I am writing in regards to <u>CUP #1-24 (Modification CUP #219-98)</u>, <u>SPR #1-24</u>, <u>and AA #1-24 (Environmental Charter School)</u>

I live on Manhattan Beach Blvd, a few doors down from this charter school. I'm concerned about the plan to modify and reduce the number of off-street parking spaces. I assume most of this is for staff parking but I wish they would allow more space for parents dropping off or picking up their kids.

The street parking in front of my house becomes untenable during the school year especially when school lets out around 3:00 pm. Cars idle in front of the house, blocking my driveway.
