Air Quality Index

Our local AQI (Air Quality Index) is calculated based on common air pollutants including particulate matter (PM2.5 & PM10), ozone (smog), carbon monoxide, and nitrogen dioxide. You can always check your real-time air quality on our website at www.aqmd.gov, at the bottom of the home page. See your real-time air quality, check out today's forecast, or tomorrow's, too. You can also sign up for alerts to receive notifications when air quality in your area changes.

Wildfire Season is Here!

Wildfires can often cause very high air pollution levels that are harmful to your health, even in areas many miles away from the fire. Older adults, young children, pregnant women, and people with heart diseases or lung diseases (such as asthma) may be especially sensitive to health risks from wildfire smoke.

Protect your health by taking steps before, during, and after a wildfire to reduce how much pollution you are breathing. You can get air quality information and forecasts by downloading the South Coast AQMD mobile app and signing up for advisories at AirAlerts.org.
