda then added to the remembrances the City Councilmen of Inglewood Eloy Morales's Father who passed away. His name was Eloy Morales Sr.

They only worked on COVID related bills. He also attended the Pancake Breakfast helped by the Gardena Police Department to support the K9 program. He mentioned it was early but a lot of fun.

- (2) MAYOR PRO TEM HENDERSON He attended Centinela Youth Services Special Board Meeting and the CYS is looking good and thriving. He also attended the 8066 Virtual Coffee with Assembly Member Al Muratsuchi and they asked a lot of questions about Gardena. He answered all questions about Gardena and gave greetings on behalf of the Council. He attended the Minority Business Opportunity with Los Angeles World Airports and understanding the opportunities. He completed his AB1234 Training. He attended the Business Federation COVID Task Force Meeting and they discussed opening after COVID-19. He also attended the LA Sentinel Food Giveaway. Also attended the South Bay Fiber Network Meeting and they are trying to determine what the next step is for our community to highlight fiber network needs. He then attended the Flapjack Giveaway and he stated it was a great event with his colleagues. He also mentioned that he read today that LAUSD is going to be investing \$1 million with Verizon to students that are housing insecure as well as in foster care as they work through the distance learning.
- (3) COUNCIL MEMBER FRANCIS She attended the Think Pink Event with the Johnson Park After School Program for breast cancer awareness. She wanted to give a special shoutout to the kids because they raised \$250 for the Susan G. Komen Foundation. She mentioned that she appreciates staff getting the kids involved in these types of things because it makes them better people. She also attended the 20th Annual Flapjack Breakfast for the Gardena Police Department K9 Unit. She stated that she missed seeing the people and friends that you have not seen in a long time but there will be better days ahead. She also drove by Rowley Park on Saturday and saw that there was a long line of people out the door waiting to vote. She said that it was great to see everyone eager to vote on the first day. She thanked City Clerk Semenza and Deputy City Clerk Romero for all the hard work on the voting centers. She then encouraged everyone to go out and vote. She also wanted to give a shout out to the Public Works Department because she received a Thank You Card from her neighbor for the cleanup of the overgrown trees and the trash on 135th Street.
- (4) MAYOR CERDA She attended the Think Pink Event that Recreation and the Afterschool Program put on. She thanked the staff for keeping everyone social distanced. She commended the staff for always putting 100% into all the things they do. She also attended the monthly LA County Sanitation Meeting as well as the CCGA Meeting. She mentioned in a previous meeting with the CCGA they contacted Barbara Ferrer, the LA County health director, they were able to get a meeting with her to see if we can open our casinos with outdoor entertainment. She recommended to the county supervisors to do so and Mayor Cerda was happy to announce that we are now allowed to do outdoor gaming at the Hustler and Lucky Lady Casino. She then said she attended to Flapjack Giveaway and it was a great event. She thanked staff for being so enthusiastic about the event. She mentioned that she has received several inquiries on how they can get the K9 sweatshirt she had on that day. She said she hopes that the Police

He also attended the drive-by event for Breast Cancer. He thanked all the staff as well as the kids for a great event. He then mentioned he was able to drive thru the Flapjack Event and receive his pancakes and eggs. He thanked Chief Saffell and Captain Osorio for a job well done.

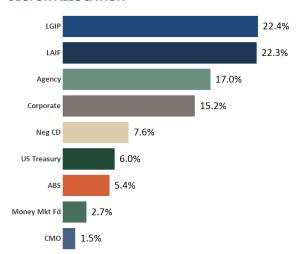

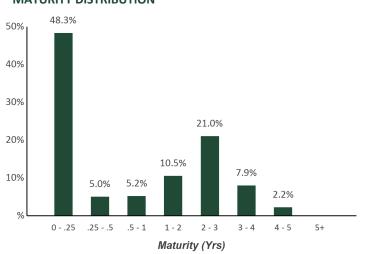

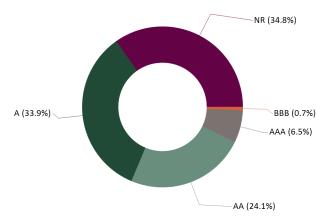
SECTOR ALLOCATION

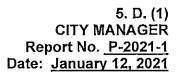

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE LIST OF AUTHORIZED GAMES AND AUTHORIZING THE PLAY OF CERTAIN GAMES IN LICENSED CARD CLUBS

WHEREAS, Gardena Municipal Code Section 5.24.430 provides that licensed card clubs in the City of Gardena ("City") may play any game permitted under state law which is also permitted by resolution of the City Council; and

Hustler Casino shall play the game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker in accordance with the Bureau approved temporary rules, as enclosed.

Although the Bureau has temporarily approved the game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker, it is the sole responsibility of Hustler Casino to abide by and remain in compliance with the local ordinance for the City of Gardena. This letter does not constitute any approval that may be required by the local jurisdiction before the game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker is offered for play. Hustler Casino shall be fully responsible for ensuring that any approval required by local law enforcement is obtained prior to offering the game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker for play.

Face Up Pai Gow Poker

Type of Game

Bureau of Gambling Control

The game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker utilizes a player-dealer position and is a California game. The player-dealer shall collect all losing wagers, pay all winning wagers, and may not win or lose more than the original amount wagered. Once the player-dealer's wager has been exhausted, the wagers not covered by the player-dealer shall be returned to the respective players. A player shall only remain in the player-dealer position for two consecutive rounds of play before it is offered in a clockwise fashion around the gaming table. The gambling enterprise does not participate in the actual play of the game and has no interest in the outcome of the play.

Object of the Game

The object of the game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker is to make a five-card hand and a two-card hand that ranks higher than the player-dealer's five-card hand and two-card hand. Face Up Pai Gow Poker is a Pai Gow Poker variant and plays like conventional Pai Gow Poker, except the player-dealer's hand is shown first. In addition, when the player-dealer's hand is shown and the ranking is a seven-card ace-high or king-high hand, then all player hands will automatically push (tie) and the players' base game wagers will be returned to the players.

Description of the Deck and Number of Decks Used

Face Up Pai Gow Poker is played with a standard 52-card deck including a joker for a total of 53 cards. Cards may be dealt using either a manual hand shuffle or an automated shuffling machine.

Card Values and Hand Rankings

The rank of each card used in Face Up Pai Gow Poker, in order of highest to lowest rank, will be: ace, king, queen, jack, 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3 and 2. The ace would be considered low any time the ace begins a Straight or a Straight Flush. The joker is fully wild. All suits will be considered equal in rank.

The hand rankings for the game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker, in order of highest to lowest, are as follows:

Face up Pai Gow Poker Hand Rankings

Hand Dealt	Hand Requirements
Five of a Kind	A hand that consists of four cards of the same rank and a joker. Four aces and a joker is the highest ranked Five or a Kind and four 2s and a joker is the lowest ranked Five of a Kind.
Royal Flush	A hand that consists of an ace, king, queen, jack and 10 of the same suit.
Straight Flush	A hand that consists of five cards of the same suit in consecutive ranking. A king, queen, jack, 10 and 9 is the highest ranked Straight Flush and a 5, 4, 3, 2 and ace is the lowest ranked Straight Flush.
Four of a Kind	A hand that consists of four cards of the same rank. Four aces is the highest ranked Four of a Kind and four 2s is the lowest ranked Four of a Kind.
Full House	A hand that consists of a Three of a Kind and a Pair. Three aces and two kings is the highest ranked Full House and three 2s and two 3s is the lowest ranked Full House.
Flush	A hand that consists of five cards of the same suit but are not in consecutive ranking. An ace, king, queen, jack and 9 is the highest ranked Flush and a 7, 5, 4, 3 and 2 is the lowest ranked Flush.

One Pair	A hand that consists of two cards of the same rank. Two aces is the highest ranked Pair and two 2s is the lowest ranked Pair.	
High Card	A hand that consists of five cards that do not make any of the hands listed above. An ace, king, queen, jack and 9 is the highest ranked High Card hand and 7, 5, 4, 3, and 2 is the lowest ranked High Card hand.	

Description of Table Used and Total Number of Seated Positions

Face Up Pai Gow Poker is played on a standard Pai Gow Poker table, which seats a maximum of six players and a player-dealer, for a total of seven seated positions. Within each betting area for each seated player, there shall be two separate betting areas representing each players' base game wager and the Fortune Bonus Bet. Each betting space at the table has a fixed amount for wagering limits defining the minimum and maximum amounts that may be wagered. Players must bet at least the table minimum.

Dealing Procedures and Round of Play

All wagers in Face Up Pai Gow Poker will be made by placing casino chips on the appropriate betting areas of the table layout keeping in mind the table minimum and maximum wagering limits.

- At the start of a game a player is offered the player-dealer position. Once the player-dealer position is accepted, the house dealer shall wait for each player to make their wager in accordance with the table limits.
 - a. Each player then has the following option(s) when placing their wager(s):
 - i. The base game which pays 1 to 1;
 - ii. The Fortune Bonus Bet which pays according to the paytable, as shown below; If a player wagers at least \$5 on the Fortune Bonus Bet, the player qualifies for the Envy Bonus and the house dealer must place an "envy" button next to the player's Fortune Bonus Bet wager.
- 2. Third-Party Providers of Proposition Player Services (TPPPS), as defined in Section 19984 of the California Business and Professions Code, are permitted to play.
- 3. Backline betting is permitted on all wagers.
- 4. The game shall utilize an action button to determine the first player to receive first action from the player-dealer.
 - a. To determine the placement of the action button, the house dealer shall use a dice cup. The player-dealer shakes a dice cup, which contains three dice, and the numerical total of the three dice determines the position of the action button. The player-dealer's position is always one, eight, and fifteen. Other seats in clockwise rotation, respectively represent the other numbers. If the total dice value is one, eight, or fifteen, the player-dealer shall receive the first set of cards and the player to the left of the player-dealer shall receive the "Action" button.

- 5. Once all wagers have been placed, the house dealer shall complete the deal of seven Control piles of seven cards face-down in front of the house dealer, one at a time from the house dealer's left to right, until all seven hands are dealt. The house dealer shall then spread the remaining cards to verify there are four cards remaining and placed in the discard pile.
- 6. Should there be a need to deal the game manually (due to a machine malfunction, etc.) the following procedure shall be followed:
 - a. The house dealer shall complete the deal of seven piles of seven cards face-down in front of them. When dealing the seven piles of seven cards, the house dealer shall deal one card at a time in front of the house dealer position until there are seven cards, starting from left to right. Once there are seven cards laid out, the house dealer shall deal each pile another card, from right to left, giving each pile a total of two cards. This process of dealing cards left to right, then right to left, shall be completed until each pile has seven cards. The remaining four cards shall be placed in the discard pile.
 - i. Once the cards have been stacked, the player dealer selects which pile will be distributed to the first player who receives the "action" button. The house dealer identifies the hand by placing a button marked "action" on this pile by pushing it forward and turning the pile behind it sideways.
- 7. Once the first position is determined, the house dealer then distributes the seven piles of cards, starting with the action button and continuing clockwise.
 - a. The player-dealer receives their cards in turn according to the action.
 - b. All seven piles of cards will be distributed to all seats at the table, regardless of whether a player is seated at each position or a wager has been placed. The house dealer will then spread the remaining cards to verify there are four cards remaining and placed in the discard pile.
- 8. The player-dealer's hand will then be exposed and set <u>before</u> the players set their hands
 - a. If the player-dealer has an ace-high or king-high seven-card hand, all player's wagers shall automatically push.
 - i. If the player-dealer's hand does not contain a seven-card ace-high or king-high hand, each player shall then set their hand.
 - b. The player-dealer has the option to ask the house dealer to set their hand according to the House Way chart.
- Once the player-dealer's hand is set, each player sets their hands by arranging the seven cards into a two-card hand in front, and a five-card hand in back.
 - a. The five-card hand must rank higher than the two-card hand, according to the hand rankings, as shown above.
 - b. The player has the option to ask the house dealer to set their hand according to the House Way chart below.
 - c. Players do not have to set their hand the "House Way", they are free to set the hand in any fashion they choose as long as it is not a foul hand. If a player arranges the two-card hand so it out-ranks the five-card hand, this will be considered a foul and the player will automatically lose their wager.
- 10. Once the player's hands are set, each player's hand is exposed, in turn, and compared to the player-dealer's hands to determine the winners, losers, or push hands.
- 11. Each player's five-card hand will be compared to the player-dealer's five-card hand, and each player's two-card hand will be compared to the player-dealer's two-card hand, in turn.
- 12. Wagers will be settled in a clockwise manner around the table, starting with the player with the Action button.

- 13. All wagers will be settled from seat to seat (including backline betters) in the following **Control** order: the base game wager, then the Fortune Bonus Bet, and then the Envy Bonus. Once the player-dealer's wager has been exhausted, the wagers not covered by the player-dealer will be returned to the respective players.
- 14. The cards are collected, shuffled, and a new round begins.

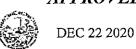

How Winners are Determined and Paid

Once each player has set their hands and the house dealer has set the player-dealer's hand, each player's hand shall be compared against the player-dealer's hand. The following shall apply for each possible outcome when determining which hand wins, loses, or if there is a push.

- 1. The base game wager wins if the two-card hand and the five-card hand, held by the player, ranks higher than the player-dealer's two-card hand and five-card hand.
- 2. The base game wager loses if the two-card hand and the five-card hand held by the player, ranks lower than the player-dealer's two-card hand and five-card hand.
- 3. The base game wager "pushes" if one of the hands held by the player ranks higher than the player-dealer's corresponding hand, and the player's other hand ranks lower than the player-dealer's corresponding hand. In this case, neither the player nor the player-dealer wins or loses; the wager is a push and is returned to the player.
 - a. The base game wager also "pushes" if the ranking of the player-dealer's shown hand is a seven-card ace-high or king-high hand. Neither the player nor the player-dealer wins or loses; the wager is a push and is returned to the player.
- 4. If either the two-card hand or the five-card hand is identical in rank to the player-dealer's two-card hand or five-card hand, it is a "copy hand." The player-dealer wins all copy hands.
- 5. The player-dealer will collect losing Fortune Bonus Bets and pays winning Fortune Bonus Bets to the extent of the player-dealer's wager.

6. A player qualifies for an Envy Bonus payout when a player places a Fortune Bonus Bet **Control** of at least \$5. The player-dealer shall pay all winning Envy Bonus' when a player at the table receives a Four of a Kind or higher, excluding the player-dealer hand or their own hand.

Bonus Bets

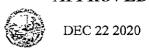
The Fortune Bonus Bet is an optional bonus bet that complements the game of Face Up Pai Gow Poker, as listed above. It is a wager that allows a player to bet that they will be dealt a predetermined and designated qualifying hand, as described below. There will be a distinctively marked circle on the table in which a player may place the optional bonus bet.

- A player has to place a base bet in order to place a Fortune Bonus Bet. Furthermore, the wager must be placed prior to the initial deal.
- Any seated player as well as any backline bettor may place a Fortune Bonus Bet.
- The Fortune Bonus Bet may be less than, equal to, or greater than the base game wager. However, it may not exceed the table limit.
- The bonus bet takes into account the first seven cards dealt as a player's hand. In the event that the first seven cards dealt to a player that placed a bonus bet is a predetermined and designated qualifying hand, as described below, the bonus bet will win. The player will then receive a monetary payout based on the bonus hand that the player has received and the paytable, as shown below. Any other combination of the first seven cards dealt, other than the hands described below, will lose.
- The bonus bet may win regardless of the outcome of the base game wager.
- The player-dealer will pay all winning Fortune Bonus Bets and will collect all losing Fortune Bonus Bets. Once the player-dealer's wager has been exhausted, the wagers not covered by the player-dealer will be returned to the players.
- Winning Fortune Bonus Bets will be paid according to the table, as shown below.

Envy Bonus

A player who places a wager of at least \$5 on the Fortune Bonus Bet will receive an Envy button and may qualify for the Envy Bonus payout if another player who placed a Fortune Bonus Bet receives a predetermined and designated qualifying hand, as shown above. Players will receive one Envy button for each Fortune Bonus Bet in an amount equal to or greater than \$5.

- The Envy Bonus takes into account the first seven cards dealt as a player's hand.
- Only seated players are eligible to receive an "Envy" button.
- In the event that the first seven cards dealt to a player that has placed a Fortune Bonus Bet is a predetermined and designated qualifying hand, as shown above, all players with an Envy button will win.
- Players are not eligible to win an Envy Bonus for their own hand.
- If multiple players have made a seven-card qualifying Fortune Bonus Bet and Envy Bonus hand, then all players with an Envy button will win, other than for their own hand.
- If multiple Envy Bonus hands are achieved, all players with Envy buttons will be paid for the multiple Envy payouts. However, players are not eligible to win an Envy Bonus for their own hand.
- Players will receive a fixed monetary payout based on the qualifying hand that another player has received and the pay table, as shown above.
- The Envy Bonus may win regardless of the outcome of the Face Up Pai Gow Poker base game wager.
- The player-dealer will pay qualifying Envy Bonuses and will collect Envy buttons that did not qualify to the extent of the player-dealer's wager.
- Qualifying Envy Bonus buttons will be paid according to the table, as shown above.

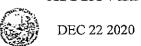
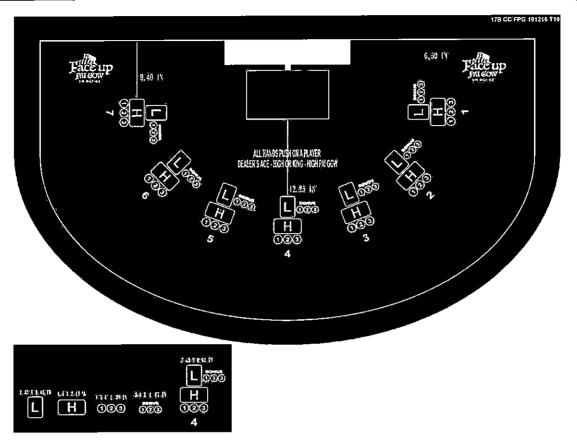
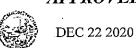


Table Layout

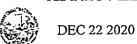
Collection Rates Schedules

For schedule options 1 through 7, a collection fee will be taken from each player for each base game wager they place. A collection fee will also be taken from the player-dealer per hand. There shall be no additional collection fee taken from players for placing any bonus bet. The bonus bet limit shall range from \$5-\$1,000. Collection Procedures

- California games utilize a player-dealer position. The position shall be offered systematically and continuously in a clockwise manner around the table after every two hands.
- All base game wagers, including bonus bets, are collected or paid, to the extent that the player-dealer's wager covers.
- Once the player-dealer's wager has been exhausted, the wagers not covered by the player-dealer shall be returned to the respective players.
- The gambling establishment does not participate in the actual play of the game and has no interest in the outcome of the play.
- Only one collection schedule option, which utilizes one table limit and the specified
 collection fees for that table limit, as listed above, shall be used at a gaming table at any
 one time.
- Collection rates and fees shall be determined prior to the start of play of any hand or round. Rates shall not be calculated as a fraction or percentage of wagers made or winnings earned.
- Flat fees on wagers may be assessed at different collection rates; however, no more than five collection rates may be established per table.
- Hustler Casino shall provide ample notice to patrons regarding the collection rates and fees, as well as the procedure for collecting them.
- Collection fees shall be conspicuously posted on or within view of every gaming table.

The Ordinance is exempt from CEQA.

ORDINANCE NO. 1821

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA ADDING CHAPTER 18.57 TO THE GARDENA MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO LOW BARRIER NAVIGATION CENTERS

WHEREAS, during the last legislative session the legislature enacted AB 101 (Chapter 159) relating to housing issues; and

WHEREAS, AB 101 added Article 12 to Chapter 4.5 of the Government Code (sections 65660 et seq.) relating to Low Barrier Navigation Centers and provides that these uses are allowed by right in areas zoned for mixed use and nonresidential zones where multifamily uses are allowed; and

WHEREAS, in compliance with AB 101, the City is required to amend its Municipal Code to allow for such Low Barrier Navigations Centers; and

WHEREAS, on October 20, 2020 the Planning Commission of the City of Gardena held a duly, noticed public hearing on this Ordinance at which time it considered all evidence presented both oral and written; and

WHEREAS, after the close of the public hearing the Planning Commission recommended that the City Council adopt this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2020 the City Council of the City of Gardena held a duly, noticed public hearing on this Ordinance at which time it considered all evidence presented both oral and written;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 18.57 is hereby added to the Gardena Municipal Code to read as follows:

CHAPTER 18.57

LOW BARRIER NAVIGATION CENTERS

18.57.010 Purpose.

The purpose of this Chapter is to implement the provisions of Government Code section 65660 et seq. relating to Low Barrier Navigation Centers.

18.57.020 Definitions.

For purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply:

- A. "Coordinated entry system" means a centralized or coordinated assessment system developed pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Code of Federal regulations as specified in Government Code Section 65662, and any related requirements, designed to coordinate program participant intake, assessment, and referrals.
- B. "Low Barrier" means best practices to reduce barriers to entry, and may include, but is not limited to the following:
 - The presence of partners if it is not a population-specific site, such as for survivors of domestic violence or sexual assault, women, or youth;
 - 2. Pets:
 - 3. The storage of possessions; or
 - 4. Privacy, such as partitions around beds in a dormitory setting or in larger rooms containing more than two beds, or private rooms.
- C. "Low Barrier Navigation Center" means a Housing First, low-barrier, service-enriched shelter focused on moving people into permanent housing that provides temporary living facilities while case managers connect individuals experiencing homelessness to income, public benefits, health services, shelter, and housing.

18.57.030 Allowed Zones.

Low barrier navigation centers shall be allowed as an allowed use in the following zones provided they meet the requirements of Section 18.57.040:

- A. Mixed-Use Overlay Zone; and
- B. Commercial Residential Zone.

18.57.040 Requirements.

A low barrier navigation center shall meet the following requirements:

A. It offers services to connect people to permanent housing through a services plan that identifies services staffing.

- B. It is linked to a coordinated entry system, so that staff in the interim facility or staff who collocate in the facility may conduct assessments and provide services to connect people to permanent housing.
- C. It complies with Chapter 6.5 (commencing with Section 8255) of Division 8 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
- D. It has a system for entering information regarding client stays, client demographics, client income, and exit destination through the local Homeless Management Information System as defined by Section 578.3 of Title 24 of the Code of Federal Regulations.

18.57.050 Application Procedures.

- A. An application shall be submitted to the Planning Division of the Community Development Department.
- B. The City shall act within 60 days of receipt of a completed application.

18.57.060 Effective Date.

This Chapter shall remain in effect until January 1, 2027 and as of that date is repealed.

SECTION 2. CEQA.

The adoption of this Ordinance is exempt from CEQA under the common sense exemption set forth in CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) that CEQA does not apply where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the activity may have a significant effect on the environment. The Low Barrier Navigation Center provisions are set forth in State law. The adoption of this Ordinance simply implements what is already required by State law and the provisions apply even if the City fails to adopt an ordinance.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall take effect on the thirty-first day after passage.

SECTION 4. CERTIFICATION.

The City Clerk shall certify the passage of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be entered in the book of original ordinances of said City; shall make a minute passage and adoption thereof in the records of the meeting at which time the same is passed and adopted; and shall, within fifteen (15) days after the passage and adoption thereof, cause the same to be published as required by law, in a publication of general circulation.

ORDINANCE NO. 1824

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA APPROVING ZONE CHANGE #3-20 REZONING THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 1108 W. 141st STREET FROM MEDIUM (R-3) AND HIGH (R-4) DENSITY MULTIPLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL TO GENERAL COMMERCIAL (C-3) WITH A MIXED USE OVERLAY (MUO)

(ZC #3-20; APN: 6115-0155-023)

WHEREAS, on or about May 14, 2020, the applicant, Gardena LF, LLC, filed an application to change the land use designation and zoning on an approximate 4.5 acre parcel located at the northeast corner of Rosecrans and Budlong Avenues from Medium and High Density Residential to General Commercial with a Mixed-Use Overlay (GPA #4-20) and similarly change the zoning from Medium Density Multiple-Family Residential (R-3) and High Density Multiple-Family Residential (R-4) to General Commercial (C-3) with a Mixed Use Overlay (MUO) (ZC #3-20) (hereafter "the Flynt Project"); and

WHEREAS, a Mitigated Negative Declaration ("MND") was prepared for the Flynt Project and the draft MND was circulated for public review between October 12, 2020 and November 2, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2020, the Planning Commission of the City of Gardena held a duly noticed public hearing on the IS/MND and the approvals required for the Flynt Project at which time it considered all evidence, both written and oral; and

WHEREAS, at the close of the public hearing, the Planning Commission adopted Resolution No. PC 12-20 which recommended that the City Council approve the MND and adopt the Mitigation Monitoring and Reporting Program for the General Plan Amendment and Zone Change and approve the General Plan Amendment and Zone Change; and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2020, the City Council held a duly noticed public hearing on the Flynt Project at which time it considered all evidence, both written and oral; and

WHEREAS, after the close of the public hearing and prior to adopting this Resolution the City Council adopted Resolution No. 6486 approving the Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program for the General Plan Amendment and Zone Change and adopted Resolution No. 6487 amending the General Plan for this property to General Commercial.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. APPROVAL AND FINDINGS - ZONE CHANGE

A. Section 18.52.010 of the Gardena Municipal Code provides that the land use and zoning of property may be amended "[w]henever the public necessity, convenience, general welfare, or good land use and zoning practices require. . ." The City Council hereby approves the

zone change for the Property from High Density Multiple-Family Residential (R-4) to General Commercial (C-3) with a Mixed Use Overlay (MUO) as shown on Exhibit A, attached hereto.

- B. In taking this action, the City Council finds that the change is in the best interests of the general welfare and represents good land use planning practices, including, but not limited to the following reasons:
- 1. The property is located adjacent to the Lucky Lady Casino and provides an opportunity for a commercial development that would have synergy with the Casino, provide jobs and improve the City's tax base. This is consistent with Land Use Goal 2 and Economic Development Goal 1 which state as follows:
 - <u>LU Goal 2</u> Develop and preserve high quality commercial centers and clean industrial uses that benefit the City's tax base, create jobs and provide a full range of services to the residents and businesses.
 - ED Goal 1 Promote a growing and diverse business community that provides jobs, goods and services for the local and regional market, and maintains a sound tax base for the City.
- 2. The property is located in a High Quality Transit Area which will allow employees and users of a commercial development to take advantage of public transportation and reduce reliance on the use of private vehicles. This is consistent with State policies which encourage the use of alternative modes of transportation to reduce greenhouse gas impacts.
- 3. The property is subject to an economic assistance agreement which anticipated commercial development on the property allowing the City to provide funds to the Lucky Lady Casino from anticipated revenue. Allowing the change in land use will assist in fulfilling the economic assistance agreement. Development of the site for commercial purposes will provide the City with revenue to continue providing high-quality services to its residents.
- 4. The property is located along an arterial route where commercial development would be consistent with other development in the area.
- 5. Gardena currently has a jobs/housing imbalance in that there is more housing than jobs in the City. The change in use allows additional jobs to be created without actually impacting the availability of housing for the reasons set forth in Section 2 below.
- 6. By including a Mixed Use Overlay zone, the property may still be developed for residential development if the opportunity arises.
- C. Any development built on this property shall be subject to the Mitigation Measures adopted by Resolution No. 6486 as well as the following conditions of approval:
- * COA CUL-1 If previously unidentified cultural resources are encountered during ground disturbing activities, construction activities shall cease in the immediate vicinity and

construction activities shall be diverted away from the find (50-foot buffer around the find) and a qualified archaeologist who meets the Secretary of the Interior's Professional Qualification Standards for archaeology, shall be contacted immediately to evaluate the find. If the discovery proves to be significant under CEQA, the treatment plan established for the resources shall be in accordance with CEQA Guidelines Section 15064.5(f) for historical resources and PRC Sections 21083.2(b) for unique archaeological resources. Preservation in place (i.e., avoidance) is the preferred manner of treatment. If preservation in place is not feasible, treatment may include implementation of archaeological data recovery excavations to remove the resource along with subsequent laboratory processing and analysis. Any historic archaeological material shall be curated at a public, non-profit institution with a research interest in the materials, such as the Natural History Museum of Los Angeles County or the Fowler Museum, if such an institution agrees to accept the material. If no institution accepts the archaeological material, it shall be offered to a local school or historical society in the area for educational purposes. In the event that an identified cultural resource is of Native American origin, the qualified archaeologist shall consult with the Project owner and City of Gardena to implement Native American consultation procedures.

- * COA GEO-1: Prior to commencement of ground-disturbing activities a qualified vertebrate paleontologist (as defined by the Society for vertebrate Paleontology) shall develop Worker Awareness and Environmental Program (WEAP) Training for construction personnel. This training shall be presented to construction personnel and include what fossil remains may be found within the Project area and policies and procedures that must be followed in case of a discovery. Verification of the WEAP Training shall be provided to the Gardena Community Development Department.
- * COA GEO-2: If fossils or fossil bearing deposits are encountered during ground-disturbing activities, work within a 25-foot radius of the find shall halt and a professional vertebrate paleontologist (as defined by the Society for Vertebrate Paleontology) shall be contacted immediately to evaluate the find. The paleontologist shall have the authority to stop or divert construction, as necessary. Documentation and treatment of the discovery shall occur in accordance with Society of Vertebrate Paleontology standards. The significance of the find shall be evaluated pursuant to the State CEQA Guidelines. If the discovery proves to be significant, before construction activities resume at the location of the find, additional work such as data recovery excavation may be warranted, as deemed necessary by the paleontologist.
- * COA N-1: Prior to approval of grading plans and/or prior to issuance of demolition, grading, and building permits, the following noise reduction techniques shall be included in the construction plans or specifications:
 - Construction contracts specify that all construction equipment, fixed or mobile, shall be equipped with properly operating and maintained mufflers and other state required noise attenuation devices.

- The Project Applicant shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the City's Building Official that construction noise reduction methods shall be used where feasible, including shutting off idling equipment.
- During construction, equipment staging areas shall be located such that the greatest distance is between the staging area noise sources and noise-sensitive receptors.
- Per Gardena Municipal Code Section 8.36.080, construction activities shall not occur during the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on weekdays; between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Saturday; or any time on Sunday or a Federal holiday.

These mitigation measures and conditions are in addition to any other measures or conditions that may be imposed upon development of the Property.

SECTION 2. NO NET LOSS

- A. Government Code section 66300 was recently enacted to provide that a city may only change a land use designation or zoning ordinance to a less intensive residential use if it concurrently makes changes to other parcels within the city to ensure there is no net loss in residential capacity.
- B. The subject property is immediately adjacent to the Lucky Lady Casino and a portion of the property is needed for Casino parking. There is a conditional use permit on the property for parking purposes.
- C. Because of the parking need, the applicant is only planning on developing approximately 2.0 acres of the property, as evidenced by the Offering Memorandum of the applicant. During the past several years, the City has developed a number of properties on R-4 and Mixed-Use Overlay zones that both allow up to 30 units per acre on parcels which are at least one-acre in size; however, the density that has been achieved by these projects has not been above 25 units per acre and most projects have been developed at approximately 21 units per acre. Based on existing development patterns, the developable portion of the subject property would have yielded approximately 50 units and development of the entire property would have yielded approximately 108 units.
- D. At the same time that the City was processing the Flynt Project to change the General Plan Amendment and zoning on this site, the City was also processing an application from Melia Homes, Inc. for a General Plan Amendment and zone change, as well as other administrative entitlements to develop 4.23 acres on South Vermont Avenue in the City for an 84-unit condominium project. The Melia Evergreen Residential Project involved a General Plan Amendment and Zone Change re-designating the property from commercial to residential land uses. The City Council held a public hearing on the Melia Evergreen Residential Project on November 10, 2020, adopted Resolution No. 6480 changing the General Plan designation from General Commercial to High Density Residential that same night, and adopted Ordinance No. 1822 changing the zoning of the property from General Commercial (C-3) to High Density Residential (R-4) prior to adopting this Resolution on December 15, 2020.

E. Additionally, at the same time the City was also processing this Project to change the General Plan Amendment and zoning on this site, the City was also processing an application from The Olson Company for a General Plan Amendment and zone change, as well as other administrative approvals to develop 2.02 acres on West 141st Street with a 50-unit condominium project. The Olson project involved a General Plan Amendment and Zone Change re-designating the property to higher density residential uses. The City Council held a public hearing on the Olson Homes project on November 10, 2020, adopted Resolution No. 6482 changing the General Plan designation from Low and Medium Residential to High Density Residential that same night, and adopted Ordinance No. 1823 changing the zoning of the property from Low (R-1) and Medium Density Residential (R-3) to High Density Multiple-Family Residential (R-4) prior to adopting this Resolution on December 15, 2020. The changes allowed an additional 36 units to be built on the property over the previous land use designation and zoning.

F. Based on the above, the City Council finds:

- 1. Only 2.0 of the 4.59 acre parcel could be developed for housing and the subject property would have yielded development of 50 homes;
 - 2. The Melia Homes project constitutes a concurrent change which ensures that there is no net loss in residential capacity; and
 - 3. Even if all 4.59 acres could be developed for housing, the Melia Homes project and The Olson Company project constitute concurrent changes which ensures that there is no net loss in residential capacity.

SECTION 3. RECORD

Each and every one of the findings and determinations in this Resolution are based on the competent and substantial evidence, both oral and written, contained in the entire record relating to the Project. All summaries of information in the findings which precede this section are based on the entire record. The absence of any particular fact from any such summary is not an indication that a particular finding is not based in part on that fact.

SECTION 4. CUSTODIAN OF RECORD

The Custodian of Record for the proceedings relating to the Project, including the MND and MMRP, is Raymond Barragan, Acting Community Development Director, City of Gardena, 1700 W. 162nd Street, Gardena, California 90247. SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect on the thirty-first day after passage.

SECTION 6. NOTICE OF DETERMINATION

Staff is hereby directed to file a Notice of Determination of the approvals granted herein with the County Recorder's office within five working days from the date of approval.

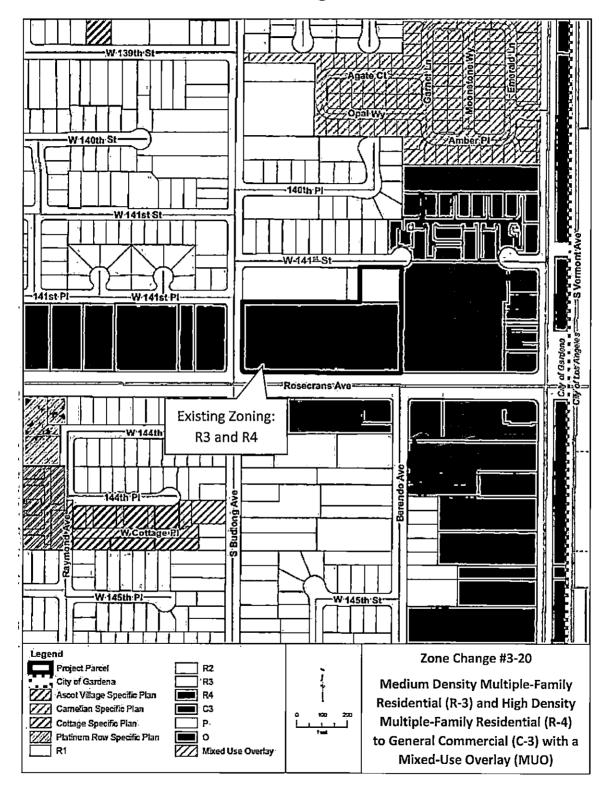

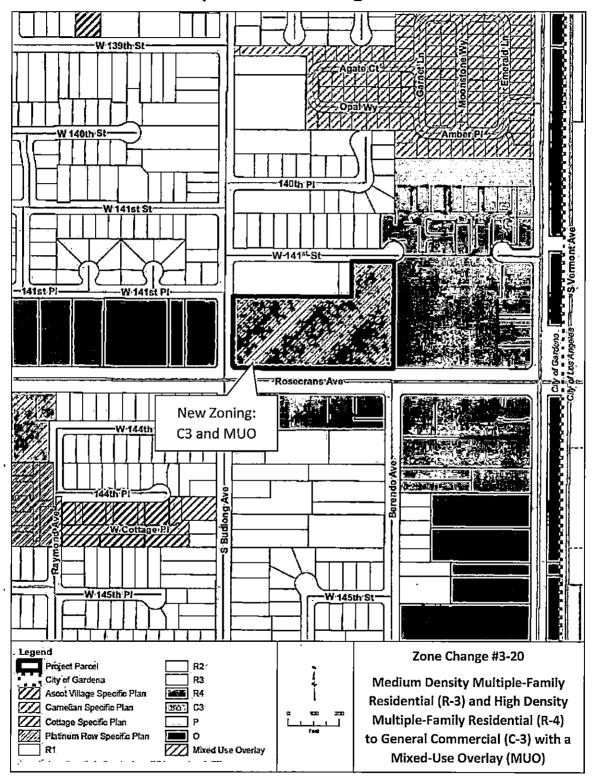
Exhibit 1 - Zone Change Map

This Resolution establishes an annual regulatory fee to be paid by each fireworks wholesaler of distributor providing "Safe and Sane" fireworks to this year's approved non-profit organizations. A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, ESTABLISHING REGULATORY FEES FOR WHOLESALERS OR DISTRIBUTORS OF FIREWORKS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 8.16.115 OF THE GARDENA MUNICIPAL CODE FOR CALENDAR YEAR 2021

WHEREAS, Chapter 8.16 of the Gardena Municipal Code authorizes the licensing and regulation of fireworks within the City of Gardena, and;

WHEREAS, Section 8.16.115 specifically authorizes the City Council to establish an annual regulatory fee to be paid by each fireworks wholesaler or distributor providing Safe and Sane fireworks.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY FIND, DETERMINE, AND RESOLVE, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. ANNUAL REGULATORY FEE. The annual regulatory fee for wholesalers or distributors of fireworks in the City of Gardena shall be Eight Thousand Dollars (\$8,000) for the current Calendar Year 2021. Said fee shall be apportioned to each wholesaler or distributor in accordance with Section 8.16.115

SECTION 2. PAYMENT OF REGULATORY FEE. Said regulatory fee shall be paid by, and only by, a wholesaler or distributor, as provided in Section 8.16.115.A. Each wholesaler or distributor shall submit to the City information, as reasonably requested by City, to evidence compliance with this provision.

SECTION 3. EFFECT. That this Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption by the City Council.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution; shall cause the same to be entered among the original Resolutions of said City; and shall make a minute of the passage and adoption thereof in the records of the proceedings of the City Council of said City in the minutes of the meeting at which the same is passed and adopted.

RECOMMENDATION AND STAFF SUMMARY:

Staff respectfully recommends that the City Council conduct a public hearing, receive testimony from the public and adopt Resolution No. 6493.

On August 19, 2020, G3 Urban Inc., the applicant, submitted an application for a Site Plan Review and a Vesting Tentative Tract Map to develop 53 residential units, including three live work units, in ten buildings located at 2500 Rosecrans Avenue, comprising of 2.35 gross acres (the "Project"). The Project was reduced to 52 units in order to comply with the requirements of the Los Angeles County Fire Department for a proper fire access driveway within the entrance of the development.

On December 1, 2020, the Planning Commission held a public hearing at which time there were no comments made from the public, after which the Commission voted 5-0-0 to adopt Resolution No. PC 13-20 approving the Project and directing staff to file a notice of exemption.

On December 9, 2020, Council Member Francis timely called for review of the Project.

The complete Planning Commission Packet dated December 1, 2020, along with the presentation made by the applicant at the Planning Commission meeting are attached for further information regarding the project.

The City's environmental consultant, Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc, conducted a CEQA compliance review for the subject project and presented those findings in a technical memorandum along with technical assessments that determined the project is categorically exempt from the provisions of CEQA pursuant to Guidelines Section 15332, as an In-fill Development project. A subsequent memorandum was completed showing that the Project still qualifies for a categorical exemption under CEQA with the reduction in units and other modification made after the assessment was completed.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, APPROVING SITE PLAN REVIEW #5-20 AND VESTING TENTATIVE TRACT MAP #4-20 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF 52 NEW RESIDENTIAL CONDOMINIUM UNITS IN THE GENERAL COMMERCIAL AND MIXED-USE OVERLAY (C-3/MUO) ZONE PER SECTION 18.44.010.A AND CHAPTER 17.08 OF THE GARDENA MUNICIPAL CODE, AND DIRECTION TO STAFF TO FILE A NOTICE OF EXEMPTION FOLLOWING A CALL FOR REVIEW

(2500 WEST ROSECRANS AVENUE) (APN: 4064-003-028, 040)

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GARDENA, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. RECITALS

- A. On August 19, 2020, G3 Urban Inc., the applicant, submitted an application for a Site Plan Review and a Vesting Tentative Tract Map to develop 53 residential units, including three live work units, in ten buildings located at 2500 Rosecrans Avenue, comprising of 2.35 gross acres (the "Property");
- B. The project was reduced to 52 units in order to comply with the requirements of the Los Angeles County Fire Department for a proper fire access driveway within the entrance of the development. The actions required include approving a site plan review for the development and a tentative tract map for the subdivision (collectively the "Project");
- C. The project site has a General Plan land use designation of General Commercial and Mixed Use Overlay and the zoning is General Commercial (C-3) and Mixed-Use Overlay (MUO);
- D. The subject property is bounded by a vacant bank facility and convalescent hospital (C-P/MUO) to the north across Rosecrans Avenue, a carwash facility (C-3) to the east, and single-family homes (R-1) to the west and south of the project site;
- E. On November 5, 2020, a public hearing was duly noticed for the Planning and Environmental Quality Commission meeting for November 17, 2020;
- F. On November 17, 2020 the Planning Commission opened and continued the public hearing to December 1, 2020;
- G. On December 1, 2020 the Planning Commission held the public hearing at which time it considered all material and evidence, whether written or oral, after which it adopted Resolution No. PC 13-20 approving the Project and directing staff to file a notice of exemption;
- H. On December 9, 2020 Council Member Francis timely called for review of the Project;

- I. On December 31, 2020, a public hearing was duly noticed for the City Council meeting of January 12, 2021;
- J. On January 12, 2021, the City Council held a duly noticed public hearing on the Project;
- K. In making the various findings set forth herein, the City Council has considered all of the evidence presented by staff, the applicant, and the public, whether written or oral, and has considered the procedures and the standards required by the Gardena Municipal Code. The record of these proceedings can be found at the Community Development Department, Room 101, 1700 West 162nd Street, Gardena, California. The Director of Community Development is the custodian of such record.

SECTION 2. SITE PLAN REVIEW

Site Plan Review (#5-20) for the construction of 52 new townhomes, is hereby approved based on the following findings and subject to the conditions attached hereto as Exhibit A. The plans being approved are dated October 7, 2020, and attached hereto as Exhibit B, as the same may be modified by the conditions of approval.

A. The proposed development, including the uses and physical design, is consistent with the intent and general purpose of the general plan and provisions of the municipal code.

The General Plan land use designation for the subject property is Commercial and Mixed-Use Overlay and the zoning is General Commercial/Parking/Mixed Use Overlay (C-3/P/MUO). The General Commercial land use designation is intended for commercial uses such as regional retail, automobile dealerships, supermarkets, junior department stores, financial centers, professional offices, restaurants, and other commercial uses oriented to the traveling public. As shown in the staff report, which is incorporated by reference, the site plan meets or exceeds all development standards of the MUO zoning code.

Additionally, the Mixed-Use Overlay permits residential development on selected areas designated for Commercial and Industrial land uses. The purpose of this land use designation is to allow greater flexibility of development alternatives, especially attractive higher density residential development in appropriate areas that are experiencing both physical and economic blight. As explained in the staff report which is incorporated by reference, allowing the development of the 52-unit residential with live-work project on an underutilized site would be consistent with various goals and policies of the General Plan including the following: LU Policy 1.2, LU Policy 1.4, LU Policy 1.5, LU Policy 1.9, LU Policy 1.10, LU Policy 1.12, DS Goal 2, DS Policy 2.2, DS Policy 2.3, DS Policy 2.7, DS Policy 2.9, DS Policy 2.10, DS Policy 3.2, DS Policy 3.5, Housing Plan Goal 1, Housing Plan Goal 4, Housing Policy 4.1, and Housing Policy 4.4.

• The project site consolidates two parcels which are vacant and underutilized commercial parcels with a mixed-use overlay. The project will create a new 52-unit residential condominium project with a variety of floor plans for the townhomes and live-work units. The buildings are well-articulated and incorporate a variety of building materials, textures, and colors. Except for the live-work units

which will be open to the public, the other housing will be gated.

The project provides common open space in the form of lush, landscaped paseos and private open space in the form of second story covered decks. Various plants and shrubbery will be placed in the front yard setback that fronts Rosecrans Avenue enhancing the overall public view of not only the subject property, but the overall neighborhood.

The project adds 52 single-family attached residences to the City's overall housing stock. The residential development creates an attractive living environment for prospective homebuyers in this area of Gardena.

B. The proposed development will not adversely affect the orderly and harmonious development of the area and the general welfare of the city.

As set forth above and in the staff report, which is incorporated by reference, the proposed site plan meets all of the development requirements, and the proposal, as conditioned, will be compatible with, and not detrimental to, the surrounding land uses and general welfare of the City.

- C. The Project complies with all applicable development standards of the MUO zone as set forth in the staff report and the design criteria of the Gardena Municipal Code Section 18.42.095.
 - Scale and Massing. The general perception of the size and volume of a building shall be compatible with and not more massive than that of surrounding buildings. Multiple massing, front facing and varied facade detailing are methods that can be used to reduce the scale of two-story homes.

The MUO zone allows for a maximum height of 40-feet, with an additional five feet allowed for architectural projections and shall consist of no more than four stories. The proposed structures are all three-stories that are 36 feet and four-inches in height. The proposed project consists of a contemporary architectural theme consisting of various roof pitches and changes in plane that assists in the scaling and massing of the proposed structures. The general perception of the size and volume of the buildings is compatible with that of the surrounding neighborhood, and varied façade helps to decrease the massing of the buildings.

• Street-Facing Entries. Homes and multi-unit dwellings shall have primary entrances and doorways oriented toward the street, rather than away from the street, to the greatest extent feasible.

The project also includes three (3) three-story, 2,010 square feet live-work townhome units fronting Rosecrans Avenue. Each live-work unit contains 320 square feet of ground-floor workspace with doorways oriented toward the street. Pedestrian and patron entrance into the development is provided by a private walkway along the Rosecrans Avenue.

• Architectural Detailing. Structures and walls and rooflines of structures shall contain a variety of distinct parts, architectural elements and surface treatments.

The proposed project consists of a modern architectural theme with decorative materials such as masonry veneer, stucco, faux wood tile, foam trim, and wooden posts/beams. Other distinct parts of the architecture include variation in planes, various roof pitches, and projected second-story decks.

Rooflines. The rooflines provide a finishing visual detail for the residential structure. Varied rooflines reduce the scale of development. Single massing and box-like structures with minimal facade articulation shall be prohibited.

The Project provides various roof pitches on all sides of all ten buildings with substantial amount of articulation.

• Garages, Driveways and Parking. The structures and paved surfaces devoted to cars have a major impact on the visual quality of the neighborhood and shall not dominate, detract from the architectural details or divide the visual impact of the site.

The parking structures are attached to each unit and are architecturally compatible. The driveway of the Project will have a newly paved driveway that will include colored pavers in the entrance that will enhance the Property and the overall aesthetics of the residential neighborhood.

• Walls and Fences. While they can provide privacy and a perception of security, walls and fences affect the visual quality of the neighborhood. Walls and fences visible from the street shall be compatible with the finish material and architecture of the structures and softened with landscape treatment placed at the base of or grown on the face of the wall or fence.

The development includes an eight-foot high decorative block wall along the west and south property lines, and a six-foot high block wall along the remaining side perimeters. There are two metal vehicular gates provide access to the 49 residential townhomes within the development. Pedestrian access to the townhome development is provided by three- and one-half-foot metal gates located to the side of the vehicular gates.

• Materials, Color and Texture. The pattern of colors, materials and surface treatment of structures affect not only the image of the buildings, but also the overall identity of the neighborhood. Selection of materials, color and surface treatment shall be compatible with architectural style of the structures. Neutral colors with the use of appropriate accent colors are the easiest to maintain and are preferred.

The proposed project consists of a modern architectural with a light neutral color palette. The buildings include a variety of finishing materials such as masonry veneer, stucco, faux wood tile, foam trim, and wooden posts/beams.

SECTION 3. VESTING TENTATIVE TRACT MAP NO. 83182 (VTTM #4-20)

Vesting Tentative Tract Map No. 83182, as shown on Exhibit C, creating 52 condominium lots is hereby approved, subject to the conditions of approval attached as Exhibit A based on the fact that none of the findings which would prohibit the approval of a map are present and the map satisfies all of the requirements of the Gardena Municipal Code Chapter 17.08 and Government Code Sections 66474, 66473.1, and 66473.5.

A. The map and design and improvement of the proposed subdivision is consistent with applicable general and specific plan (Government Code § 66474; § 66473.5).

The Land Use Plan and the zoning map currently designate the project site as General Commercial; Mixed Use Overlay (C-3/MUO), respectively. The proposed project will involve 52 townhomes, three of which are live-work units fronting Rosecrans Avenue and will be consistent with the following goals and policies of the General Plan as set forth in the staff report: LU Policy 1.2, LU Policy 1.4, LU Policy 1.5, LU Policy 1.9, LU Policy 1.10, LU Policy 1.12, DS Goal 2, DS Policy 2.2, DS Policy 2.3, DS Policy 2.7, DS Policy 2.9, DS Policy 2.10, DS Policy 3.2, and DS Policy 3.5. There are no applicable Specific Plans.

The City's Housing Element identifies various goals and policies that will set the stage for new opportunities for housing. Housing Plan Goal 4 provides for adequate residential sites through appropriate land use and zoning to accommodate the City's share of regional housing needs. Policies for Goal 4 include implementing land use policies that allow for a range of residential densities (Policy 4.1) and encourage development at maximum attainable densities (Policy 4.4). The proposed project will provide a density of 22.1 dwelling units per acre. Therefore, the project will be consistent with the City's General Plan Land Use Plan and Housing Element Plan and meets the minimum requirements of the MUO zone.

B. The site is physically suitable for the type or density of development (Government Code § 66474).

The site is 2.35 gross acres and is essentially flat. The subject parcel can accommodate the 52 units within the various proposed buildings and the development adheres to the Gardena Municipal Code standards.

C. The design of the subdivision and the proposed improvements will not cause serious public health problems, substantial environmental damage or substantially and avoidably injure fish or wildlife or their habitat (Government Code § 66474).

The property was previously a vacant parcel and another parcel was developed with a standalone restaurant building and is currently vacant. There is no substantial natural

environment, fish, or wildlife in the area which will be harmed by the proposed project. Furthermore, the subdivision has been designed to provide adequate access for pedestrians and vehicles, guests and residents, and emergency access. The townhomes, including livework units are a mixed-use development in a commercial area and adjacent to a residential zone and are not expected to create environmental damage or public health problems.

D. The design of the subdivision or type of improvements will not conflict with public access easements (Government Code § 66474).

The subdivision was designed so as not to interfere with all existing public access easements including for road, highway and alley improvements, storm drain and an easement for underground telegraphing communication equipment. The applicant is proposing two additional public access easements to the gated 49 townhome units for ingress and egress of emergency and public service vehicles. Additionally, the project includes an easement for the new public utilities. The applicant is also proposing a 10-foot private easement with the abutting commercial property. The property owner to the north of the condominium units (buildings 6 - 10) is granting a 10-foot easement to provide for walkways and setbacks which is considered part of the project site. This is a private easement and will not interfere with any existing or new public access easements.

E. The design of the subdivision provides for, to the extent feasible, future passive or natural heating and cooling opportunities (Government Code § 66473.1).

During winter, a north/south alignment of parcels provides for southern exposure to the winter path of the sun. During the summer, prevailing winds are west southwest from the north (Los Angeles International Airport) and west from the south (Torrance Airport). The general direction of these prevailing winds can be expected to allow the development to benefit from natural and passive cooling opportunities in the summer. The buildings all have solar power. Therefore, the design of the proposed subdivision provides for the configuration structures to provide for future passive or natural heating and cooling opportunities.

There are no grounds upon which to deny the map. Therefore, with the conditions of approval, the subdivision and subdivision design will be consistent with the General Plan and State Subdivision Map Act as supplemented by Title 17 of the Gardena Municipal Code.

SECTION 4. HOUSING ACCOUNTABILITY ACT

The City Council further finds that under on Government Code section 65589.5, known as the Housing Accountability Act, the Council may not deny the project as it complies with all applicable development standards and findings cannot be made to deny the project.

A. Government Code section 65589.5(b) provides: It is the policy of the state that a local government not reject or make infeasible housing development projects, including emergency shelters, that contribute to meeting the need determined pursuant to this article without a thorough analysis of the economic, social, and environmental effects of the action and without complying with subdivision (d).

- B. Government Code section 65589.5(j) provides: When a proposed housing development project complies with applicable, objective general plan, zoning, and subdivision standards and criteria, including design review standards, in effect at the time that the application was deemed complete, but the local agency proposes to disapprove the project or to impose a condition that the project be developed at a lower density, the local agency shall base its decision regarding the proposed housing development project upon written findings supported by a preponderance of the evidence on the record that both of the following conditions exist:
 - [1] The housing development project would have a specific, adverse impact upon the public health or safety unless the project is disapproved or approved upon the condition that the project be developed at a lower density. As used in this paragraph, a "specific, adverse impact" means a significant, quantifiable, direct, and unavoidable impact, based on objective, identified written public health or safety standards, policies, or conditions as they existed on the date the application was deemed complete.
 - [2] There is no feasible method to satisfactorily mitigate or avoid the adverse impact identified pursuant to paragraph (1), other than the disapproval of the housing development project or the approval of the project upon the condition that it be developed at a lower density.

SECTION 5. CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT

A. The proposed project is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Guidelines Section 15332, in-fill development. The project is consistent with the applicable general plan and zoning designations of Mixed-Use Overlay. The project occurs within the City boundaries on a site of less than 5 acres which is surrounded by urban uses; had no value as habitat for endangered, rare or threatened species; and can adequately be served by all required utilities and public services. Further, approval will not result in any significant effects for traffic, noise, air or water. The City's environmental consultant, Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc, conducted a CEQA compliance review for the subject project and presented those findings in a technical memorandum along with technical assessments for transportation, noise, and air quality. The assessments completed by Kimley-Horn and Associates determined that there were no significant impacts or less than significant impacts with regard to traffic, noise, and air. In regard to water quality, the applicant will be subject to the requirements of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) and Gardena Municipal Code Chapter 8.70 regarding Stormwater and Runoff Pollution control. Additionally, a Preliminary Hydrology Study and Preliminary Low Impact Development (LID) Report have been prepared for the project. The LID report is a stormwater management strategy that seeks to mitigate the impacts of increases in runoff and stormwater pollution as close to its source as possible. The report comprises a set of site design approaches and Best Management Practices (BMPs) that promote the use of natural systems for infiltration, evapotranspiration, and use of stormwater. Compliance with NPDES and Gardena Municipal Code requirements which require the implementation of LID BMPs, the project would not violate any water quality standards. Kimley-Horn has indicated that the change

in the Project from 53 units to 52 units does not impact any of the conclusions set forth in its Technical Memo as the studies and analysis looked at a more intense project, by one unit. Therefore, the project qualifies for a categorical exemption under Class 32, for in-fill development.

- B. The project is not subject to any of the exceptions for exemption under Section 15300.2 of the California Environmental Quality Act. The cumulative impact of this project, and the approval of other projects like it in the vicinity, is not expected to have any significant environmental impact; this project is for the addition of 52 single-family homes in an area of the City which has a General Plan and zoning designation for this type of use. The proposed Project is not expected to have a significant effect on the environment due to unusual circumstances as justified by the assessment completed by the environmental consultant. The project is not located along any state designated scenic highway nor within any designated hazardous waste site. There are no historical resources which would be impacted. Therefore, the project is categorically exempt from CEQA.
- C. Staff is hereby directed to file a Notice of Exemption.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Resolution shall be effective immediately.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL FOR ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT #10-20; SITE PLAN REVIEW #5-20; VESTING TENTATATIVE TRACT MAP NO. 83182 (#4-20)

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- GC 1. The applicant accepts all of the conditions of approval set forth in this document and shall sign the acknowledgement. A copy of the signed document shall be submitted to the Community Development Department prior to issuance of any construction permit.
- GC 2. Development of this site shall comply with the requirements and regulations of Title 15 (Building and Construction), Title 17 (Subdivisions) and Title 18 (Zoning) of the Gardena Municipal Code.
- GC 3. The applicant shall comply with all written policies, resolutions, ordinances, and all applicable laws in effect at time of approval. The conditions of approval shall supersede all conflicting notations, specifications, and dimensions which may be shown on the project development plans.
- GC 4. The applicant shall provide the City with a copy of the Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (CC&Rs) which shall apply to the townhomes for review and approval prior to approval of the final map or issuance of a certificate of occupancy, not including model homes. The CC&Rs shall include all items listed in these conditions which are required to be included in the CC&Rs or items for which the HOA is responsible. At a minimum, the following provisions shall be included, as may be further detailed by these conditions. The failure to include a condition on the list below does not relieve the responsibility to include it in the CC&Rs if otherwise provided herein:
 - a. Any revisions to the CC&Rs shall require prior city approval (PL 5).
 - b. All landscaping to be kept in a healthy and well-kept manner (PL 4).
 - c. Maintenance and repair obligations of all private streets/driveways (BS 12).
 - d. Maintenance and repair obligations of all open spaces and Common Area.
 - e. The Security Gates shall be maintained, in good condition (BS 17).
 - f. Prohibition against outdoor storage.
 - g. Prohibition against alterations to architectural treatments (PL 7).
 - h. All garage spaces shall be maintained in such a manner as to be able to be used for parking of two cars.
 - i. Prohibition against parking in driveway areas and in front of garages.
 - j. A requirement that trash cans shall be kept in the garage or out of public view, except for pick up.
 - k. Residents' vehicles shall be stored in the garages at all times while on the site.

- 1. Residents shall not be allowed to use Guest Parking for their own vehicles.
- m. The entire site, all walls and fencing, and all building walls shall be maintained at all times free and clear of litter, rubbish, debris, weeds, and graffiti. Graffiti shall be removed within 24 hours and if paint is used to cover the graffiti, it shall be of the same color and texture as the building wall.

When the draft is provided to the City for review, it shall be accompanied by a table specifying where each of the above conditions can be found.

- GC 5. Prior to commencement of work, the contractor/developer shall schedule a pre-job meeting with the City's engineering and building inspectors to minimize construction noise levels, including sound-reduction equipment as deemed necessary by the City. Prior to the issuance of demolition or construction permits, the contractor/developer shall prepare and implement a construction management plan, approved by the City, which includes procedures to minimize off-site transportation of heavy construction equipment.
- GC 6. The site layout and physical appearance of the structures shall be in accordance with the plans dated October 7, 2020, presented to and approved by the Planning and Environmental Quality Commission and modified by these conditions of approval. The final completed project shall be in substantial compliance with the plans upon which the Commission based its decision, as modified by such decision. Minor modifications or alterations to the design, style, colors, and materials shall be subject to the review and approval of the Community Development Director. Substantial modifications will require review and approval by the Planning Commission.
- GC 7. Grading and construction activities on the project site shall adhere to the requirements of Chapter 8.36 of the Gardena Municipal Code, which limits construction activities to the hours of 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday, and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturdays. Construction activities on Sundays and Federal holidays are strictly prohibited.
- GC 8. Trash pick-up and other exterior facility cleaning activities shall be restricted to the hours of 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. These activities shall be prohibited during peak traffic hours.
- GC 9. Any and all roof-mounted equipment, devices or materials shall be totally screened from public view. The screen enclosures shall be constructed of the same or similar materials, colors, and texture of the building.
- GC 10. The applicant shall reimburse the City for all attorney's fees spent in processing the project application, including review of all documents required by these conditions of approval.

GC 11. The applicant/developer shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City, its agents, officers, and employees from any claim, action, or proceeding, damages, costs (including, without limitation, attorney's fees), injuries, or liability against the City or its agents, officers, or employees arising out of the City's approval of Environmental Assessment #10-20, Site Plan Review #5-20, Vesting Tentative Tract Map #4-20 (VTTM No. 83182), and the subsequent Notice of Exemption. The City shall promptly notify the applicant/developer of any claim, action, or proceeding and the City shall cooperate fully in the defense. If the City fails to promptly notify the applicant/developer of any claim, action, or proceeding, or if the City fails to cooperate fully in the defense, the applicant/developer shall not thereafter be responsible to defend, indemnify, or hold harmless the City. Although the applicant/developer is the real party in interest in an action, the City may, at its sole discretion, participate in the defense of any action with the attorneys of its own choosing, but such participation shall not relieve the applicant/developer of any obligation under this condition, including the payment of attorney's fees.

Residential Development

RD 1. Applicant shall pay a multiple-unit residential development impact fee of \$1,000/unit for a total of \$52,000 prior to building permit issuance. California Government Section 66020(d)(1) requires that the project applicant be notified of all fees, dedications, reservations and other exactions imposed on the development for purposes of defraying all or a portion of the cost of public facilities related to development. Fees for regulatory approvals, including Planning processing fees, building permit fees and park development fees, are not included under this noticing requirement. The applicant has ninety (90) days from the date of adoption of this Resolution to protest the impositions described above. The applicant is also notified of the 180-day period from the date of this notice during which time any suit to protest impositions must be filed, and that timely filing of a protest within the 90-day period is a prerequisite.

PLANNING

- PL1. The approvals granted herein shall be utilized within a period not to exceed twelve (12) months from the date of approval unless an extension is granted in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Gardena Municipal Code. Utilization shall mean the issuance of building permits.
- PL2. The approved Resolution, including the Conditions of Approval contained herein and the signed acknowledgement of acceptance, shall be copied in their entirety and placed directly onto a separate plan sheet behind the cover sheet of the development plans prior to Building

- and Safety plan check submittal. Said copies shall be included in all development plan submittals, including revisions and the final working drawings.
- PL3. A security and lighting plan shall be submitted for review and approval by the Community Development Director or designee prior to issuance of a building permit that shows surveillance camera locations and outdoor lighting for all public/common areas. The lighting plan shall meet the requirements of GMC Section 18.42.150. All light fixtures shall be designed and located in a manner that does not allow spillover onto adjacent properties. Additionally, the exterior lighting fixtures shall be architecturally consistent with the design of the building, as reviewed and approved by the Community Development Director or designee.
- PL4. The CC&Rs shall provide that the homeowner's association shall maintain landscaping in a healthy and well-kept manner at all times. Dead or damaged landscape material/vegetation shall be replaced immediately per the approved landscape plan. The irrigation system shall be maintained at all times. Trees shall be permitted to grow to their maximum height, excluding normal trimmings.
- PL5. Any revisions to the CC&Rs shall require prior city approval.
- PL6. The CC&Rs shall contain a prohibition against modifying the colors and materials of any unit without approval by the Community Development Director.
- PL7. All motorized equipment used in construction shall be equipped with functioning mufflers as mandated by the State.
- PL8. The applicant shall pay school impact fees to the Los Angeles Unified School District and provide proof of payment prior to issuance of building permits.
- PL9. Any signage shall comply with the provisions of Chapter 18.58 of the Gardena Municipal Code.
- PL10. Decorative colored concrete shall be provided at the main vehicular entrance along Rosecrans Avenue and at the vehicular gate to the satisfaction of the Planning Division. Plans shall be revised to show this prior to issuance of a building permit.
- PL11. The applicant shall submit a Final Geotechnical Investigation for City review/approval and comply with its recommendations and any revisions deemed necessary by the City's Building Official. The Gardena Building Services Division will review construction plans to verify compliance with standard engineering practices, the GMC/CBSC, and the Geotechnical Investigation's recommendations.
- PL12. Prior to demolition activities, an asbestos survey shall be conducted by an Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) and California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) certified building inspector to determine the presence or absence of

asbestos containing-materials (ACMs). The sampling method to be used shall be based on the statistical probability that construction materials similar in color and texture contain similar amounts of asbestos. In areas where the material appears to be homogeneous in color and texture over a wide area, bulk samples shall be collected at discrete locations from within these areas. In unique or nonhomogeneous areas, discrete samples of potential ACMs shall be collected. The survey shall identify the likelihood that asbestos is present in concentrations greater than 1 percent in construction materials. If ACMs are located, abatement of asbestos shall be completed prior to any activities that would disturb ACMs or create an airborne asbestos hazard.

Asbestos removal shall be performed by a State certified asbestos containment contractor in accordance with the South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) Rule 1403. Common asbestos abatement techniques involve removal, encapsulation, or enclosure. The removal of asbestos is preferred when the material is in poor physical condition and there is sufficient space for the removal technique. The encapsulation of asbestos is preferred when the material has sufficient resistance to ripping, has a hard or sealed surface, or is difficult to reach. The enclosure of asbestos is to be applied when the material is in perfect physical condition, or if the material cannot be removed from the site for reasons of protection against fire, heat, or noise.

PL13. If paint is separated from building materials (chemically or physically) during demolition of the structures, the paint waste shall be evaluated independently from the building material by a qualified Environmental Professional. A portable, field X-ray fluorescence (XRF) analyzer shall be used to identify the locations of potential lead paint, and test accessible painted surfaces. The qualified Environmental Professional shall identify the likelihood that lead is present in concentrations greater than 1.0 milligrams per square centimeter (mg/cm2) in/on readily accessible painted surfaces of the buildings.

If lead-based paint is found, abatement shall be completed by a qualified Lead Specialist prior to any activities that would create lead dust or fume hazard. Potential methods to reduce lead dust and waste during removal include wet scraping, wet planning, use of electric heat guns, chemical stripping, and use of local High Efficiency Particulate Air (HEPA) exhaust systems. Lead-based paint removal and disposal shall be performed in accordance with California Code of Regulation Title 8, Section 1532.1, which specifies exposure limits, exposure monitoring and respiratory protection, and mandates good worker practices by workers exposed to lead. Contractors performing lead-based paint removal shall provide evidence of abatement activities to the City Engineer.

PL14. Prior to commencement of ground-disturbing activities a qualified vertebrate paleontologist (as defined by the Society for Vertebrate Paleontology) shall develop Worker Awareness and Environmental Program (WEAP) Training for construction

personnel. This training shall be presented to construction personnel and include what fossil remains may be found within the Project area and policies and procedures that must be followed in case of a discovery. Verification of the WEAP Training shall be provided to the Gardena Community Development Department.

- PL15. If fossils or fossil bearing deposits are encountered during ground-disturbing activities, work within a 25-foot radius of the find shall halt and a professional vertebrate paleontologist (as defined by the Society for Vertebrate Paleontology) shall be contacted immediately to evaluate the find. The paleontologist shall have the authority to stop or divert construction, as necessary. Documentation and treatment of the discovery shall occur in accordance with Society of Vertebrate Paleontology standards. The significance of the find shall be evaluated pursuant to the State CEQA Guidelines. If the discovery proves to be significant, before construction activities resume at the location of the find, additional work such as data recovery excavation may be warranted, as deemed necessary by the paleontologist.
- PL16. Prior to approval of grading plans and/or prior to issuance of demolition, grading, and building permits, the following noise reduction techniques shall be included in the construction plans or specifications:
 - Construction contracts specify that all construction equipment, fixed or mobile, shall be equipped with properly operating and maintained mufflers and other state required noise attenuation devices.
 - The Project Applicant shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the City's Building Official that construction noise reduction methods shall be used where feasible, including shutting off idling equipment.
 - During construction, equipment staging areas shall be located such that the greatest distance is between the staging area noise sources and noise-sensitive receptors.
 - Per Gardena Municipal Code Section 8.36.080, construction activities shall not occur during the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. on weekdays; between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. on Saturday; or any time on Sunday or a Federal holiday.
- PL17. Prior to building permit issuance, the Project applicant will be required to demonstrate to the City of Gardena Building Division that the HVAC units proposed to be installed onsite would comply with the City's Noise Ordinance (Gardena Municipal Code Chapter 8.36). Building permit issuance is contingent upon satisfactory demonstration that the HVAC units would comply with the City's noise ordinance.
- PL18. Prior to issuance of any permit other than a demolition permit for the vacant building, applicant shall record an easement from the property owner to the north of buildings 6

through 10 providing for an exclusive 10 foot easement for the use of the project to comply with setback and other requirements. Before recordation, the easement shall be reviewed and approved by the City Attorney.

VESTING TENTATIVE TRACT MAP

- VTTM 1. The final tract map shall be recorded with the Los Angeles County Recorder's office within a period not to exceed twenty-four (24) months from the date of approval, unless an extension is granted in accordance with Gardena Municipal Code section 17.08.070 or by State law. If said map is not recorded within such time, the life of the map shall be deemed expired and said approval shall be considered null and void.
- VTTM 2. The vesting tentative tract map shall conform to the provisions of the State Subdivision Map Act and Title 17 of the Gardena Municipal Code (Subdivisions).
- VTTM 3. In accordance with Section 17.08.170 of the Gardena Municipal Code, the applicant shall dedicate all necessary rights-of-way for public improvements and shall construct such improvements at no cost to the City. Such improvements may include, but not be limited to, site grading and drainage, new sidewalk, curb and gutter, driveways, street trees, roadway paving, street lights, traffic control devices, gas mains, electric power lines, telephone and cable lines, all of which shall be installed in accordance with the specifications of the Public Works Department. All new utilities shall be underground.
- VTTM 4. Pursuant to Government Code § 66495, at least one exterior boundary line of the land being subdivided must be adequately monumented or referenced before the map is recorded.
- VTTM 5. In accordance with Government Code § 66473.1, the design of the subdivision shall provide, to the extent feasible, for future passive/natural heating or cooling opportunities.
- VTTM 6. Private driveways shall be indicated on the final map as "Private Driveway and Fire lane" with the widths clearly depicted and shall be maintained in accordance with the Fire Code. All required fire hydrants shall be installed, tested, and accepted prior to construction.
- VTTM 7. Prior to initial phase associated with building construction, all above ground and underground infrastructure shall be installed.
- VTTM 8. The applicant shall pay in lieu park fees in accordance with Chapter 17.20 of the Gardena Municipal Code and Resolution No. 6433 which requires a payment of \$10,000 per unit. Total in lieu park fees due is \$520,000 and shall be paid in full to the City prior to final map recordation.

VTTM 9. Model homes shall be permitted prior to final map recordation provided that all Fire Department requirements for health and safety are satisfied prior to issuance of a building permit.

BUILDING AND SAFETY

- BS1. The applicant shall comply with all applicable portions of the California Building Standards Code (Title 24, California Code of Regulations) in effect at the time of permit application.
- BS2. The applicant shall obtain separate Building Division permits for Demolition, Grading, Building, Site Development, Electrical, Plumbing, Mechanical, and Fences.
- BS3. The approval of plans and specifications does not permit the violation of any section of the Building Code, Cities Ordinances, and or State Law.
- BS4. The applicant shall comply with the latest adopted Los Angeles County Fire Code and Fire Department requirements, as applicable.
- BS5. The applicant shall provide a storm water management plan study prepared by a qualified engineer acceptable to the Building Official and the Engineering Division. Drainage from parking lots to the public right-of-way shall be filtered through a City approved filter system. The filter shall be located on the development property and maintained by the property owner. Maintenance of the filter by the Homeowner's Association shall be required in the CC&Rs.
- BS6. The applicant shall be responsible for the construction of all on-site drainage facilities. The applicant shall provide a master plan for drainage. This will include Low Impact Development (LID) referring to systems and practices that use or mimic natural processes that result in the infiltration, evapotranspiration or use of stormwater in order to protect water quality and local aquatic habitat.
- BS7. The applicant shall demonstrate that coverages has been obtained under California's General Permit for Stormwater Discharges Associated with Construction Activity by providing a copy of the Notice of Intent (NOI) submitted to the State Water Resources Control Board and a copy of the subsequent notification of the issuance of a Waste Discharge Identification (WDID) Number or other proof of filing shall be provided to the Chief Building Official and the City Engineer. Projects subject to this requirement shall prepare and implement a Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP). A copy of the SWPPP shall be kept at the project site and be available for review on request. Best Management Practices shall be used during construction to prevent construction materials and soil from entering the storm drain.
- BS8. The applicant shall submit for review and approval detailed landscape and irrigation plans prepared by a licensed landscape architect to the Director of Community Development or designee and the Director of Public Works that is consistent with the State's Water Efficient Landscape Guidelines. At a minimum, tree size shall be 24-inch box and shrubs shall be a minimum of one (1) gallon and five (5) gallon size, as approved by the Director of Community Development. Spacing of ground cover plants shall be spaced at 12-18 inches on center and shrubs shall be spaced at 18-24 inches on

- center. Metal cages, painted green, shall be used to protect the back-flow devices. - BS11. The applicant shall submit a site lighting plan, with photometrics, for review and approval by the Building Official and the Director of Community Development or designee prior to the issuance of building permits. The plan shall ensure that all exterior lighting (i.e., parking areas, building areas, and entries) shall employ illumination in a manner that meets the approval of the Building Official and the Director of Community Development or designee before building permits are issued. All light fixtures shall be designed and located in a manner that does not allow spillover onto adjacent properties. Additionally, the exterior lighting fixtures shall be architecturally consistent with the design of the building, as reviewed and approved by the Director of Community.
- BS12. The applicant shall provide parking lot structural sections, which shall be based on recommendations of a soils engineer, to be approved by the City Engineer and Building Official.
- BS13. The applicant shall install new public fire hydrant(s) to the satisfaction of the Los Angeles County Fire Department and City Engineer.
- BS14. The applicant shall prepare construction and demolition waste recycling plans for review and approval by the Building Division. The applicant shall enroll in the city's waste diversion program.
- BS15. Permits are issued to the building address. The applicant shall apply for addresses, in the Community Development Department, prior to obtaining building permits.
- BS16. Security gate locks and devices shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Gardena Police and L.A. County Fire Departments. Knox boxes shall be provided at entry points.
- BS17. The CC&Rs shall provide that the Security Gates shall be maintained, in good condition, by the Homeowners Association.
- BS18. The applicant shall re-slurry and re-stripe the driveway and parking areas every five (5) years at a minimum. - PW7. The applicant shall show all sidewalk structures on plans (i.e. poles, hydrants and traffic signal conduit).
- PW8. The applicant shall provide a street improvement plan showing all requirements. Street plans shall be designed and signed by a registered Civil Engineer.
- PW9. The applicant shall provide traffic control plans per W.A.T.C.H. (Work Area Traffic Control Handbook) or California M.U.T.C.D.
- PW10. Public Works Encroachment/Excavation permit is required for all work in the public right-of-way.
- PW11. Additional requirements may be imposed upon full plan submittal and review.

GS1. The applicant shall contact GSWC for review of the existing water main once LA County Fire Department has issued their fire protection requirements on the

aforementioned project to initiate application for new service installation.

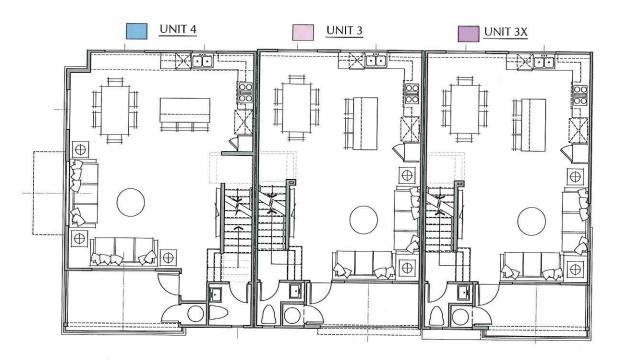


PLAN 5 **REAR ELEVATION BUILDING B3**

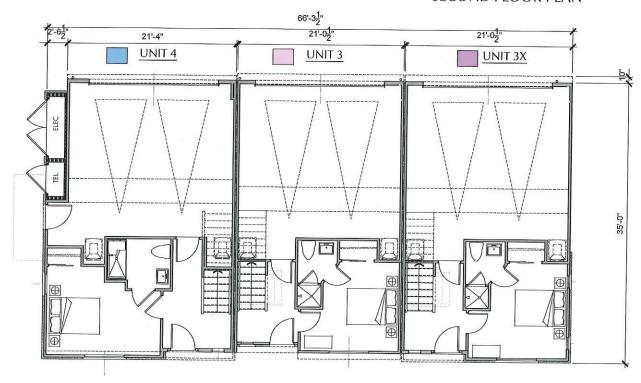

1.0 INTRODUCTION & PURPOSE

The purpose of this memorandum is to describe potential changes, if any, with construction and operations of the Rosecrans Place Phase II Modified Project (Modified Project), as compared to the "Rosecrans Place Phase II" analyzed in the November Categorical Exemption Technical Memorandum. The Modified Project would be within the same footprint as the Original Project but include one less dwelling unit, 170 SF more live-work space, and two fewer parking spaces. Because the Modified Project would include fewer dwelling units it would lessen environmental impacts, as compared to the Original Project. Further, the Modified Project would not result in any new or substantially greater impacts, as compared to those identified in the Categorical Exemption for the Original Project. As such, the Modified Project still qualifies for a Class 32 Categorical Exemption under CEQA.

The City of Gardena has received a request from the "California Cities for Local Control," a coalition of cities in the State that support the concept of local control in municipal governance. Several California cities have adopted resolutions that express opposition at the proliferation of efforts by the California Legislature in Sacramento to pass laws that affect local control as it relates to zoning and land use authority. Those cities have expressed support for the work of the coalition, which seeks to protect local self-determination and limit the ability of the California Legislature to influence local matters through legislation that directly affect municipal land use and housing decisions.

At the December 15, 2020, City Council Meeting, Mayor Cerda and Councilmember Tanaka, requested that this item be brought forward at a future City Council meeting for consideration. The proposed Resolution (attached) expresses support for actions to strengthen local control as related to local zoning and housing issues.

Therefore, it is recommended that the City Council adopt Resolution No. 6492 expressing support for actions to further strengthen local democracy, authority, and control as related to local zoning and housing issues.

Staff respectfully recommends that the City Council adopt Resolution 6492.

WHEREAS, the majority of these bills usurp the authority of local jurisdictions to determine for themselves the land use policies and practices that best suit each city and its residents and instead impose mandates that do not take into account the needs and differences of jurisdictions throughout the State of California; and

WHEREAS, the ability of local jurisdictions to determine for themselves which projects require review beyond a ministerial approval; what parking requirements are appropriate for various neighborhoods within their jurisdiction; what plans and programs are suitable and practical for each community rather than having these decisions imposed upon cities without regard to the circumstances of each individual city; and what zoning should be allowed for residential properties is a matter of great import to the City of Gardena among other items related to local zoning and housing issues; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Gardena feels strongly that our local government is best able to assess the needs of our community and objects to the proliferation of State legislation that deprives us of that ability;

RECOMMENDATION AND STAFF SUMMARY:

The California Cities Gaming Authority, a joint powers authority, was established on November 13, 2019 by the execution of a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement between the City of Gardena and the City of Inglewood. Subsequently, the City of Colma was admitted as a member of the CCGA by the approval of an Amendment by the three cities.

Section 7.1 of the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement provides for the admission of additional governmental entities as Members of the Authority upon such terms and conditions provided by the Board with the consent of a two-thirds vote of the Board and by the execution of a written Amendment to the Agreement by all Members of the Authority including the additional Member.

It is mutually beneficial and desirable to admit the City of San Jose as a member of the CCGA. The Board of Directors of the CCGA voted to admit the City of San Jose as a full voting member on December 16, 2020. On January 5, 2021, the City Council of San Jose elected to become a member of the CCGA by adopting the attached Amendment as required by Agreement.

The attached Addendum will admit the City of San Jose as a full voting member to the CCGA upon approval of the Addendum by the current members of the CCCGA including the City of Gardena.

The provisions of the Amendment are summarized as follows:

- A. The recitals set forth the historical and operative facts pertaining to the formation and existence of the California Cities Gaming Authority and those related to the admission of the City of San Jose.
- B. Paragraph 4 provides for the admission of the City of San Jose as a Member by the current members of the CCGA through the consent of the Cities of Colma, Gardena and Inglewood.
- C. Paragraph 5 commits the City of San Jose to be bound by the terms and conditions of the Amendment and the Agreement including the obligation to pay the annual contribution in the amount of \$30,000 as set forth in Paragraph 4.2 of the Agreement.
- D. Paragraph 5 grants the City of San Jose the right and duty to appoint one of its Council Members to serve on the Board of Directors of the CCGA including the right to participate and vote on all matters before the CCGA Board of Directors and to appoint another one of its Council Members to serve as the alternate to the CCGA Board of Directors.

Therefore, in order for the City of San Jose to become a Member of the California Cities Gaming Authority, the City of Gardena, the City of Inglewood, and the City of Colma must agree to admit the City of San Jose as a Member by way of approving the attached Amendment to the California Cities Gaming Authority Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement.

Staff respectfully recommends that the City Council approve the Amendment and authorize the California Cities Gaming Authority to admit the City of San Jose.

JOINT EXERCISE OF POWERS AGREEMENT

TO ADMIT THE CITY OF SAN JOSE

This Amendment ("Amendment") to the California Cities Gaming Authority Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Gardena, the City of Inglewood, the Town of Colma and the City of San Jose (hereafter "Party" or "Parties").

RECITALS

- A. The California Cities Gaming Authority, a joint powers authority, was established on November 13, 2019 by the execution of a Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement between the City of Gardena and the City of Inglewood and an Amendment to the Agreement with said Cities and the Town of Colma..
- B. Section 7.1 of the Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement provides for the admission of additional governmental entities as Members of the Authority upon such terms and conditions provided by the Board with the consent of a two-thirds vote of the Board and by the execution of a written Amendment to the Agreement by all Members of the Authority including the additional Member.
- C. The Board of Directors of the California Cities Gaming Authority has consented, by a two-thirds vote, to admit the City of San Jose as a Member to the California Cities Gaming Authority subject to the terms and conditions of this Amendment to the Agreement by the City of San Jose and the Members of the Authority.
- D. The City Council of the City of San Jose has voted to become a Member of the California Cities Gaming Authority, a joint powers authority, subject to the terms and conditions of this Amendment and those of the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The recitals herein are true and correct.
- 2. The Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement of the California Cities Gaming Authority is approved and incorporated herein and made a part hereof.
 - 3. Paragraph 3.10 of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:

The Directors shall appoint the following officers from among its Members: Chairperson, Vice Chairperson and Secretary. The Treasurer of the Authority shall be the Treasurer of a Member of the Authority, an offer or employee of a Member or the Authority, or a

certified public accountant, as determined by the Board, for the term and on the conditions provided herein. The Treasurer shall also serve as the Auditor. The Board shall have the power to appoint such additional officers as it deems necessary or desirable. All checks drawn on the Authority's accounts shall be signed by the Chairperson or the Vice Chairperson and by the Treasurer.

- 4. The City of Gardena, the City of Inglewood and the Town of Colma hereby agree to admit the City of San Jose as a Member to the California Cities Gaming Authority and to be bound by the terms and conditions of this Amendment to the Agreement and the Agreement.
- 5. The City of San Jose hereby agrees to be admitted as a Member of the California Cities Gaming Authority and to be bound by the terms and conditions of this Amendment to the Agreement and the terms and conditions of the Agreement as though it had duly executed the Agreement. The City of San Jose further agrees that:
 - (a) It will participate actively in the governance of the Authority and it acknowledges that the Authority shall be governed by a Board of Directors.
 - (b) It will designate one of its council members to serve as a Regular Director of the Board of Directors of the Authority who agrees to attend its meetings.
 - (c) It will designate another of its council members to serve as an Alternate Director of the Board of Directors who agrees to attend its meetings, in the absence of its Regular Member.
 - (d) It will pay its pro-rata share of the annual contribution set forth in Paragraph 4.1 of the Agreement in the amount of \$30,000 to the Authority in the manner set forth in Paragraph 4.2 of the Agreement.
- 6. Each party hereto enters into this Amendment on the date its Presiding Officer signs it; and this Amendment to the Agreement shall be effective on the date that it is signed by the last Presiding Officer of a party to sign it. Each party hereto understands and agrees that this Amendment effectively modifies the Agreement in that the City of San Jose is hereby added as a Member to the Authority with a seat on the Board of Directors of the Authority, Paragraph 3.10 of the Agreement is modified as set forth in Paragraph 3 hereof, and the City of San Jose is deemed to have signed the Agreement.
- 7. Each party may sign this Amendment on a separate page and each such signature page shall constitute the whole hereof.
