Updates

- Over the last 2 weeks, the number of positive COVID-19 cases increased by 6.50% with an average daily increase of 0.49%.
- In comparison, LA County has experienced a 5.54% increase over the last 2 weeks.

Impacts

- Healthcare Facilities:** Local hospitals are experiencing surges and staff shortages. Long-term care facilities remain stable.
- South Bay Infection Rate:** Among all 15 South Bay cities, Inglewood has the highest infection rate at 11.67% per capita, followed by Hawthorne at 11.10%. Lawndale has an infection rate of 9.89%, and 9.72% of Gardena's population has tested positive.

LA County Updates

- The revised LA County Health Officer Order is effective **January 29, 2021**. All businesses permitted to reopen must follow the required protocols set forth by LA County Department of Public Health.

Business Assistance

- Economic Development Manager is currently working on the following projects to assist businesses:

 - A Small Business Resource Guide;
 - A Webinar on How To Do Business With the City;
 - Discover Gardena – A new marketing platform to promote all businesses.

Statewide Updates

- Southern California's current ICU bed availability is 10.6%. The Region is projected to reach 46.3% ICU capacity in four weeks.
- LA County is currently in the **Purple Tier**, indicating the transmission of COVID-19 is widespread.

Statewide Vaccine Updates

- On January 26, 2021, the State introduced the **Statewide Vaccine Delivery Network** to simplify eligibility, standardize information and data, and streamline the vaccination process through a Third-Party Administrator.

LA County Vaccine Updates

- There are 365 sites offering vaccinations this week. LA County Department of Public Health is working on strategies to increase access and organize mobile vaccination teams.

Current Vaccination Status

LA County Department of Public Health is currently vaccinating individuals in Phase 1A and persons 65 years and older. Vaccines are being distributed at established MegaPODs, community clinics, pharmacies, and other healthcare facilities.

- Individuals in Phase 1A and persons 65 years of age and older can make an appointment through the LA County Department of Public Health website. You must bring proper **documentation** verifying your eligibility to your appointment.
- Due to limited supply of the vaccine, MegaPODs, first dose appointments will not be offered from February 9, 2021 to at least February 13, 2021. MegaPODs will only be providing the second dose of the vaccine.

Second Dose Information

- Pfizer-BioNTech doses should be given 21 days apart, and Moderna doses should be given 28 days apart. The same type of vaccine should be used for both doses.
- Many individuals will receive their second dose at the same site they received their first dose. If you received your first dose at a City or County POD, you will receive an email confirmation to book your appointment time.
- You must bring your white vaccine record card or electronic vaccine record AND a photo ID to your appointment

Vaccine Prioritization and Allocation Update

- After completion of Phase 1B, Tier 1—Education and Childcare, Emergency Services, and Food and Agriculture—the State plans to transition to age-based eligibility to expand access to vaccinations.
