Updates

- Over the last 2 weeks, the number of positive COVID-19 cases increased by 0.71% with an average daily increase of 0.05%.
- In comparison, LA County has experienced a 0.70% increase over the last 2 weeks.

Impacts

- Healthcare Facilities: Local hospitals are no longer experiencing surges. Long-term care facilities remain stable.
- South Bay Infection Rate: Among all 15 South Bay cities, Inglewood has the highest infection rate at 12.28% per capita, followed by Hawthorne at 11.88%. Lawndale has an infection rate of 10.80%, and 10.35% of Gardena's population has tested positive.

 Baseball and softball fields at Rowley Park and Mas Fukai Park as well as soccer and football fields at Johnson Park are now open for youth and adult sports upon <u>reservation</u> with required protocols in place.

Business Assistance

- The Economic Development Department is visiting businesses to determine if they need access to PPE to assist with reopening efforts. To date, our team has stopped by eight businesses.
- The Economic Development Manager is in the process of adding businesses to the Business Directory, which is hosted on Gardena Awaits.

Statewide Updates

On March 5, 2021, the State added a vaccine equity metric to the <u>Blueprint for a Safer Economy</u> and announced a plan to permit outdoor sporting events, live outdoor concerts, and theme parks for all Tiers beginning April 1, 2021.

LA County Reopening Updates

 On March 13, 2021, LA County entered the Red Tier, allowing additional business sectors to reopen or increase operational capacity. The revised LA County Health Officer Order is effective March 20, 2021.

LA County Vaccine Updates

- Due to the limited supply of vaccines, appointment availability is low. Visit <u>VaccinateLACounty.com</u> for details or to schedule an appointment. If you do not have internet access, please call (833) 540-0473.
- LA County is receiving allocations made by Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson. All three vaccines have been shown to be <u>safe</u> and effective at preventing COVID-19.

Current Vaccination Status

LA County Department of Public Health is currently vaccinating individuals in Phase 1A and Phase 1B, Tier 1. Eligible groups include:

- Healthcare workers
- Residents of long-term care facilities
- Residents 65 years of age or older
- Education and Childcare
- Emergency Services

- Food and Agriculture
- People with serious health conditions/disabilities
- People who live or work in congregate living spaces
- Janitorial, Custodial, and Maintenance Services
- <u>Transportation and Logistics</u>
- To be vaccinated, you will need to demonstrate proof of identity, proof that you live or work in LA County, <u>AND</u> proof that you are in an eligible group. For more information related to eligibility, visit LA County Department of Public Health's <u>website</u>.
- Individuals receiving their second dose must bring their white vaccine record card or electronic vaccine record AND a photo ID to their appointment.
- Over 3.2 million doses of the vaccine have been administered across LA County, and over one million people received their second dose or the single dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine.
- Although the majority of LA County residents have not been vaccinated yet, the increasing rate of vaccination is anticipated to begin reducing transmission of COVID-19.
- Fully vaccinated people should continue to wear a mask and physical distance in public.
