As you can see from the pictures it was amazing and, in the past, she has shown videos from last year's National Night Out not only to other Cities but she has a friend of hers who's a king in another country and they actually said they would like to come out to Gardena and see what its all about because of the videos it looks amazing. She also attended Earthquake Heroes and saw the part of the heroes' film and the Earthquake Expo. She echoed Mayor Cerda's comments about it how ironic it was that a few days later we had our own earthquake. She wants to encourage you if you haven't done it already you know prepare for the earthquake because it's not a matter if it's coming it's just a matter of when it's coming so prepare you know make sure you have water on hand and food, and you know the resources are available because it has been said should the big one hit we are going to be on our own for at least 3 days, so you should be able to take care of yourself for at least 3 days, but now here in Gardena we are going to be just fine. She attended our Hats and Pearl Fundraiser for the Martin Luther King Jr. Culture Committee. and they presented three Arthur Johnson Scholarships, named after the founder of our committee, to three High School students. She'd like to thank Council Member Love and Mayor Cerda for attending and supporting us. She also attended A.C. Green Leadership Academy Awards Program and she's sure she's leaving something out, but she was there. She can't attend a lot of the events during the school year because she teaches. She can't supersede one for the other but know she's there in spirit and supporting you all the way and as always stay faithful and just know better days are coming.
