Residential Smoke and Carbon Monoxide Alarm Requirements

All new residential permits will require smoke & carbon monoxide detectors throughout the residence. Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Detectors must be installed in accordance with the 2019 California Residential Code (CRC), NFPA 72 Stds. and the Manufactures Instructions and will be verified at the permit final. Alarms and detectors shall not be placed within three feet of a bathroom door, three feet of heating and cooling registers/vents. In addition, shall not be placed within six feet of kitchen cooking appliances.

Smoke Alarms shall be installed in the following locations:


- One in each sleeping room.
 One Outside each sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms. Within 10 feet of bedroom doors.
- A minimum of <u>One</u> on each additional level of the dwelling, not including crawl spaces and unoccupied attics.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms shall be installed in the following locations:

- Outside of each sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedroom(s).
 Within 10 feet of bedroom doors.
- A minimum of <u>One</u> on every level of a dwelling unit.

Power and Interconnection

- Power Shall be supplied by the buildings primary power source for both smoke and carbon monoxide detectors and must have a battery back up. For existing buildings where attic access is not available, a battery device may be used.
- Where more than one smoke detectors is installed they must be interconnected
- Where more than one Carbon monoxide alarm is installed they must be interconnected
- Interconnection is not required in existing dwelling units where there is no access by means of attic, basement or crawl space, and no previous method for interconnection existed.



Smoke Alarms (CRC Section R314) When alterations, repairs or additions requiring a permit occur, or when one or more sleeping rooms are added or created in existing dwellings, the individual dwelling unit shall be equipped with smoke alarms located as indicated.

Carbon Monoxide Alarms (CRC Section R315)

Where a permit is required for alterations, repairs or additions, existing dwelling units that have attached garages or fuel burning appliances shall be provided with carbon monoxide detectors.
